Absentee voting for the May 5 election begins on April 16 and will run through 4 p.m. on May 1.

Absentee ballots may be cast at the business office at Ridgelea Elementary School.

City Race Has Four Candidates

The deadline for filing for applications for a position on the City Council was March 21.

Mayor Keith Knight's term is expiring, along with the terms of two aldermen, Sonny Roach and John Dixon. These three men have filed for re-election and Marie Venable has filed for an alderman's position.

Holdover members of the City Council are Galen Hromas, Leon Ware and Charlie Teague.

Southwestern Public Service Company's (SPS) Texas retail customers will receive lower rates beginning in April due to an interim reduction in the "fuel-cost recovery factor" on electric bills. The decrease will lower overall electric rates 9.6%, or \$43.8 million, for residential, commercial, industrial and other retail customers.

The reduction, which was requested by SPS in November 1989, was approved this week on an interim basis by a hearing examiner with the Public Utility Commission of Texas. The fuel cost collected by the interim factor will be subject to final review by the commission.

The amount of the decrease will vary according to usage and rates applicable to different types of customers. Texas residential customers using 1,000 kilowatt hours a month on SPS's standard rate will see their monthly electric bills decline by \$5.07, from \$69.67 to \$64.60.

This reduction is the result of lower fuel and purchased-power expenses. The cost of fuel to operate SPS power plants, plus the cost of power purchased from other companies, makes up about half of SPS's overall costs to serve customers.

"Our industrial electric rates already are among the lowest in the nation, and this reduction will put

TEAMS Tests Scheduled Locally

Judge's Race Tops Democratic Runoff

The runoff election will be held Tuesday, April 10, with the county judge's race holding the most interest for local voters.

Bonnie Clayton of Bovina and B.K. Buske of Friona face in the runoff for nomination as Parmer County Judge. They were the leading vote-getters in the five-person field in the Democratic primary on March 13.

At the top of the Democratic ticket is another "battle of the sexes," where Jim Maddox and Ann Richards have been sparring for the nomination for Governor.

Maddox was the leading vote-getter in Bovina and Parmer County in the first primary, and the two candidates were almost dead-even statewide. They have been wooing the voters who were for former governor Mark White the first go-around.

In another race, Tom Bowden and Nikki Van Hightower square off in the state treasurer's race, Bob Gammage and Ross Sears are opponents for Justice of the Supreme Court, Place 2, and Amarillo's Morris Overstreet and Frank Maloney are opponents for the judge of the Court of Criminal Appeals, Place 1.

In the Republican runoff, where a much lighter turnout is expected, Wes Gilbreath and Grady Yarbrough face off for the nomination for state Land Commissioner, and Rick Perry and Richard McIver are opponents for the state Commissioner of Agriculture nomination.

Polling places are the same as during the first primary for the Democrats. Bovina voters will cast ballots at the old American Legion Hall.

However, Chris Gikas, County Republican chairman, said that only one polling place will be operated in the county for the GOP runoff, and it will be located at the Farwell City Hall.

Anyone may call or write Gikas for an absentee ballot if they cannot vote in person, he said.

Our new school record was set as distance superstar Melissa Perez began the day off right as she won the 2400 meter run in a time of 10:26.3. Melissa rested up and came up with her daily double as she also won the one-mile run.

Other highlights of the meet came when all three Bovina relays ran personal best times. The mile relay foursome of Ellie Bermea, Kim Kirkpatrick, Sally Noriega and Brooke Charles, really showed astonishing improvement as they cut their past best time by some twenty seconds.

Kim Kirkpatrick also pulled off an exciting victory in the 100 meter hurdles as she won in a fast and personal best time of 18.1.

McClaran Winner In Pioneer Contest

Wayne McClaran recently placed first in the Ridge-Till Irrigated division of the National Corn Growers Association National Corn Yield Contest in Texas with a yield of 217.23 bushels per acre.

McClaran, who farms near Farwell, planted his winning entry, Pioneer 3168, on April 13, 1989, in 40-inch rows at a planting rate of

31,000 seeds per acre. The 36-acre field which produced the winning entry had been planted to cotton in 1988. The crop was grown using a conventional tillage system, and planted with a John Deere 7100.

McClaran's contest entry received approximately 250 pounds of nitrogen and 75 pounds of phosphate on a per-acre basis. Weed control was achieved by a preplant incorporated application of Lasso at 3.00 quarts per acre.

A winner in the irrigated category, McClaran used furrow irrigator to water the crop.

McClaran's winning yield was harvested September 28, 1989, at 18.60% moisture.

