Spradley was sounded, stating that a negro man had gone wild, beat up several parties and had almost killed a negro woman in the "quarters" in the eastern part of the city. The officer soon had his blood hounds and accompanied by several other gentlemen, went to the scene of the disturbance. As they neared the place the negro man was seen going over the hill from there, evidently making his way to the woods. 
