#### The Split Log Road drag.

A farmers' bulletin has just been issued by the Department of Agriculture which; should be read and studied by Did you ever laugh "till the every man in the country, whether he has a five-acre or a thousand-acre farm. It is a description of the split log drag for use on earth roads. The split log drag is by no means a new institution but this 15-page pamphlet tells why it is sometimes a failure. For one thing, it is often made too heavy. It should be light enough for a man to lift easily. A dry čedar, elm or walnut log is the best material for a dragfar better than oak or hickory. Another mistake is in the use of squared timbers instead of those with sharp edges, whereby the cutting effect of sharp edges is lost, and the drag glides over instead of equalizing the irregularities in the surface of the