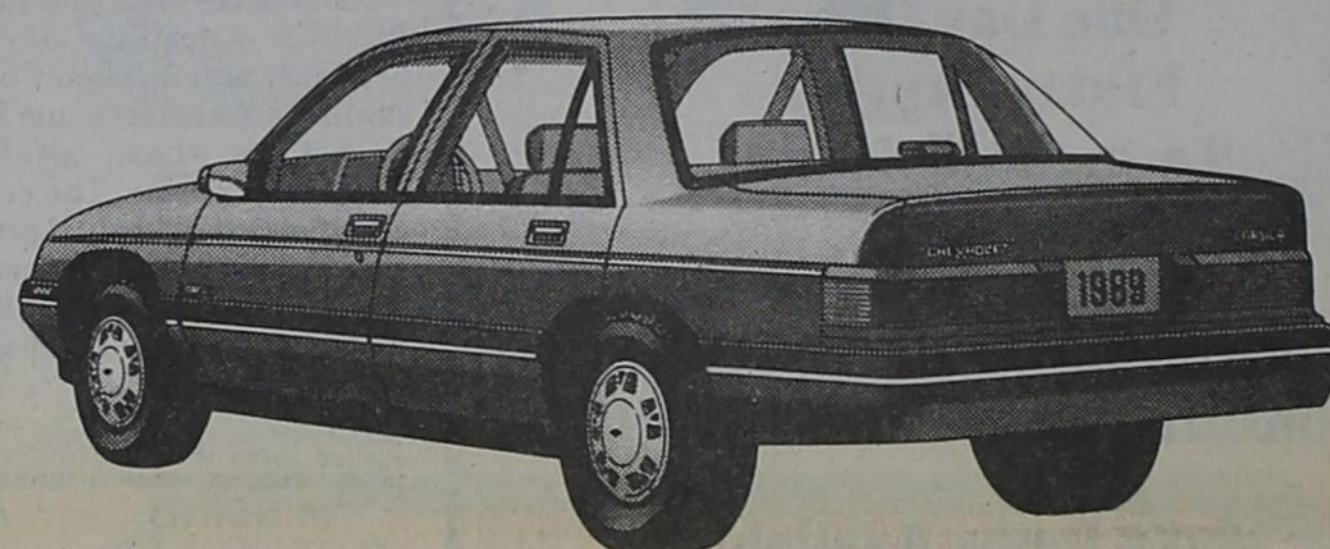

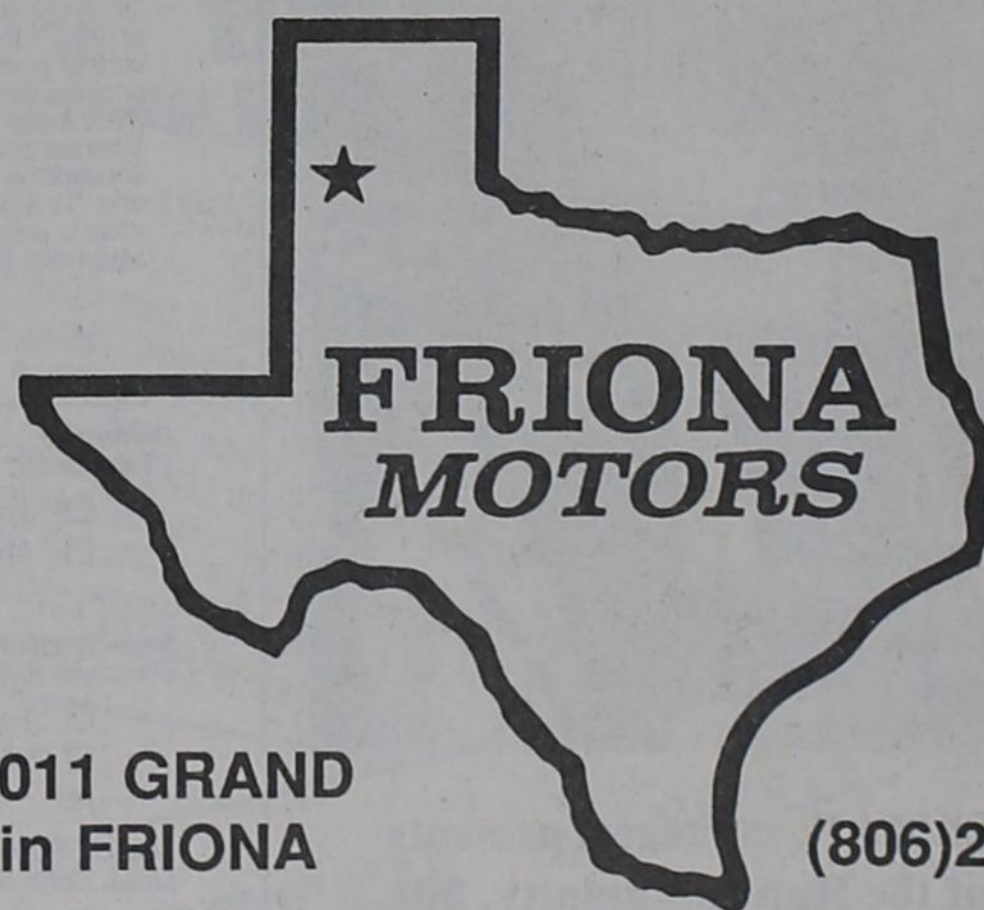
