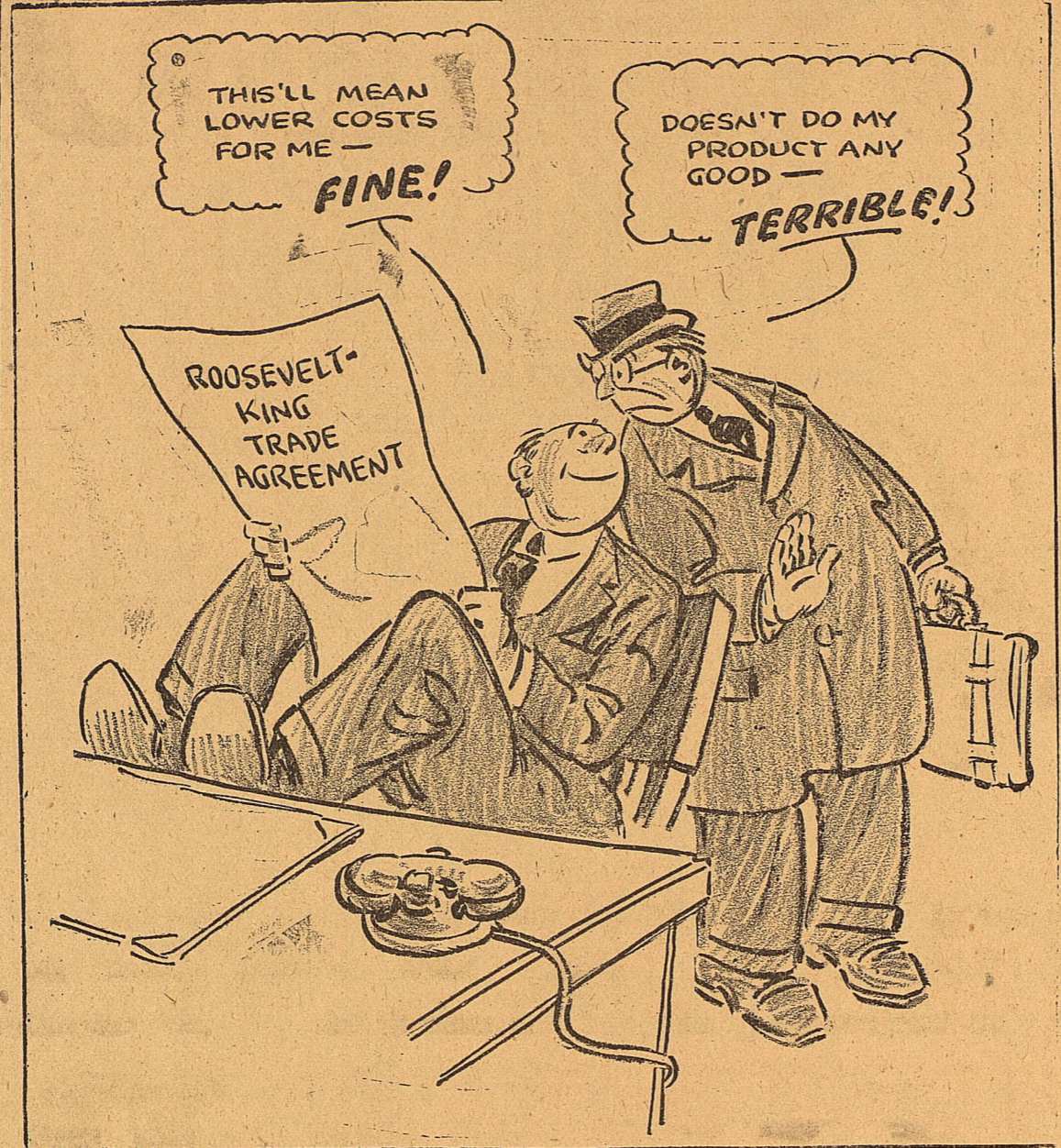

BEHIND THE SCENES IN WASHINGTON WITH RODNEY DUTCHER

BY RODNEY DUTCHER NEA Service Staff Correspondent WASHINGTON—In one of the capital's better interior decorating shops works an upholsterer who served on the jury which several years ago convicted Albert B. Fall of bribe-taking in the oil cases.

