Thus San Antonio and Nacogdoches became connected in a personal way. and as a matter of course this event and others produced a traveled road that is yet known as "the old San Antonio road," or "King's Highway" or in Spanish, "El Camino del Rey," or Camino Real. The San Antonio end became Nacogdoches street, and it is so called now. It borders the old Alamo premises, and starts from the southeastern corner thereof, in front of the present Hotel Crockett, which was built by a Nacogdoches contractor, J. M. Innis, about the year

#### THE TEXAS COTTON CROP.

The final estimate shows the Texas cotton crop to be practically the same in number of bales as last year's short crop. Both years' crops suffered alike throughout the seasons from extremes of weather influence, but the excesses were totally the opopsite in character in application to areas affected. Last year, because of prolonged drouth, the west half of the state made little cotton, while the east half, with necessary moisture, made a splendid crop. This year, with excess of moisture throughout and multiplied insects of every known kind, the eastern belt has suffered in almost equal proportion therefrom as did the western belt last year from excessive drouth.

The late date of killing frost, as of November 12, materially added to the crop in that part of the state un-

#### INCOME TAX REPORT.

AUSTIN, Texas, Dec. 5 .- The following information relating to an individual's liability in making income tax reports and paying the tax is issued by the Collector of Revenue for the District of Texas.

All married persons whose net income during the year 1919 equals or exceeds \$2000.00, and all single persons whose net income equals or exceeds \$1000.00, are required to make an income tax report. If you were married or head of a family on the 31st day of December, 1919, you are entitled to an exemption of \$2000.00; tion. Here is instant relief! if single and not head of a family you are entitled to an exemption of only \$1000.00. Persons are also entitled to a further credit, whether single, married or at the head of a family, of \$200.00 for each person at once, and they cost so little at drug (other than husband or wife) dependent upon and receiving his or her chief support from them during the year, if such person is under 18 years of age or is incapable of self support by reason of mental or physical dis-

The normal income tax is at the rate of 4 percent the first \$4000.00 of the net income in excess of the credits allowed, and 8 per cent upon an excess of that amount. A person receiving a net income in excess of \$5000.00 is also liable to a surtax of 1 per cent upon income from \$5000.00 to \$6000.

A LOOK INTO THE FUTURE.

In these days when everything in erybody with a grain of common sense. the world seems to have gone topsyturvy with war, it is interesting to read some of the prophetic utterances, or dreams, if you please to call them such, of leading men in thought who long since have gone hence and "sleep" unconscious of the volcanic eruption of blood which has been tearing nations to pieces. In this line country. some of the utterances of Col. R. G. Ingersoll have significance. For instance, in one of his orations he described the future as many presentday writers seem now to feel it is soon to be. He said:

"I see a world where thrones have crumbled and where kings are dust. The aristocracy of idleness has perished from the earth.

"I see a world without a slave. Man at last is free. Nature's forces have by science been enslaved. Lightning and light, wind and wave, frost and flame and all the secret, subtle powers of earth and air are the tireless toilers of the human race.






