heed. He says they took the ocal papers and directed thei special effort to communitie where the merchants are not $p$-to-date advertisers. If $h$ lound that any line of busi ness in town or city was no well advertised, as for instance looded that territory with litrature and always with sutis actory results. He said he believed home merchant
could greatly cripple the mail order houses if they would ad vertise freely and in the righ ancr
There is no doubt but tha oo many of our local mer chants are inclined to look up uxury paper advertising as ying the fact that there is much truth is the statemen quoted above. Intelligent ad vertising pays any busines that depends on the public for support. It is a necesity, as has been demonstrated by or producer, and even the mail order houses themselves.

EARLY EAST TEXAS SAW MILLS outhern IndustrialgLumber Review.
"The first saw mill built in Nacogdoches county, so tar as know;" said a reminiscen ative of East Texas, "was built by Major Black Hardeman, a few miles south of the ittle village of Melrose, in he neighborhood of Rocky Branch, a deep but narrow stream thit flows through that historic reigion. The engine and boiler were of the oldashioned kind and were haulfrom Natchitoches, La., on wagon, drawn by four yoke oxen, owned and driven by B. M. Hall, a sturdy wagon $r$ and larmer who lived near Melrose. For hauling this machinery Mr. Hall was pald 100. The trip required several days.
"When the miil was placed operation it was the wonor of all the surrounding country, and the people came
from miles around to see it, trom miles around to see it,
some spending an entire day at the saw mill, watching it saw logs. Every part of the machinery was of the most primitive character. One man nly was required to run the pins known as "dogs" were used in holding the logs in place and keeping them from lipping. The sawyer, started he engine by pulling a long ever which connected with the throttle. It the log to be sawed was verv large sev-
eral running starts had to b taken in order to get the saw through the log. There were no such thing as an endless chain for conveying the slabs away, nor was there anything o take the sawdust out of the way. The slabs were plcked p by a mill helper and "tot d" away, and the sawdus was shoveled into carts and
hauled to a dumping place. The sap lumber, with a par of the bark on it, was called weather-boarding,' and genrally soid at 35 cents a hun red feet. The best class of oxing was considered hig "Major Harder, Major Hardeman's mil was operated tor several years in the development of its lo ality. For miles and miles armers came with old-time $x$ wagons and hauled home the lumber they needed ome lived such a distance hat they would camp at the uill over night, after loading heir wagons, and take an early homeward start nex morning
In those days there were o dry kilns or planers, and hen a cristomer bought his dried it carried it home and material against a rude scat fold and building a fire on the round beneath it. These old-time kilns. required constant watching lest they caugh ire and burned the lumber. If the purchaser desired dressed lumber for his purpose, atter it had been dried in the manner described he smoothed it to his satisfaction with hand plane. When a man had shoved one of these oldtime planes all day he could rest assured that he
was entitled to say with truth that he had done a full day's an has embarked in "The site of this old tme hardest things in the world for ory of the people who lived in that neighborhood, but ther are still some living who re cumbersome methods.
"In the same neighborhoo William Alders was anothe pinneer in the lumber industry, and during the twenty years or more that he lumbered he suilt several saw mills there and there-about. Mr. Alders is still living. He retired rom the saw mill business several years ago. He was neighborhood to build a cot ton gin, and this he ran in county
connection with his saw mill.
Another pioneer saw mill man of that region was Dr. J. D. Martin, of Martınsville, dead these tive years. He as Martinsville, 'way back the early fifties, and besides being a good physician he was man. In addition to buildin a large water mill he built steam mill at Martinsville, and ror a number of years did a good business. The timber which was used in making lumber was brought several
miles by ox teams on wheel conveyance called a carry-all. Only one log at a ime was hauled, and this was suspended at one end by iron
hooks from the carry-all while the other end was allowed to drag bn the ground. It was mighty slow business logging $a$ mill in these days. before tram roads and locomotives and steam loa
