the issue will be made on last year's valuations and the tax rate will not be raised one cent, and while there are some who contend that the city board of equalization raised property values higher than the same property was assessed by the county for taxation, the fact remains that there is not a foot of property in the city that could be purchased from the owner at the price it was assessed for taxes by the city board of equalization last year—not even if the prospective purchaser should offer to pay 35 per cent more for the property than the figure at which it was assessed for taxation.

The Times has no interest in the matter other than to do what it can in its way to make of Wichita Falls within the next two or three years a city of at least 15,000 population, and if our citizens work in harmony and pull together in the future as they have in the past, this is not too much to expect. That being true, it necessarily follows that the increase in the value of business property located on the streets which it is proposed to pave will be worth double its present value. Those owning this valuable property are the ones who are to be benefited mostly, and every one of them should be lined up in favor of the street paving proposition instead of encouraging the movement to vote it down.
