### TOBACCO GROWERS IN SESSION


The Texas Tobacco Growers Elect Officers for the Year.

## THINGS TO BE SEEN IN BOSTON

BOSTON, the beautiful Puritan city, has many gateways through which the pilgrims upon whatever errand bent, may enter her goodly precincts. And she has much to offer, to all who may come to her, in the way of historic relics, treasures of literature and art, and facilities for study or business. Her older streets may be winding and narrow, but they are picturesque and full of suggestions of that past in which all Americans have an interest, and of which they have a right to be proud. Many of the quaint old thoroughfares lead to shrines which, as long as they exist, will attract tourists and will help to keep alive feelings of patriotism and loyalty.

Among some of the places of interest I have visited are: Bunker Hill Monument on Breed's Hill, is where the battle celebrated in song and story so much was fought. The monument is built of coarse granite, thirty feet square at the base, rising 220 feet. From the observatory at the top a wide view of the surrounding country may be obtained. This is reached by a spiral flight of stone steps inside the shaft. There are 295 of these steps and the visitor feels very much like rest when the last is reached. The corner stone was laid by Lafayette and an oration was delivered at the same time by Daniel Webster. It was begun in 1825 and finished June 17, 1843.

The Navy Yard at Moulton's Point is where the British troops landed for the fight at Bunker Hill. Its present area is about eighty seven acres, and within the enclosure are large and costly buildings. There are parks for cannon and shot, a parade ground, marine barracks, store and ship houses, arsenal and magazine, dry-docks, a rope walk, a museum, etc. The old "Constitution" is moored at one of the docks and attracts much of the attention of the thousands of visitors. S. F. B. Morse, the inventor of the telegraph, was born in Charleston which is near by.

Old Granary Burying Ground is the most interesting of the old burying grounds of Boston. The list of the distinguished dead who rest here nine Governors of the Colony and States; three of the signers of the Declaration of Independence; Paul Revere; the first mayor of Boston and many others. Hancock, the first signer of the Declaration of Independence, is one of the number but there is no headstone to mark his grave. The victims of the "Boston Massacre" are also buried here. The most conspicuous monument is one which was erected in 1827 over the

graves of the parents of Benjamin Franklin. It contains the following epitaph as composed by their illustrious son Benjamin:

They lived lovingly together in wedlock fifty five years, and without an estate, or any gainful employment, by constant labor and honest industry maintained a large family comfortably, and brought up thirteen children and seven grand children respectably. From this instance, reader, be encouraged to diligence in thy calling, and distrust not Providence. He was a pious and prudent man; She a discreet and virtuous woman.

Cambridge: We will leave Boston and go out to Cambridge; which is so close by electric cars that you forget you are out of Boston. The population of this city is over 80,000. Famous, in the first place, as the seat of the great Harvard University, it has many associations and points of interest, which attract all who are so fortunate as to visit Boston. The old Elm, under which Washington stood when he took command of the Continental Army on July 3, 1775, is still standing at the junction of Mason and Garden streets. Not far from here stands the old homestead of Longfellow; his daughter, "Sweet Alice" still occupies it. Not far from here, too, is the birth place James of Russel Lowell.

Harvard college is not only the oldest, but one of the richest, of American colleges. She possesses property worth \$12,000,000; her roll of graduates living and dead, contains nearly 20,000 names and she now has about 3,000 students and 300 instructors. Her list of graduates comprise the names of hundreds of prominent men of the past and present. Our president is one of the number.

The different departments of this college are too numerous to mention.

The College Yard contains the following buildings, viz: Massachusetts Hall, Harvard Hall, University Hall, Gore Hall, Boylston Chemical Laboratory, Sever Hall, Holden Chapel, Appelton Chapel, Mathews Hall, Grays Hall and Weld Hall. Besides these are the buildings of Ratcliff, the college from which the wonderful blind Hellen Keller graduated. Ratcliff is the same as Harvard as to its educational standard. It is for females only.

There are many, many, other places and things of interest in and around Boston but those I have mentioned were of the most interest to me. History becomes much more enjoyable when one can visit the scenes of action.

Mr. J. T. Booth, the truck farmer, presented The Sentinel yesterday with a bunch of fine turnips, for which thanks are returned. Mr. Booth is a successful diversifier and has something to market from his farm every month the year round.

Williams was made to mount a box at the door of the jail and there to tell the story of the mob as he had told it to the authorities.

The three negroes who were hung were: John Reese, Robert Askew, Henry Schorrow. The men were hanged to a Sycamore tree in the Court House yard.


