

NEW YORK AS I SAW IT.

(By MISS RUTH SPRADLEY.)

Madison Square. Continued. The memorial of William H. Seward occupies a conspicuous position in the southwest corner of the Square. It is of bronze, by Randolph Rogers, and represents the statesman seated in a Senatorial chair, with pen in hand. Those who knew the living Seward aver that the legs were not the prominent features here presented. On the contrary he is spoken of as a man who was "All head and no legs." Seward was governor of New York, United States senator, and Secretary of State of the United States under Lincoln.

The most notable adornment of the Square, and the one which ranks as one of the best examples of contemporary sculpture possessed by the city, is the memorial of Admiral David Glascoe Farragut, by Augusta St. Gandens. 


