Subscriptions to the latest issue of certificates of indebtedness, to be dated November 30 and due June 25, 1917, to counteract the flood of income and excess profits taxes on the latter date, have been generous since the issue was announced two days ago. The exact amount of subscriptions has not been announced by Secretary McAdoo, however.

STATE CONTROL OF INTERURBANS

Austin, Texas, Nov. 13 .- The railroad commission today issued an order assuming jurisdiction over all of the interurban railway companies operating in Texas, this rather unusual action being the result of notice received by the commission of an advance in freight and express rates by the interurbans.

The order also requires the interurbans to file with the commission all passenger, freight and express tariffs covering a period from October 1, 1917, to the present time. The interurbans are required to file these tariffs and rates within 10 days from the issuance of this order. The commission proposes to regulate in the future, all freight and express rates in operation






