## Surveys In Mail For Hospital Plans

The Parmer County Community Hospital Board of Directors is reminding the residents of Friona, Bovina and the surrounding areas to complete and return the survey form mailed this week.

The survey form, page 2 of a 4 page letter is requesting input from the local residents concerning funding for the local community owned facility.

Additional outside funding is needed for the facility to upgrade and replace equipment and services, recruit and retain health care professionals, and help recruit and retain physicians within the community.

The methods of obtaining needed capital is explained in the letter. While exact amounts are not known at this time, methods of raising capital are available through the formation of a hospital district which has taxing authority, a local tax, private contributions, or a combination of the above.

"Your input by responding to the survey questions will be used by the Board of Directors in making the important decisions affecting your hospital and the future of health care in Parmer County," said a spokesman for the hospital.

The survey may be returned by dropping the postage-paid self-

addressed survey form into the mail.

If you failed to receive your survey form, one may be picked up at the clinic front desk during regular clinic hours or by calling 247-2754 and the survey form will be mailed to you.

The Parmer County Community Hospital, a non-profit corporation, is directed by a five-member board of directors. Current directors are: Wendell Gresham, president; Dale Schueler, DVM, vice president; Dennis Anthony, secretary-treasurer; Danny Kendrick and Keith Black, members.

## BHS Plays Tough; But Swifts Win

The BHS Mustangs played the favored Nazareth Swifts tough in their season-ender here last Friday, before losing 22-0. The win sent Nazareth into the playoffs.

Bovina's defense allowed only one touchdown, and that didn't come until just 12 seconds before halftime, as the Mustangs played tough.

BHS had a strong chance midway through the first quarter, moving to the Nazareth 22 on a drive. But with a receiver open, the team failed to connect, then had a loss on the next play and Nazareth took over.

Bovina then got an interception, and had a second chance, but again couldn't dent the scoreboard.

Nazareth clicked on a pass with 12 seconds remaining in the half, and ran for two points, to take an 8-0 lead to intermission.

In the third quarter, the Mustangs muffed a fair catch on a Swift punt, the ball rolled to the end zone, where Nazareth recovered for a touchdown. The PAT kick made it 15-0.

Then, with about ten minutes left in the game, Bovina faced a fourth down with less than a foot to go, and had to try for the yardage. It appeared the team had made the yardage, but on spotting the ball, the official moved it back,

and the measurement was short.

The Swifts went from there to their third touchdown, although having to earn every yard.

Robert Guevara, linebacker on defense playing his last game for the Mustangs, sparkled with 19 tackles, 14 unassisted. He had three touchdown-saving tackles, and was honorable mention Player of the Week by the Amarillo Globe-News.

"I was proud of the kids' effort. Especially after the way we started the year, I thought we came along strong. We were picked to win only one game at best, and we went into the last game with a shot at making the playoffs," first-year coach Rock Stanley said.

"We had to re-learn the basics, going from six man back to 11-man football, and four of our linemen weigh only 160 pounds. They did everything we asked them to do all year long," the coach added.

## Hawkins Honored For 40 Years

Rev. Gene Hawkins, director of missions for the Lubbock Baptist Area, received special recognition Sunday morning at First Baptist Church for 40 years in the ministry.

In Bovina to lead a "Lord Do It Again!" revival prayer seminar, Bro. Hawkins was surprised Sunday before he preached with a special plaque presented to him by Richard Grisham, pastor. The inscription read:

November 11, 1990  
In honor of our Lord  
First Baptist Church, Bovina, Texas  
recognizes

GENE HAWKINS  
(one of our own)

for forty years in gospel ministry,  
1950-1990.  
"He preached Jesus"  
(Acts 8:35)

Born in 1930, Bro. Hawkins was raised in Parmer County, three and one-half miles west of Bovina. Graduating from Bovina High School in 1947, where he excelled in basketball, he married Louise Moody on August 21, 1948.

He attended Oklahoma A&M, playing basketball, then WTSU in Canyon for awhile, before coming back to Bovina to farm and raise a few cattle.

