REPORTS from over the country indicate that we are having just a little too much rain in sections, though not nearly so much as along the Mississippi. In South East Texas railroad transportation has been quite badly handicapped the past few weeks.

WE publish elsewhere a burlesque advertisement, "Housefly & Co.", which contains more real truths than could be brought to the attention of the public in almost any other way. That the house fly is a menace to health we will all agree, still we do not seem to realize the fact that to no other agent is due such suffering and death as to this little pest, or we would certainly act differently in the matter of exterminating them. We scern our doors to keep out the fly, because he is annoying, but leave the breeding places untouched, thinking that if the fly can be kept out of the house in swarms we are safe from infection.

THE citizens over in Shelby county have decided that they want good roads, or at least some of them have, and from the way they are agitating things it is pretty certain that something along this line will very soon begin to happen. The Timpson Times is advocating a \$200,000 bond issue for good roads in that precinct, and a Center citizen suggests in the Champion that a big barbecue and picnic be given either this month or early in June for the purpose of discussing good roads, etc. Good roads will have to come before this section develops as its natural resources deserve, and the fellow who is against the proposition may as well step to one side or he will be run over.

"Why shallow cultivation?"—Says J. O. Morgan, head of Agronomy department of A. and M. College of Texas.

"The two primary objects of cultivating a crop are first, to conserve moisture, and second, to kill weeds. Deep cultivation will conserve very little more moisture than shallow cultivation and possesses three very serious disadvantages: 1st—destroys the feeding roots of the crop; 2nd is wasteful of plantfood, as the food elements contained in that portion of the soil that is constantly stirred are not available to the crop, because the roots are kept out of the soil, 3rd—deep cultivation usually leaves the surface of the soil very uneven, again shallow and frequent cultivation destroys all weed seeds in the upper layer of the soil and does not bring to the surface weed seeds that are buried too deeply to germinate. Deep preparation and shallow cultivation should be the rule,

The East Texas Development Association has been called to hold its second annual meeting at Palestine May 28 and 29 next. We hope it will be well attended and are sure that it will be if the people of East Texas are quite awake to their opportunities. There is something peculiar in the case of East Texas. By that we mean that whereas it has probably more natural advantages than perhaps any other section of the state, it has shown least disposition to take organized advantage of those opportunities. Despite the superiority of its natural advantages, it has not progressed within 50 per cent so rapidly as some other less favored sections. Its soil may not be, as a whole, so fertile as the celebrated black land, but how infinitely more versatile is it! And what is more it lends itself more readily than that of any other section to the practice of the new idea in farming, which is diversified and intensified cultivation of a small area rather than the slovenly cultivation of a single crop or two or three at most. When the co-operation idea comes into full flower in this state—which we expect it will before a great while—what section will forge ahead so rapidly as East Texas? For what section of Texas can grow fruit and vegetables in competition with East Texas, and what section can fatten a hog so artistically and cheaply as East Texas? East Texas has only to bestir itself to make itself known, to enjoy a redivivus such as probably no other section of the state has known or even dreamed of.—Galveston News,

In the 880 yard run, Prentice of Brownwood won; H. P. Davis of Roby second; Davis of Nacogdoches third. Time 2-14-2.

In the Relay race, Marlin, Brownwood and Nacogdoches won respectively, 10, 5 and 3 points.

Rain Did Some Damage.

Muffins

By Mrs. Janet McKenzie Hill, Editor of the Boston Cooking School Magazine.

When muffins are on the breakfast table, nobody cares for meat or eggs and they would be served more often if this meal were not prepared so hurriedly that there is no time to make them. If K. C. the double-raise baking powder is used, the batter may be stirred up the night before, put in the pan ready for baking and nothing to do in the morning but bake them.

One-Egg Muffins
2 cups flour; 2 slightly rounded teaspoons K. C. Baking Powder; 1 teaspoonful salt; 1/2 cup sugar; 2 cup melted butter or lard; 1 egg; 1 cup water or milk.

Oil muffin or gem pans and have oven slow until the muffins come to the top of the pan, then increase the heat to bake and brown the muffins. This recipe makes 12 large muffins. Raisins or currants may be added if desired.



Graham Muffins

The constitutionalists in Mexico have filed a formal protest at New Orleans against the shipment of munitions of war from the United States to the Huerta government. The constitutionalists present the argument that Huerta is provisional president of a de facto government which controls a part only of Mexico and has not received formal recognition as a government from the United States, and is not entitled to immunity under the American neutrality laws. A large shipment of arms and ammunition are said to be ready for shipment from New Orleans to Vera Cruz.

