

Jaycees' Target Shoot Will Open 5 p. m. Thursday

Ranger and area nimrods are getting ready for the Ranger Jaycees big pre-Christmas target shoot to be held in the E. L. Martin Co. Bldg. in downtown Ranger on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, Dec. 16-17-18.

There'll be 22 hours of firing with a \$5.00 gift certificate to be given away every hour on the hour. These certificates will be redeemable at any business firm or merchant in Ranger.

In addition, the top shooters in each of three divisions will be awarded valuable grand prizes. In the men's class, the award will be a \$25 gift

certificate, in the women's division a \$15 gift certificate, and top shooting junior will be given a \$10 certificate.

Proceeds from the three-day shoot will be used to purchase equipment for Boy Scout Troop 88, sponsored by the Ranger Jaycees.

Firing is scheduled to begin Thursday at 5 p. m., continuing until 10 p. m. that night, Friday's shooting hours will be the same, and Saturday the shoot will be in progress from 9 a. m. until 9 p. m.

- 1—Check weapon with Jaycees.
- 2—22 caliber rifles only, .22 shorts.
- 3—Three shots for \$1.00.
- 4—May use your own gun.
- 5—No peep sights or scopes.
- 6—Shoot from standing position.

Elmer Blackwell Is Cited For Long, Dedicated Service to Agriculture As Member of County Committee

Elmer E. Blackwell, well known Eastland County farmer and cattle raiser, was honored Friday afternoon at the Baker Hotel in Mineral Wells when he was awarded a certificate and pin in recognition of over 30 years of dedicated service to the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Committee of Eastland County.

Blackwell, 63, has seen tremendous agricultural development from the old horse and buggy days into this ever-changing jet and space age.

Presentation of his certificate and pin was made at an eleven-county ASC meeting in Mineral Wells Friday by Jack Bradshaw of College Station, assistant to the State ASC committee and a longtime friend and associate of the Eastland County farmer and stock raiser.

The new Food & Agriculture Act of 1965, recently enacted by the Congress, was the principal topic discussed during the meeting.

Blackwell has a diversified farm 12 miles southeast of Ranger where he raises peanuts, feed grain, and cattle. He probably is the oldest county committeeman in years of consecutive service in the state.

A lifelong ruralist who was born in Eastland County not too many miles from his present farm, he began his ASC activities back in the Roosevelt New Deal era under the old Triple A (Agricultural Adjustment Administration) which was first administered through county agents under the Extension Service.

At that time — in 1933 — Blackwell was appointed as a peanut committeeman and worked under the supervision of Eastland County Agent J. C. Patterson.

A far-cry from the duties of present day ASC committeemen, back in those years Blackwell, in addition to his own farm responsibilities, became familiar with the duties of a chairman, helped measure crops, checked compliance, etc.

He was re-appointed in 1934, 1935, and 1936, and then in 1937, the first year committeemen were chosen by a vote of their fellow farmers, Blackwell was one of the three members elected.

He has — every year — since that time been re-elected and has served in all capacities as a county ASC committeeman during his 32-year span of service.

Blackwell also helped organize the Comanche County Electric Co-Operative, a member.

