VER TEN MILLION **REGISTERED YESTERDAY**

Washington, June 5.-Ten million young Americans enrolled themselves Tuesday for war service. Registration day, with but a few weeks of preparation, saw the first military census ever taken in the United States completed without a single untoward event of consequence.

The manhood of the nation obeyed the president's call and volunteered in mass, setting at naught all the schemes and plottings of German sympathizers and the few cranks who have agitated against registration. It remains but to select the men who are to go to the front. From every state congratulatory messages came Tuesday night to Brigadier General Crowder, provost marshal general, federal supervising officer of the great enterprise. While no complete returns from any state were transmitted up to a late hour the gyoernors were unanimous in reporting that complete quiet had prevailed throughout the day and that a fotal full registration was indicated







NACOGDOCHES TRADITIONS.

In 1857 Texas as a state was just twenty-one years old, the legal age of majority, but Nacogdoches was then about a century old, and about the foremost town in Texas.

The wise men of the East landed here first, and big politics started here first. So did wars and rumors of wars, and revolutions. The first Baptist church was organized here in

1837, and is here yet, known as the "Old North Church." The first protestant sermon was preached here by a Cumberland Presbyterian minister in 1828, standing upon the sills of a house foundation about where the Commercial State Bank now stands. The first Masonic Lodge was organized here, being Milam Lodge No. 2. A younger lodge accidentally happened to get No. 1. All this showed that Nacogdoches was "first in war, first in peace and first in the hearts of her countrymen." And so when any "big--to-do" was to be staged in Texas, Nacogdoches took the lead-it began here as a matter of course. And in those days it came to pass, in the years called fifties, that General Sam Houston, who was U. S. Senator from Texas, as was also General Thos. J.