In Texas Industrial Congress Contest**

From 1,746 students of better farming in 161 counties of the State in 1911, the Texas Industrial Congress has steadily increased this number to 10,869 in 215 counties in 1913. Unique among associations for agricultural development, the Congress, by offering \$10,000 in gold annually for the best yields of specific crops, cost of production considered, has in a little more than two years awakened among the farmers of Texas enthusiastic interest in scientific cultural methods, improved seed selection, better preparation of the soil and the conservation of its fertility through crop rotation and diversification.

While this remarkable growth has been the result primarily of the stimulus caused by the prize offer, this inducement to use brains as well as brawn in crop production, is recognized by thinking men as but an incident for the purpose of accomplishing the real object of the Congress, which is to lower the cost of production

while at the same time increasing the acreage yield, hence its slogan, "Smaller farms; better farming." The enrollment of nearly 11,000 contestants in this year's competition means that many demonstration farms in as many neighborhoods, intensively cultivated by 11,000 farmers who are seeking the best information they can get both from the Congress and from other sources, and are striving for the highest farming efficiency, thus educating not only themselves but presenting an ocular demonstration of better cultural methods to their neighbors as well.



- Every dot on the above map represents a demonstration farm-cultivated in corn, cotton, cowpeas, kafir or milo, in accordance with the advice and suggestions of the Congress. This information is furnished by bulletins at frequent intervals and also by personal letters. The stars indicate those counties in which prizes were won in the contests of 1911 and 1912. Among the 215 counties represented, Bexar County, which in 1911 had but seven contestants and in 1912 but nine, leads the State with 505 entries. Ellis County is second, having 321 contestants; Hunt County, with 339, is third and Kaufman, Cooke, Navarro, Tarrant, Dallas, Rockwall, Hill and Rusk Counties rank next in the order named.

Immense Preparation Being Made at Chattanooga to Entertain Confederate Veterans Next Month.

Chattanooga, Tenn., May 6. —In commemoration of the bloody battle at Chickamauga 50 years ago, Chattanooga announces perfection of the plans for entertainment of the United Confederate Veterans and the sons who will hold their 23rd annual Reunion May 27-29. High officials of the G. A. R. state that Chattanooga's expenditures for entertainment and amusement, etc., will be on a more lavish scale than was ever necessary for their meetings, even surpassing the high-water mark at Los Angeles.

It is expected in Chattanooga that upward of 12,000 veterans will be present, all of whom will be tendered free lodging and meals at Camp Alexander P. Stewart. The requisite number of Government tents and cots have been loaned by the War Department. FOSTER'S WEATHER BULLETIN

Copyrighted 1918 by W. T. Foster

Washington, D. C. May 3.—Last bulletin gave forecasts of disturbance to cross continent May 8 to 7, warm wave 2 to 6, cool wave 5 to 9. This will cause unusually high temperatures and dry weather but some rains will occur irregularly in various places as the cool wave comes in. Our danger signals will hang out for the great steamship route to Europe from May 8 to 14, beginning near the grand banks, in the vicinity of New Foundland, not far from May 8.

Next disturbance will reach Pacific coast about May 8, cross Pacific slope by close of 9, great central valleys 10 to 12, eastern sections 13. Warm wave will cross Pacific slope about May 8, great central valleys 10, eastern sections 12. Cool wave will cross Pacific slope about May 11, great central valleys 12, eastern sections 14.

This will be a fierce storm from the Pacific to the Atlantic as the storm crosses the

continent from about May 8 to 13. There are indications that it will be at its greatest force on May 12, about the time, or a little before, it reaches meridian 79, a line running north near Pittsburg, Penn. While this storm is not expected to be so dangerous as some of the recent storms, all should be on the lookout. There may be no tornadoes but it is best to be on the safe side. Much greater storms are expected last part of May.

The rains of this disturbance will no cover large sections but will be concentrated and some heavy downpours may be looked for. It is not possible now to locate such rainfalls. A large part of the country will remain dry and will be robbed of moisture to make up the heavy local rains. The cool wave preceding this disturbance will carry frosts further south than usual but the cool wave following will not bring very low temperatures.

