#### Know The Truth

Who said it? When did he say it? To whom was it said? Was it spoken for the benefit of all men or just a certain group? These are questions that must necessarily be answered before one can understand the Bible. This is the principle referred to in Paul's charge to Timothy, II Timothy 2:15, "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth." If one does not know that the Old Testament, as a binding law, has been abolished, and the New Testamentestablished then he is apt to misapply the Scriptures. For instance: the Galatians had been saved by obedience to the Gospel, but had begun to be influenced by false teachers who sought to turn them to the old abolished religion; Paul showed them they were wrong in trying to be saved by a law that was no longer in force, Galatians 5:4, "Christ is become of no effect unto you, whosoever of you are justified by the law; ye are fallen from grace." The Gospel is the power of God to save now, Romans 1:16. When the Galatians left the Gospel, they left the grace of God. Notice, John 1:17, "For the law was given by Moses, but grace and truth came by Jesus Christ." Further, Galatians 2:21, "I do not frustrate the grace of God: for if righteousness came by law, then Christ is dead

If one wants to learn how to become a Christian, he should not go to that section of the Bible called the "Old Testament" and do what Moses, David, Solomon, or Isaiah said; he should read in the part called the "New Testament" and do what Jesus and the apostles said. The Old Law was merely to lead up the New Law, Galatians 3:24. The heavenly Father shows in Matthew 17:5 that one must hear His Son and not

By Allen Cruttendon BOVINA -- Progress has changed many aspects of the farming and trading community of Bovina, in Parmer County, but the town's only hardware store has been preserved and today still typifies the familiar general stores that were so common throughout the Panhandle in the early 1900's.

J. Sam Gaines saw a need for a hardware store in the growing community. He opened his store in early 1025, and although he only lived eight years after the opening, Gaines Hardware Co. has remained as a living example of the founder's foresightedness.

The merchandise has, of course, been a victim of progress in the past 40 years, but the building has remained basically the same.

Gaines had a reputation for being one of the better advertising copy writers in the area. One such ad in the "Bovina Blade" read, "Gaines Hardware -- anything from a nickel paper of pins to a Sanders plow."

Mrs. Gaines, who celebrated her 92nd birthday last March, recalled, "We used to have to drive to Amarillo in a pick-up truck to get the merchandise.

J. Sam Gaines died 34 years ago, in June of 1933, His daughter. Mrs. Lady Armstrong, has kept the store running in the same family tradition. Mrs. Gaines said of her daughter, "She is a mighty good saleman, and there were some hard times, but she has always kept the store on its feet."


