

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

No. 6. House Joint Resolution to amend Section 3 of Article 7 of the Constitution of the State of Texas, in regard to the forma tion and taxing power school districts.



MURDER THEORY EXPLODED.

Belief Today That George Blakey Burned to Death and That Odie Hillen Was Killed by Train-Officers Visit Scene.

The theory held for several days that George Blakey and Odie Hillen were the victims of foul play, is exploded, according to the reports of officers. Neither of the paries were murdered, and neither circumstance had any connection with the other. Blakey burned to death, after having been robbed, and Hillen died as the result of tatal injuries received by a passenger train, early Saturday morning, after having been with Blakey, and possibly knowing something of the cremated man being "rolled" for his purse. These are concisely the conclusions reached by officers, after having gone to the scenes of the two accidents. A thorough investigation was made yesterday by Sheriff Spradley, in reference to the grounds, and a number of folks in the section of Angilina were questioned.

There was no pool of blood

at or near where Blakey found, nor was the skull crushed. The face was bruised slightly, but not to the extent calculated to injure. The ground, trees, bushes, etc. indicate that Blakey built a fire and lay down by it. Being in a drunken stupor he rushed in to a clump of bushes when he awoke, into the midst of the blaze, his oily clothes doesn't contain catching and enveloping him in flames. The ground shows that he made a terrible struggle to get out of the fire, as also do the grasses and leaves around the place indicate that he rolled and wallowed in his effort to extinguish it. This happened about eleven o'clock. The man's watch was found near the scene, and had stopped at twenty minutes past calcium, 6 ounces of phosphate twelve. 

Tobacco Acreage Decreased.

Palestine, Tex., Apr. 29.-Mr. Otto Olsen, United States government tobacco expert, who has been superintending the packig of the tobacco crop here, left Wednesday for Nacogdoches to inspect the crop there. The acreage in tobacco in Anderson county this year will be slightly decreased, but according to Mr. Olsen there will be in the neighborhood of 150 acres planted to tobacco here this year. He divides the acreage as tollows: Mr. John R. Hearne, 18 acres shade or wrapper tobacco, 50 acres filler; Dr. T. W. Smith, 15 acres shade, 1 acre filler; Mr. G. H. Turner, 10 acres filler; Mr. Cunningham, 2 acres shade, 5 acres filler. Other small planters will put in about 50 acres.
