Austin, Texas, Sept. 10.-Commissioner of Agriculture Milner today announced that the total number of bales of cotton ginned by Texas ginners to September 1 to be 107,009. This is in accordance with the new ginners' law, which requires them to make monthly reports to the agricultural department. The above figures repesent all cotton which has been ginned this season to September 1. The above number of bales is 38,000 behind the government reports for Texas, which has just been made public. 
