





For instance, the last war would not have occured if there had been found a sufficient group able to think for themselves. And it is a curious phenomenon of our modern civilization that it is governed by those who appeal to party spirit or to passions rather than to intelligence

and independence. The very fibers of our body are the roots of habit, the fibers which are the structure of the group. We find it in wresting ourselves free when we are in danger of extinction. All the forces around us are ar-

ranged for the conservation of reaction. Society itself is a network of social relationships and antagonisms. These may be of old customs and attitudes of mind inherited from




