Austin, Texas, April 7 .-The State University is in a bad way financially, and all the time more students are applying for admission.

The attendance this year is about 300 in excess of what it last. The indications point to an increased attendance of 400 for next year, making an increase of 700 students between legislative sessions. On top of the big Increase which is bound to come the legislative appropriation for next year is \$20,000 less than what it is for this year, and this of course will put this great state institution in a bad way. The only recourse left for the faculty will be to turn students away."

This is the only state university in the Southwest, and it covers a vast section of the country. California on the west Missouri on the north. Tulane on the east and the City of Mexico on the south are the only universities anywhere near Texas, and that explains why the attendance is increasing so rapidly.