Mrs. Owen J. Roberts, wife of the supreme court justice who won fame in prosecution of E. L. Doherty, Harry Sinclair, and Fall—Fall alone being convicted—went into the shop the other day.

The upholsterer told her how he had been one of a minority on the Fall jury standing for conviction and how he had helped swing the others around.

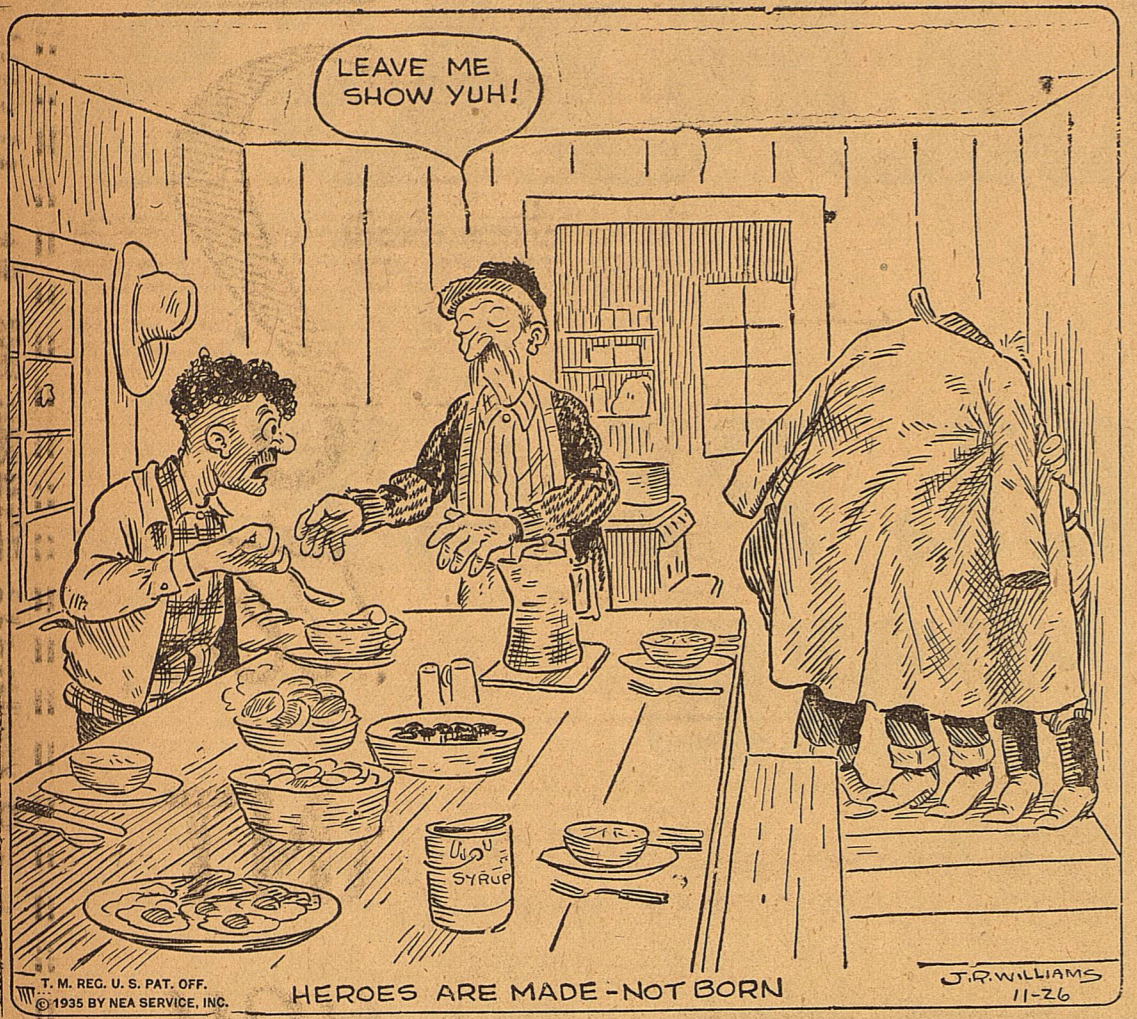

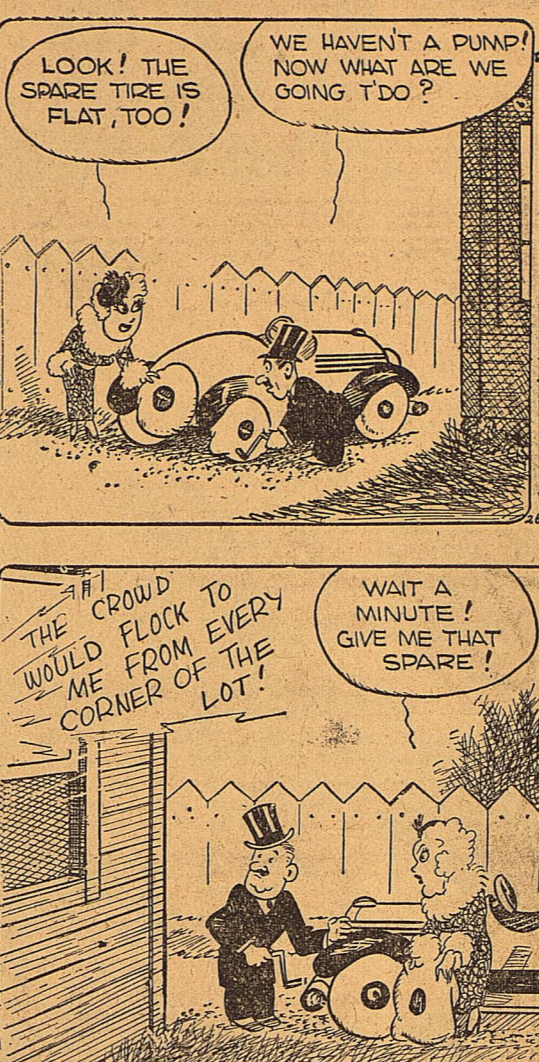


HEROES ARE MADE - NOT BORN

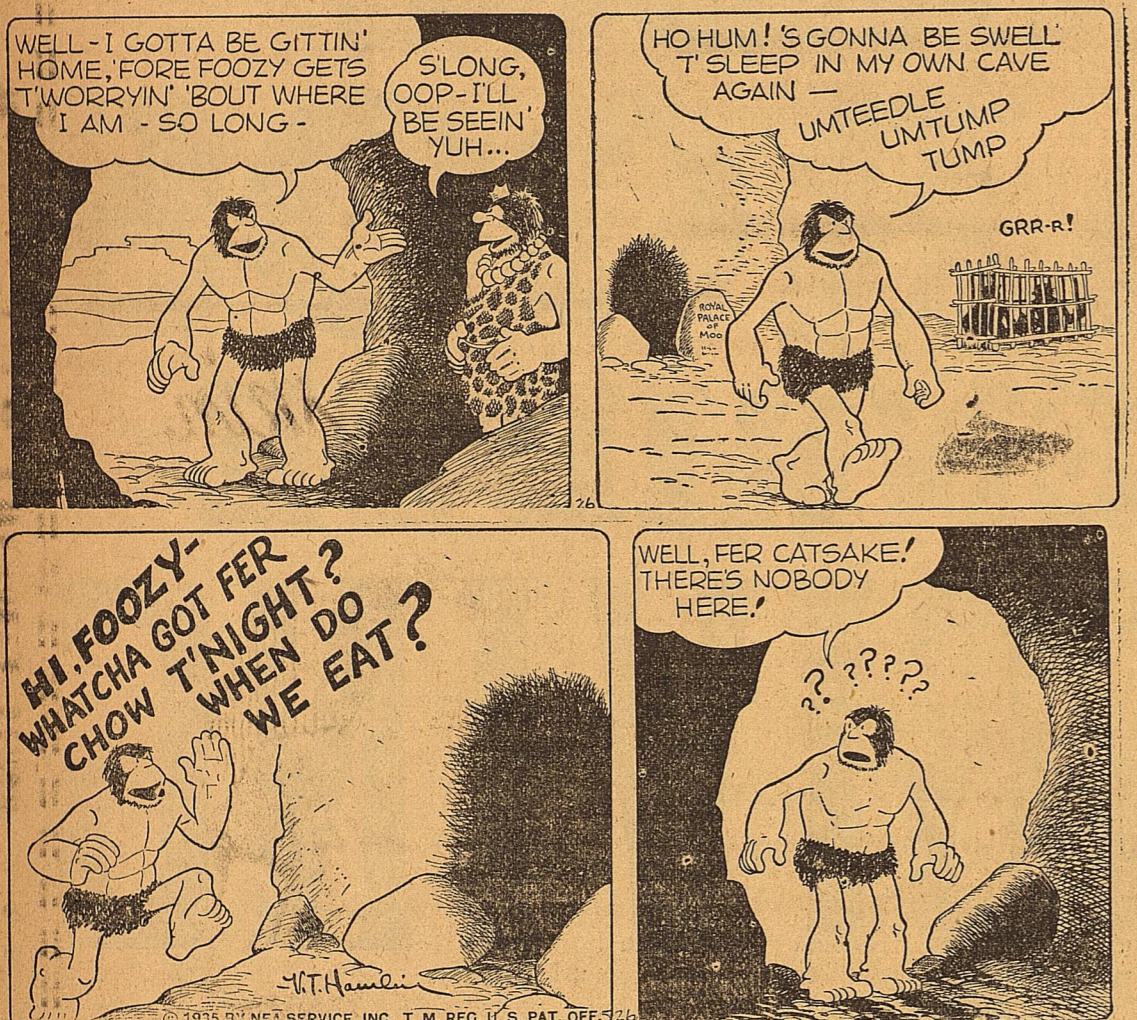


By Cowen ST. LOUIS ACCIDENTS MOUNT HIGHER

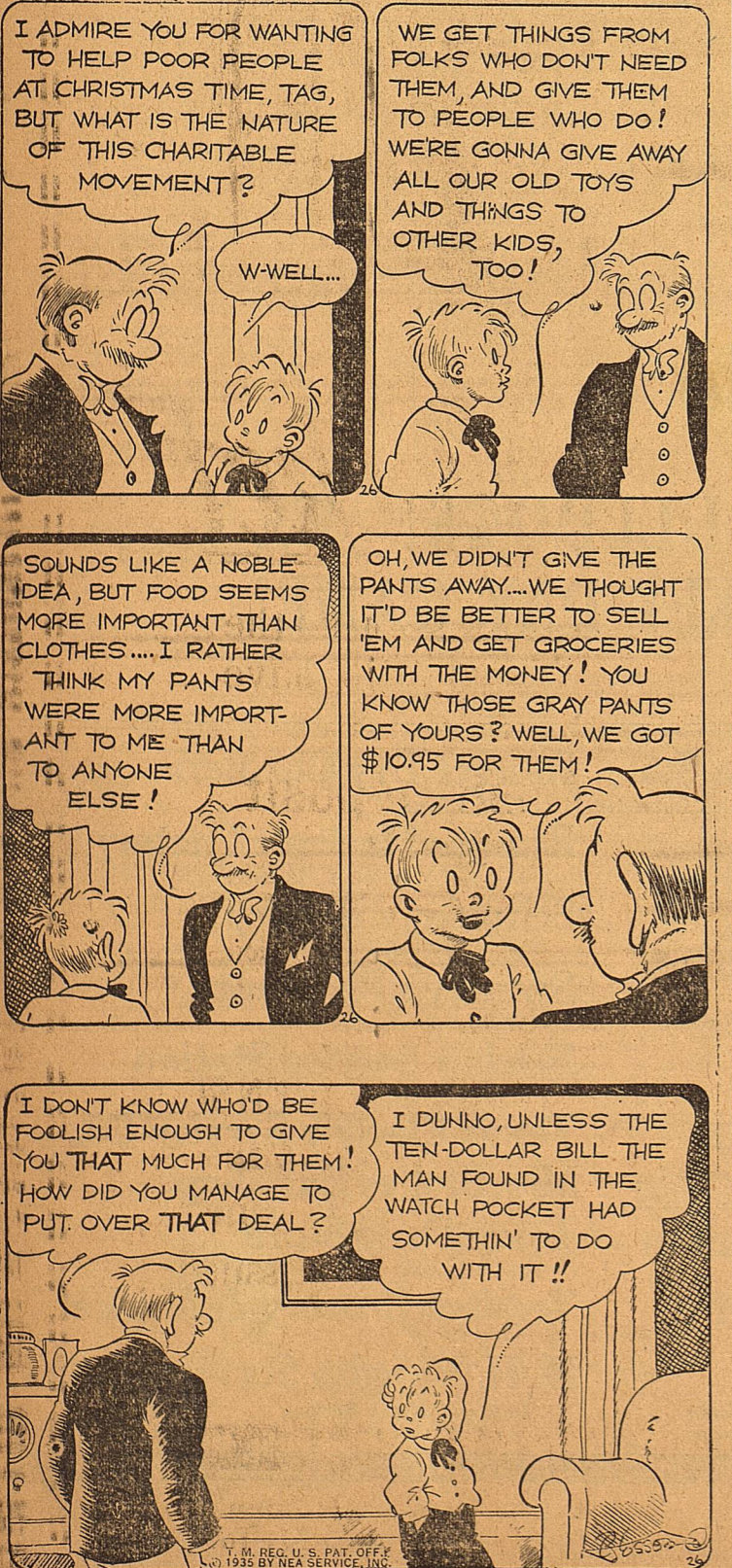

The major recent developments have been, the expansion of highway traffic between Venezuela and Colombia, Peruvian development of highways intended to connect the Pacific slope with the upper Amazon Valley, rapid modernization of highways in Argentina, and reported agitation for a Trans-Andean highway between Chile and Argentina at sufficiently low altitude to permit year-round travel.

