

> weevil, which has ruined so many crops in South and Central Texas, has made its appearance in the locality in question. It will therefore behoove the cotton growers of Nacogdoches county to make a careful study of the insect ravages on their cotton. Especially should they be alarmed if they find any small white grub like worms in the tallen squares. This can easily "be determined by gathering up several hundred squares at random over the field and then cutting them open to ascertain what may be found on the inside. Shall be glad to hear from the planters of this county and send them my official reports upon ways and means of fighting and overcoming the boll weevil of cotton. The people should be forewarned and educated beforehand how to make a successful fight and when to make it. Ways and Means are now well known and have demonstrated their efficiency in hundreds of cases this year. Hence the cotton planters of Nacogdoches county should get these reports and study the pests in advance of its coming. Shall be pleased to
