In the first place the tolks who live in this county but who carried cotton to other points, with the belief that they would get better prices, nearly always got tooled. That has been proven on paper, in black and white, and beyond all reasonable doubt. Nac ogdoches paid as high a price for cotton last year as any city in East Texas, and in lots of cases paid more than other towns for a radii of fifty miles. The people who went to other points learned this (some ofthem) after it was too late. But this year things have changed and buyers are here to the heart's content of the tolks who yearn tor more "in the market." Nacogdoches will be the leader this year as last, and the farmers who fail to come here with their fleecy staple will be losers. 

Every teacher who is teaching or expects to teach in this county during the scholastic years of 1909-1910, must attend as bona-fide participants and not simply because the law compels them to do so. Teachers are urged to study section 37-92 and 93 of the school laws of Texas. Teachers of independent districts are not exempt from the above sections of the school


