### LOSS PLACED AT \$100,000

Hayward Mill Fire Lays Waste to Big Property—Partially Covered By Insurance—Impression That Plant Will be Rebuilt

The big Hayward Mill lumber plant presents a scene of waste today fraught by the destructive fire of yesterday afternoon. The plant proper is a total loss, with the exception of the immense boilers and engines; which are thought to be only slightly damaged. The origin of the fire is supposed to have been in the fuel house, though some are of the opinion that it began underneath the mill. On account of the high wind it is possible too that two separate brands were blown, igniting the fuel house and mill about the same time, as the former fire was quenched in a very few minutes, when suddenly the lumber plant was a solid mass of flames. The heroic work of the people is subject for comment today,

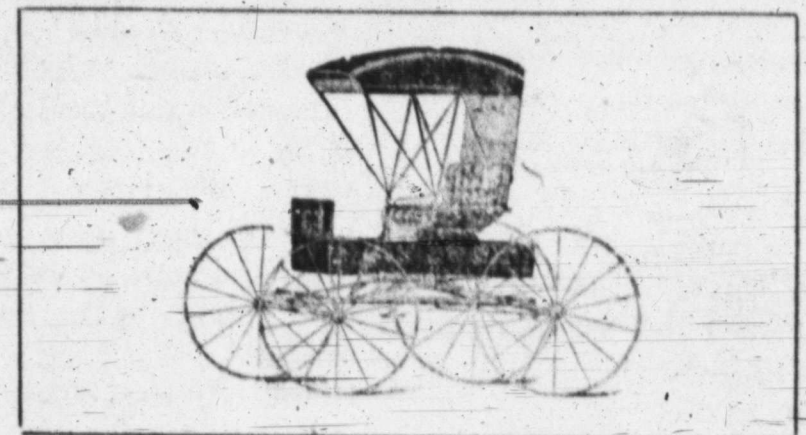

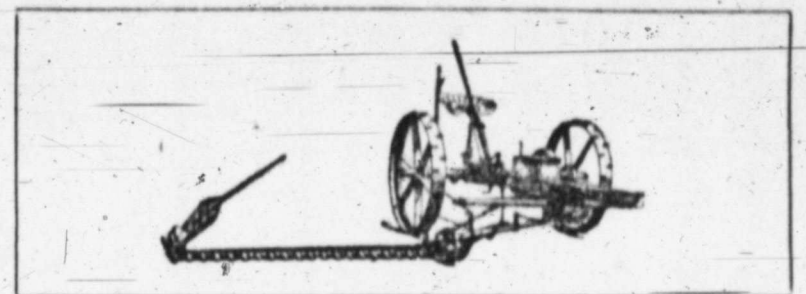

"PITTSBURG graft to be probed" seems to be the popular headline from the way papers are making use of it. The probing process is supposed to have been going on for these many years; but the \$9,000,000 paid for capitol furnishings is yet an unsolved mystery to Pennsylvanians.

THE cry for good roads is becoming louder and in many sections already plans for improvements of the highways are being formulated. Nothing that will add to the comforts of a people is expensive,—though costly in dollars and cents. Better roads for Texas!

H. BASCOM THOMAS says he is running again and is going to let them know he is in the race by the time election day rolls 'round. H. ### THE FIRST DAY'S SESSION.

The first measure introduced in the Senate after assembling for the special session was a concurrent resolution providing for sine die adjournment.

This was followed by a flood of bills sufficient to keep the Senate in session for at least a month beyond the date set for final adjournment if each of them is to be debated at length.

They are mostly platform demands—so called—of course nearly all of which were considered and practically rejected at the regular session. What disposition will be made of them now will depend in a large measure upon the weight of the big stick wielded at the State House. In the House numerous bills have been filed and enough business will be introduced to keep things moving for several weeks at least.

Meanwhile there is general sentiment throughout the State that there are already enough laws on the statute books and that it would be better for the interests of the State to do without some of the good laws proposed than to be burdened with some of the bad ones which would more than counterbalance the good.

But, perhaps, there is no danger to be apprehended and no cause for solicitude as to what the Legislature will do at the special session.—San Antonio Express.

THE branch school of the A. and M. college, if the legislature passes the bill, must be brought to Nacogdoches. There are no ifs or ands about that; there are no whys or wherefores to be considered. The institution is not coming here of its own free will and accord, nor is it going to spend any time hunting a location. Nacogdoches must seek it, and ought to be in line early.

THE committee recently appointed to look after the matter of locating one of the branch A. and M. stations here may have occasion to get busy soon. The proposition in the Legislature has simmered down to "four in the state" however and of course West Texas wants them all. The thing that West Texas doesn't want has long been forgot though, and to keep pace with the wirey, windy, western folks, merely off with coats and work like it had to be done.

THE Mt. Enterprise Herald is agitating to making of a new county, from Nacogdoches and Rusk counties. Of course Mt. Enterprise wants to be the county site. The argument is advanced that some of the people in that section are far away from the courts; in solution of which we suggest that those people move to Nacogdoches. A powerful good place to come.

COL. J. H. Lowery's Butter-milk Philosophy stories now running in the Sunday Fort Worth Record, form a feature rare and indeed interesting. The Colonel is truly a philosopher,—as well as an East Texas humorist.

## ARRANGEMENTS ARE COMPLETE

Shirt Factory Proposition Settled and Machinery Has Been Ordered—Will Occupy Hazel Building

The shirt factory for Nacogdoches is no longer in the incubator, the proposition having been thoroughly hatched, — the machinery ordered—and the location decided upon. A hurry-up order was placed a few days ago, and according to advice from the factory, it will be in sometime after April 15 and before May 1. In a few days after its arrival the enterprise can be turning out "shirts for everybody." Judge V. E. Middlebrook, promoter and proprietor, stated today that he has leased the second floor of the Hazel building at the corner of Main and Church streets, over the Miller grocery store. The factory will mean an investment of several thousand dollars to begin with and from the outset will employ between 12 and 15 people, with possibly an increase later. Already a number of orders have been filed and it is expected that when the plant is installed and ready for operation, enough orders will be on hand to run full time from the start. Not only will the concern cater to Nacogdoches trade but will solicit business all over this section of Texas. Several representatives will probably travel for the factory, after the local trade has been taken care of. The establishment of the factory but means another important industry for our city and should receive the hearty support of the people.



THE TOBACCO INDUSTRY.  
 Representative Dotson Asks Legislature For Appropriation Covering a Period of Three Years.

George T. M. McNess, proprietor of the Tobacco packing plant and secretary of the Tobacco Association in this county, yesterday received a telegram from Representative Homer A. Dotson now at Austin, asking if \$1000 would be sufficient to carry on the proposed experiment work in this county, and if not, how much would be required. Mr. McNess immediately replied, stating that \$2000 would be required for the three years work,—that amount only allowing a man \$666 per year for his labor. It is thought though with even that small appropriation considerable benefit to the tobacco growers and the industry in general will result. The inference is drawn from the wire received here, that Mr. Dotson will at once introduce a bill in the legislature asking for that amount.
