The fucure of the tobacco ndustry in this county is now assured. Yesterday afternoon meeting of the business men of Nacogdoches was held in the Business League Parlors and the Nacogdoches Tobacco Growing Company was organized, and will be chartered under the laws of the State o Texas, with a capital stock
6500 fully paid up.
Fifteen acres of land on the Red Field farm will be plant ed underà shade, and wrapper obacco will be grown under the supervision of the govern ment experts. The tact has been demonstrated that a cigar filler tobacco of a very uperior quality can be grown ere, and at a very good pro it to the farmers. This tobac has been grown here to the past three years, and a
15 cents per pound has proven o be a very valuable mone The growing of wrapper tobacco has been experi mented with on a small scale and has proven very success 11. There is now a marke tobacco at 40 cents per pound, and as the wrapper tobacco yelds from 1000 to 140 pounds to the acre it can be