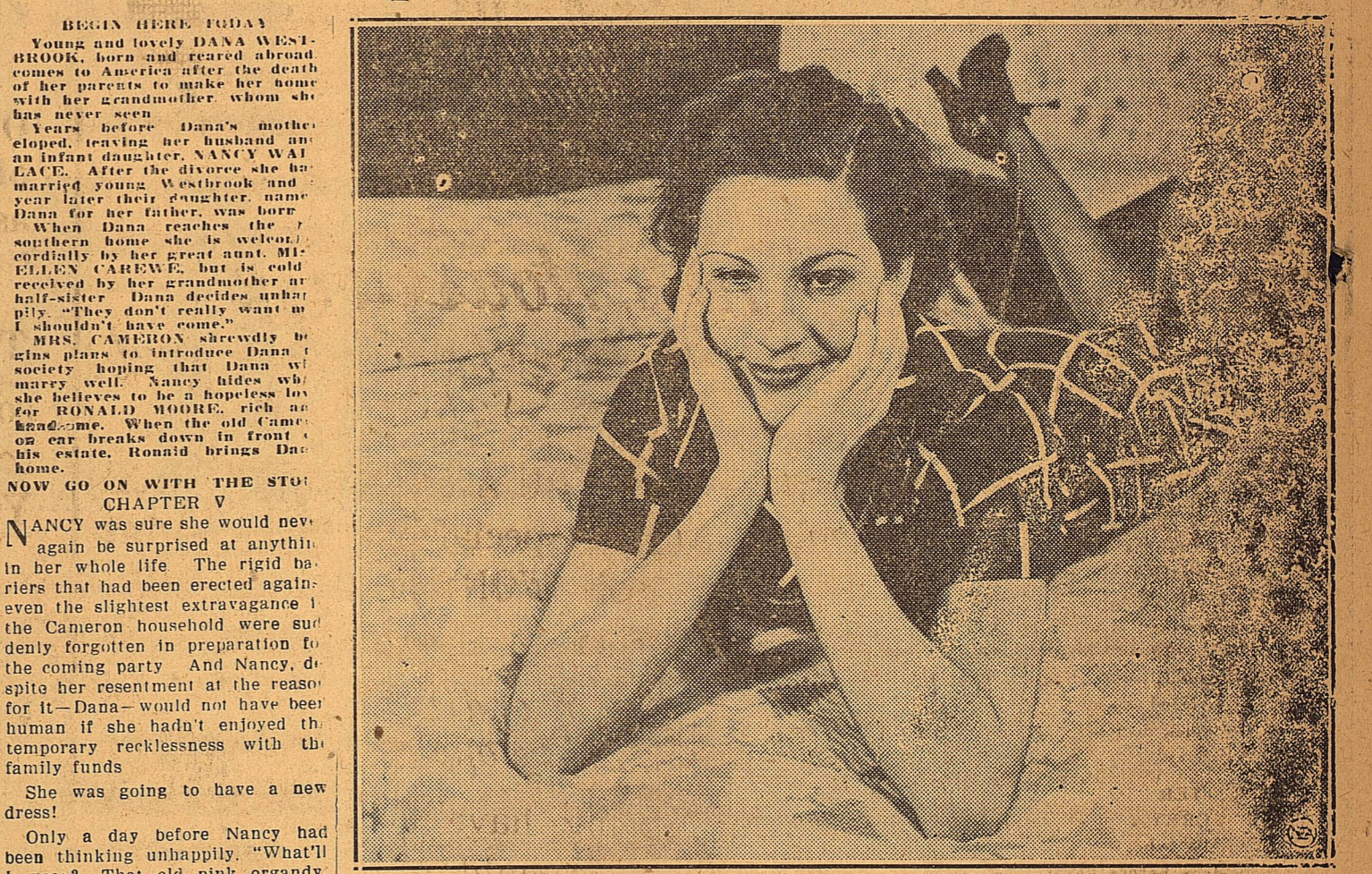

IN MANY CASES STRANGERS, without reliable credentials, are spotters for professional criminals, and according to police records, lack of caution on the part of the householders in admitting such strangers oftentimes results in costly property losses and bitter experiences.

DO NOT PAY CASH IN ADVANCE TO STRANGERS ON ANY MERCHANDISE . . . in many cases and from experience reported to the police department the customer has never received anything for the cash advanced nor has any refund been made of the original cash deposit.

DO NOT CASH CHECKS FOR STRANGERS NOR ISSUE A CHECK as down payment on any order to a stranger, as in a number of cases these checks have been altered and later cashed by a third and innocent party.

SHOPLIFTERS WORKING THROUGH HERE pilfer merchandise from local stores and dispose of this merchandise to citizens in this territory. POLICE ARE KEEPING CHECK OF SUSPECTED INDIVIDUALS and your co-operation is asked in tracing down stolen goods. Beware of this merchandise usually sold as a special deal or offered at a ridiculous price for quick disposal.

IT'S BETTER TO BE SAFE THAN SORRY . . . BE SURE YOU KNOW who the stranger is at your door before granting admittance to your home. IN CASE YOU ARE SUSPICIOUS PHONE THE POLICE AT ONCE . . . as we are anxious to co-operate with our citizens at all times.

HIGH-PRESSURE FREE GIFT ARTISTS HAVE BEEN WORKING the residence and farm districts of late selling all kinds of merchandise and offering "something free" to get into the homes. IN MOST CASES THERE IS NOTHING FREE TO BE GIVEN AWAY.

ONE NEED NOT BE AFRAID OF OFFENDING THE HONEST SOLICITOR, salesman or inspector living here or representing a local firm . . . THEY HAVE THEIR CREDENTIALS WITH THEM and welcome such investigation . . . that is why they are required to carry credentials. PROTECT YOURSELF . . . ASK FOR CREDENTIALS SHOWING THEIR IDENTITY AND THEIR LOCAL CONNECTIONS.