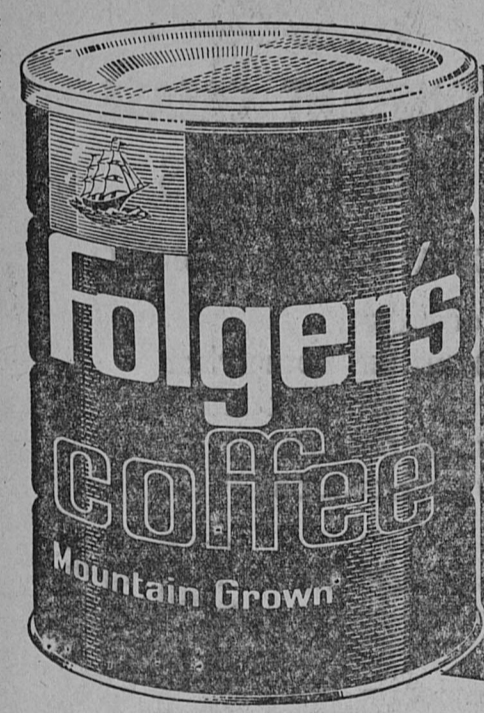

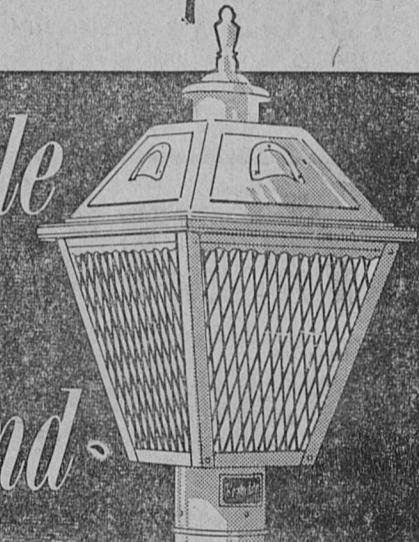

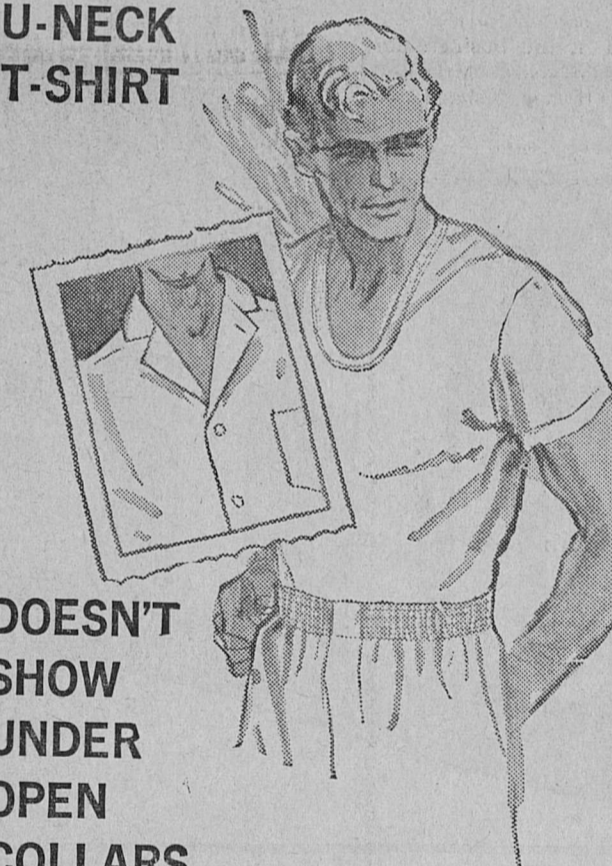

ber of the Rural Electrification System, back in 1938. He served as a member of the board of directors for four years.
A longtime peanut farmer, he was a member of the board of directors of Southwest Peanut Growers Assn. from 1941 to 1951.
The popular farmer also served as the first president of the Eastland County unit

of Texas Farm Bureau which was organized in this area back in the early 1950s.
Blackwell currently is serving as vice chairman of the three-member ASC group which meets every Tuesday morning at the unit's offices in the courthouse at Eastland.
Other members of the committee are R. G. Lyerla, Kokomo, chairman, and Garland Garrett of Pleasant Hill.
Workers in the ASC office, including Gilbert Meredith,

supervisor, are high in their praise of Blackwell and his long record of service to agriculture in Eastland County.
"His record," comments Meredith, represents a great deal of personal sacrifice and certainly most dedicated and devoted service.
"Over the years he has always been concerned about any farmer problem, no matter how small, and has been noted for his understanding and fairness. Whenever there

has been any doubt, he has given the farmer the benefit. "And most important," added Meredith, "is the efficiency and good judgment which he has shown as a member of the committee and the great confidence Eastland County farmers have in him both as an ASC committeeman and as a friend and neighbor."
Blackwell was born on an Eastland County farm 10 miles south of Ranger and is the son of Mrs. Jessie Blackwell

and the late Mr. Blackwell, who passed away in 1950. Mr. Blackwell was a merchant and Mrs. Blackwell now makes her home in Lubbock.

Two of their sons—Ray Blackwell of Vernon and Edward Blackwell of Friona—are employed by the Soil Conservation Service, U.S.D.A. Their other sons are Herman Blackwell of Arlington, an air

conditioning and sheet metal contractor, and Virgil Blackwell, serving with the U.S. Air Force and stationed at Webb Air Force Base, Big Spring.
The two daughters are Mrs. Maureen Eastland of Fort Worth and Mrs. JuneIce of Abilene.
The elder Blackwells also have seven grandchildren and are members of the Mesquite & Rusk St. Church of Christ in Ranger.

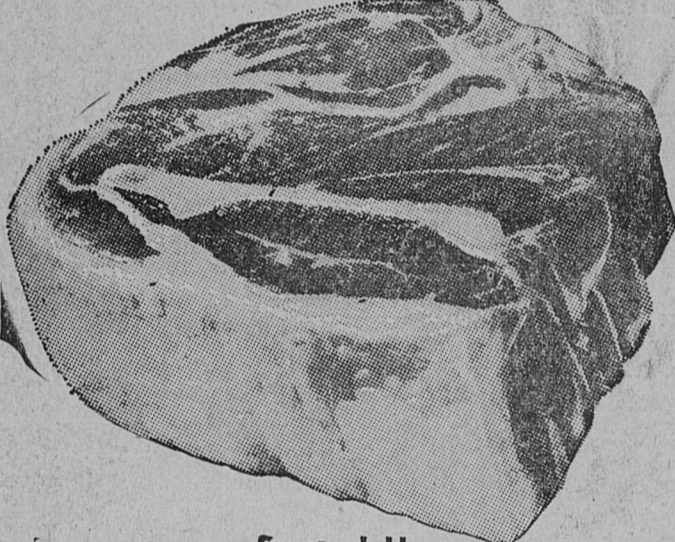

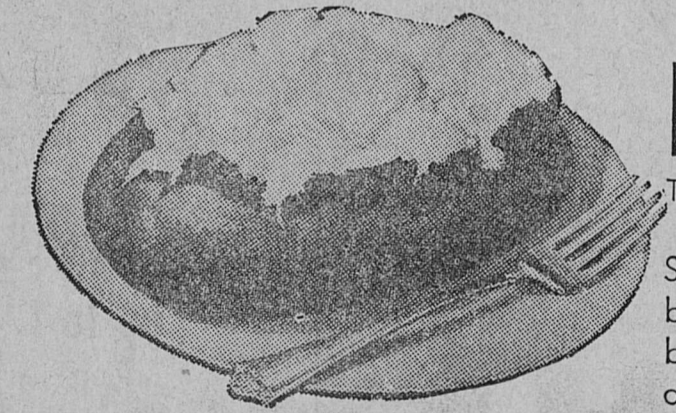
