Social Security IsTightening Up Proof Regulation "We are tightening up on
our age prof requirements
effective November 22," aneffective November 22, , an-
nounces R. R. Tuley, Jr., Ab-

Social Security Administration.
He added that completion of a study, conducted on a ran-
dom basis for the past sever-
al al months, has led to this
change. Heretofore, almost
cing any proof of age that was re-
corded five or more years before a claims application was
filed would suffice. Now, the
