She was killed and her daughter, Miss Mary Miller, was so badly hurt that one foot, the toes of the other and her left hand had to be amputated. Another daughter was slightly wounded.

They were crossing several railway tracks when struck by a freight car. Mrs. Miller's head was cut off. Miss Mary was taken to the Houston Infirmary. The ladies were crossing the track at the time and it is not known exactly how it happened.






