MARKING THE KINGS

Daughters Of American Revolution Have The Matter in Hand, and the Work Will Soon be Started.

A the November meeting of the Daughters of the American Revolution held at ElPaso, the sum of \$1 200 was pledged to begin the erecting of the granite boulders marking the Old Kings Highway, across the state from the Sabine River to the Rio Grande river, on the county boundary lines and cross roads through the counties, as monuments to those torbears who crossed the wilderness and to preserve the state history.

Texas ganite boulders 5 feet high, 31/2x21/2 feet wide, one side smoothed and inscribed "Kings Highway-San Antonio Road, Erected by the Daughters of American Revolution" donors name and date. boulders will be set every five miles along the old road clear across the state. They will cost \$28,00 a piece.

The Daughters of American Revolution sending out an appeal to all patriots to lend a hand in locating this old trail, and already quite a number have subscribed for one of these boulders.
