



Some "Extra" Big Turnips.

W. H. Petty, who lives five miles west from Nacogdoches, presented the Sentinel office with two very fine specimens of his turnip crop this morning, and so unusual in size are they, that considerable attraction has been caused. One of them is of the White Globe variety, measured circumference, three feet tall, from root to tip of greens, and weighs seven pounds. The in circumference, but is not quite as heavy as the other. The turnips are extra fine, large and solid. They were planted September 20, and therefore they have been but two months in maturing. 
