Some Employers Fail To Include a Workers' Statement within the next ten days.

ABILENE, Texas -Complaints received from workers indicate that some employers are not familiar with the requirements that a statement of wages paid must be given to each employee, according to W. O. King, manager of the Abilene office of the Social Security Board.

"The Social Security Act provides that every employer shall furnish a written statement to each of his employees, in a form tendent of Ranger schools. suitable for retention by the employee, showing the amount of wages paid, "Mr. King said. No special form is prescribed