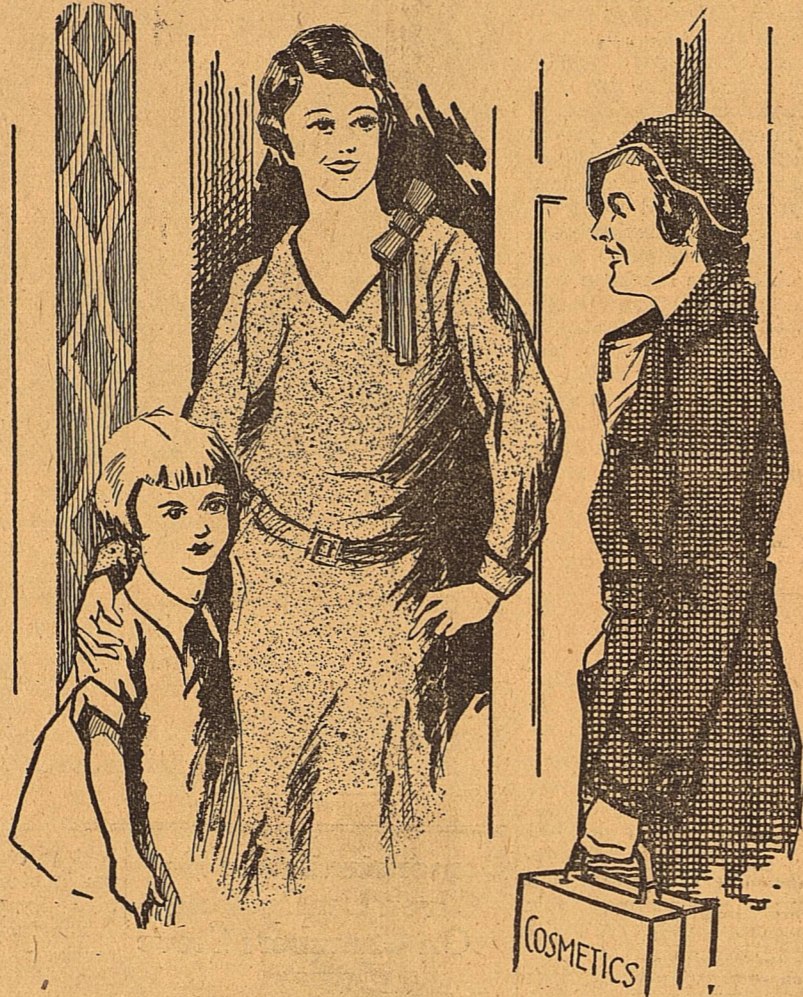

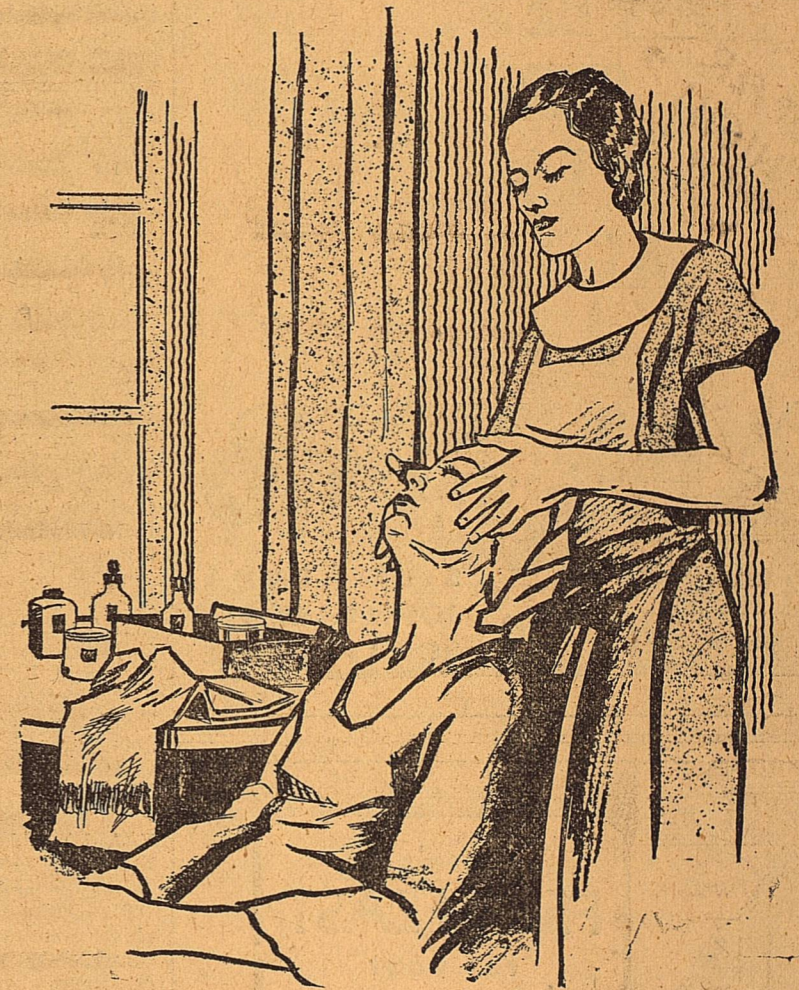

**Pay a Cash Deposit** in advance of **25% up to 40%** of order.

As a rule the Salesperson's commission.

### ARE YOU AWARE

of the **HAZARDS** to which you subject yourself by allowing a **STRANGER**, interested mainly in making a **SALE** to treat your skin? What assurance have you that the peddler is not a *carrier of dirt or disease*? You would not call a stranger to prescribe for you if sick. Why take these chances? Many cities require Health Examinations for all peddlers.

### SKIN TREATMENTS

should be done **ONLY BY THOSE HAVING A LICENSE**. State Health Boards require a strict *examination*—after a very thorough study course—as to one's **QUALIFICATIONS** before a permit or license is issued entitling one to prescribe or apply cosmetics. Ask the peddler for his license.