In April of 1950, while attending worship at First Baptist Church (E.J. Speegle was pastor), Gene felt the Lord was calling him to gospel ministry. "James

Tidenburg and I were ordained to preach by First Baptist Church on consecutive Sundays in August of 1951," says Gene.

After pastoring Pleasant Hill Baptist Church across the state line in New Mexico for about a year and a half, Gene enrolled at Wayland Baptist College in Plainview in 1953, and then attended and graduated from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Ft. Worth with a Bachelor of Divinity degree in 1956.

Churches he has pastored since that time include First Baptist Churches of Matador, Lockney and Seminole. From 1972-74, Bro. Hawkins pastored Calvary Baptist Church in Lubbock before going to Topeka, Kansas, where he pastored First Baptist Church there for ten years.

In 1984, Lubbock Baptist Area called him to be director of missions over the 100 and more churches and missions in that Association. Gene says, "I still consider Bovina to be home, and FBC as the church which gave me my start in ministry."

Approximately 100 people attended the "Lord Do It Again!" Prayer Seminar that Rev. Hawkins led at First Baptist Church this weekend. He was also given a love offering and a gift for his wife, Louise, who was unable to attend due to illness of their daughter, Nancy.

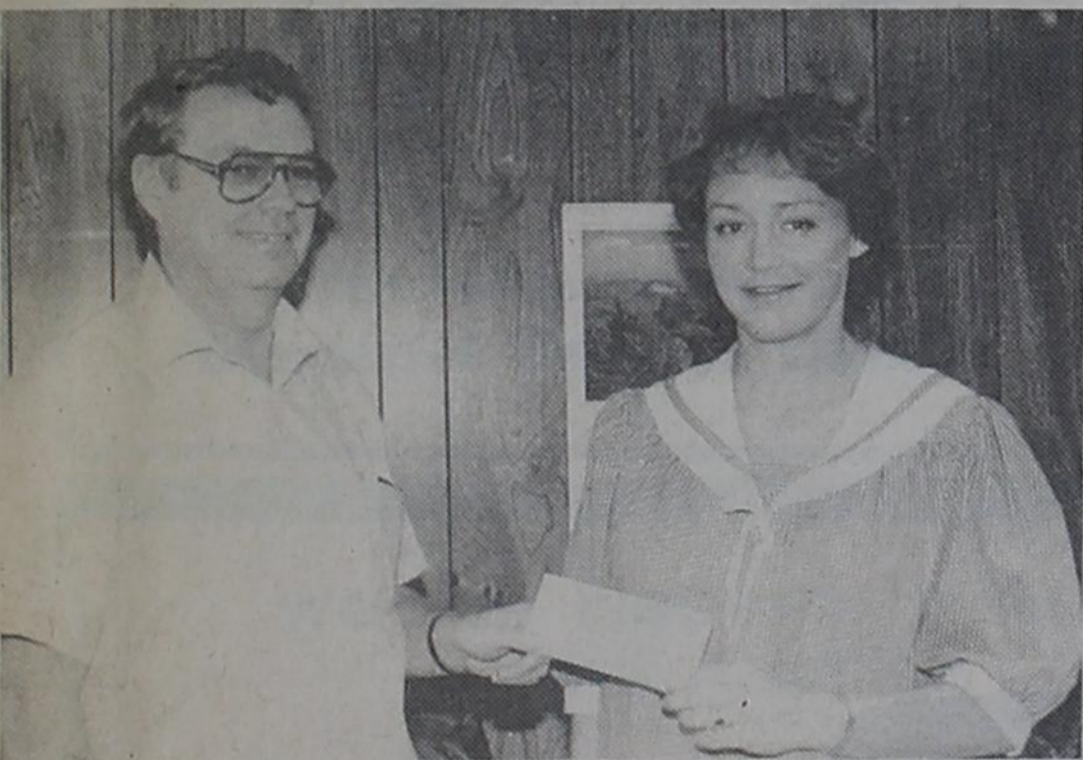