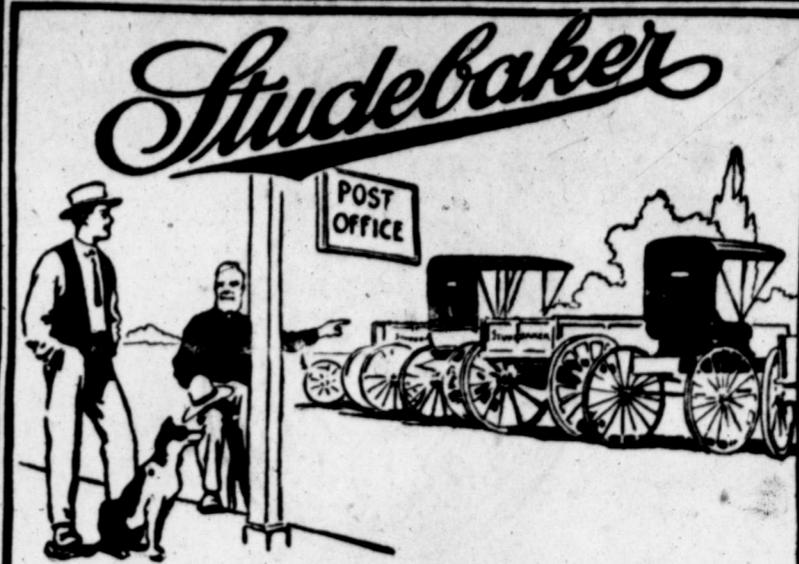

Oil and Gas in the City.

Editor Sentinel.

The Nacogdoches Oil & Gas Company is ready to begin taking leases near the splendid indications in the northeast part of the city and to start a well as soon as enough close-in land can be secured only such lands will be leased as would be considered in the developed field in case oil or gas is found. If either is found in such quantities as in the fields on all sides of us the royalty paid to the land owner will be a fortune.

Hundreds of people in Texas, Louisiana and Oklahoma, poor a few years ago, own great wealth today from royalties paid them by oil and gas companies, and without the expenditure of a collar. In case nothing of value is found the land owner is none the worse off. It is a clean case of "all to gain and nothing to lose."

Most companies require leases on two or three thousand acres and some of them on many more acres before entering a field. An agent of an Oklahoma company wrote a short time ago to this writer that his company would bore in Nacogdoches county if it could get leases on lands in 5000 acre blocks. My reply was that such blocks or such quantities are not available, and that only a few hundred acres are to be had and in small tracts and from many different owners. This is the conditions here as every one knows who is acquainted with the facts.

When leases are secured from those who have land near the tract on which the first well is to go down, boring will begin as soon as the machinery can be put on the ground. As the people of the city have much to gain in a general way from the success of the enterprise every one could well be a booster, and as the land owner has the additional incentive of much direct gain he could afford to exercise more lip and lung power and if need be tear his shirt a little bit.

There are better surface indications here than there were on Spindle Top or in the famous Glen Pool district of Oklahoma, and we are directly between these two wealth producing fields, as well as between Humble and Caddo parish.

Continued inaction would be less excusable than the stupidity of the original land owners of South Africa who with unseeing eyes walked for years over acres of diamonds which were discovered by new comers who bought the lands and became the owners of fabulous wealth.

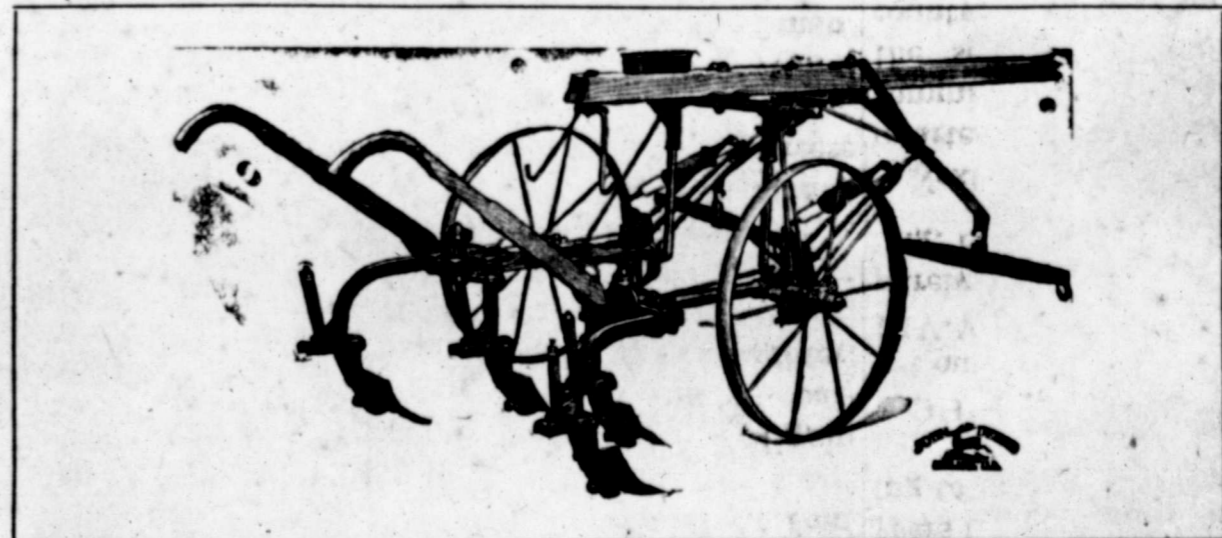
