Through the efforts of the
Thugustine Tribune. Nacogdoches County Tobaceo was recently passed by the Texas legislature appropriating $\$ 1000$ a year for two years to assist the national government in caraying on the tobacco experiments in that county.
I exas has done no more than it should in this matter, as the placing ot East Texas tobacco on the world's mar kets will bring fame to the State and money to an eve increasing body ot citizens. Nacogdoches county this season will plant about 250
acres in cigar tobacco, San Augustine 100 acies, and the other - eounties to the west of these will probably bring up the amount to 500 acres or more. Nacogdoches is so
situated that its neighboring counties can receive the benefits of its progress in this line and San Augustine county is pleased that the efforts of the ssoclation were successful. We beg to offer the-sug gestion, however, that the industry it all persons in the tobacco belt would drop the term "experiment," tor in view of the progress made in tobacco growing the term misleading, and possibly det rimental to development.
To our certain knowled these experiments commenced about six years ago and have been continued each year since inj one section or anoth er, always with the same
general result of proving that a high grade tobacco could b grown. And as it is being grown successtully by scores of people, who when once started; unitormly continue its culture. What is there lett to determine by further "experiment" more than in other crops?
The idea probably is to find out certain details of the business that will bear furthe investigation, ascertain best methods of handling, the most successful varieties, etc. but this class of work ought not to be called experiment ing in the sense that the term has formerly been used with reference to this particular industry. Rather should it be like what is going on with and other things that every one knows will grow, al though each farmer should investigate, demonstrate or if you please, experiment to learn how to obtain the
returns from his labor.
Consider the suggestion neighbors, and let us all drop this misleading term, and bend our energies towards showing prospective settler and others that tobacco is standard crop of East Texasand no longer an experiment. The talk about another extra-session of the Texas Legislature is getting too intense to be comtortable. Texas has had her share of calamities this year, without a repetition of the "blust
bunch" down Austinway.

## Belief Today That George Blake

 Burned to Death and That Odie Hillen Was Killed by Train-Officers Visit Scene.-The theory held tor several days that George Blakey and Odie Hillen were the victims of toul play, is exploded, ac cording to the reports officers. Neither of the par ties were murdered, and neither circumstance had any Blakey with the other having been robbed, and Hil en died as the result tatal injuries received by a passenger train, early Satur day morning, atter having been with Blakev, and possi bly knowing something of th cremated man being "rolled" or his purse. These-are eon cisely the conclusions reached by officers, atter having gone to the scenes of the two aeel dents. A thorough investi gation was made yesterday by to the grounds, and a number of totks in the section o Angilina were questioned. There was no pool ot bloo at or near where Blakey was found, nor was the
skull crushed. The face was bruised slightly. but no to the extent calculated to bushes, etc. indicate that Blakey built a fire and lay down ${ }^{*}$ by it. Being in drunken stupor he rushed in to a clump of bushes when the blaze, his oily clothe catching and enveloping hin in flames. The ground show that he made a terrible strug gle to get out of the fire, a also do the grasses and leave around the place indicate tha effort to extinguish it This fort to extinguish it. This The man's watch was - foun near the scene, and had stop ped at twenty minutes pas twelve. The time piece how ever, is known to have been one hour and twenty min utes tast. Investigation show that Hillen was with him few minutes before he wa burned to death. Hillen went from that place to the saloon. got several drinks, and then went by the side of fire. He fell into a stupor and sat down on the end of a railroad tie to wait for the train, believing it was almost time tor it. Indicating to watch not long since, and being more than an hour fast, leading Hillen to think the leading Hillen to think the passenger was soon due. A
number of times the fire at the railroad was replenished there and heard Hillen hunt ing wood boxes, etc He wis ing wood, boxes, etc. He wa sitting on the tie when the train struck him, and tor that reason, and other things con nected, his death is credited as the result of injuries received there and then.
