This fund came into being during with simplification of the income and the three-year drouth which brought sections of Texas to the verge of want and starvation, and a total of \$277,1 486 was donated, upon appel by the governor and others, to be loaned to drouth sufferers without interest. Cf this amount \$272,955 was allotted.

and \$7.023 has been repaid by those to whom it was loaned.

Mr. Weinert said in his report that conditions in the drouth district hafe materially improved, but people there went near to bankruptry that they have not yet recovered, and that while many are anxious to repay the money they borrowed from the fund they cannot do so until they have recuperated further. All requests for additional time in which to repay the fund have been granted by the administrator.

The disposition to be made of this fund and additions rade to it by payments has not been decided upon.
