# OLD CLAIT SETLLED 

Expense of Removal of Cherokeci to West Fifty Years A8o.

Washington, May 2.-The responsibility for the payment of the removal of the Cherokee Indians from the Eastern States to Indian Territory more than half a century ago was decided by the surpreme court of the United States to rest with the government volving the same question. The opinion wa handed down by Chief Justice Fulle and affirmed a tormer decision of the court of claums with slight modifications. The ex penses were charged to the
Cherokee treaty fund and the Indians claimed this was improperly done. The qustion of interest payments also rais-
ed. The judgment. of the court ot clams was in tavor of the Cherokees and against the United Stat s, and called for the payment of about $\$ 4$,-
ooo,ooo. The decision proooo,000. The decision pro-
vides for a per capita payment to the Cherokees who remain in North Carolina, Tennessee and other Southe rn States, They asked for about one fourth of the entire award. cision of the court of claims by the supreme court consisted in cutting out the old se'tlers, or Western Cherokees. thus re moving the entire sum award ed to Eastern Cherokees who did not remove from their Georgia and Tennessee until 1838 .

Attorney Robert Lowen who is himself an Indian and representing the Eastern Cherokees, says originally there were about 16,000 o those Indians, but that their ooo.
