Nacogdoches, Tex., Jan 14. -I have heen handed a copy of the Shreveport Times of January 8, in which my name has been used without my knowledge or consent, in what might be termed a prohibition, or rather an anti-prohibition document, over the signature of A. J. Spradley; and while Mr. Spradley handled my name very courteously, I deny his right to have used it at all without my consent; especially out of this state, where I feel but little interest in the administration of their affairs. 


