1992 Wheat Acreage Reduction Set at 5 Percent

The U.S. Department of Agriculture is requiring a 5-percent acreage reduction for the 1992 Wheat Program, according to Jerry Harris, Chairman of the Texas State ASC Committee. This compares to the 15 percent acreage reduction required for the current

wheat crop. "This level was chosen to maintain competitiveness in world markets while balancing the risks of excessive supplies or possible shortages," Harris said.

will be eligible for target price protection at \$4.00 per bushel, the same as this year. Harris said the program will not have a paid land diversion.

The 1991/92 wheat crop is projected at 2.0 billion bushels, down 26 percent from last year's 2.7 billion-bushel harvest. The decline reflects an 8-million-acre reduction in planted area and lower yields. "This year, decisions to plant fewer acres were based on higher acreage reduction requirements, new flexibility provisions in the 1990 farm legislation, and lower wheat prices," the ASCS official said.

RAINS BRING RELIEF OVER WEEKEND

Scattered rains brought relief from the July heat last weekend. Maybe these rains weren't exactly drouth-breakers, but they helped dry-land peanuts, grass on the ranchers and hayfields. Most places in the county got some rainfall, with the Lake Cisco and Gorman areas showing totals of around 3 inches.

By Friday around 3:15 p.m. clouds rolled into the county from the southwest. Heavy downpours hit Cisco and West of Eastland "like a wall of water," one resident said.

A number of motorists caught on Highway 80 west of Eastland had to pull to the side of the road until the rain passed. There was some wind in the cloud but no hail.

Cisco and the Cisco Lake area got an inch or more in that rain. Eastland did not get as much, and the rain stopped abruptly about 4 day, 1.50 in area at other miles south of I-20.

Rainfall totals around the county through Sunday were:

Cisco: 2.25 to 3 inches. More than 3 northeast of town. The Pump Station at Lake Cisco caught 3 inches, and the Lake rose about 3 in. Lake Cisco has been holding its own quite well this summer, with no noticable drop.

Carbon: Around 2.50 in. Eastland: 1.25 inches.

Eastland Water Supply Dist. Pump Station: .40 on an inch. Rain was also light at Lake Leon but the Lake is full.

Ranger: West of town, .75 on the west side of town. About .20 of this came Sunday.

Rising Star: 1.50-2 in. in the town and vicinity. Gorman: 2 inches Suntimes.

College Students Must Meet Requirements of the TASP

AUSTIN, July 29, 1991 - College students who hav not met requirements of the Texas Academic Skills Program (TASP) can begin registering today for an additional summertime administra tion of the TASP Test./

August 17 will be the last time students can take the test before the fall semester begins.

This additional date was authorized by the Texas Higher Education Coordianting Board to provide another opportunity for students to meet TASP requirements and continue their college education. State law requires students to pass all sections of the test before enrolling in upper division courses beyond 60 semester credit hours.

"We want to allow students every reasonable chance to meet the requirements of this important educational program," said Kenneth H. Ashworth, commissioner of higher education. "We want students to have the skills they need to get everything they can out of their college experience."

The TASP Test is required of all students entering Texas public colleges and universities.

tions identify students needing additional help in reading, mathematics, and writing to do collegelevel work. Students can register for the Aug. 17 administration of the test only by calling 1-512-926-8746 between 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. on July 30, 31 and

August 1, 2, 5, 6, and 7.

The test will be offered at six sites: El Paso Community College; Texas Tech University, Lubbock; Collin County Community College, Plano; Houston Community College; University of Texas at San Antonio; and University of Texas-Pan American.

Students must bring a money order for \$65 on the day of the test. They will also need a completed TASP registration form and two forms of identification, one of which has a photograph of the student.

Some students may qualify for waivers, available from the student financial aid office of the institution they plan to attend, to cover part of the cost of the test.

Test results will be mailed to the students on or about Sept. 7, 1991.

Lorena Bible, age 93, died Saturday, July 27, 1991 in Fort Worth.

Services were held at 3:00 p.m. Tuesday, July 30, 1991 at Garden Chapel. Burial was in Greenwood Memorial Park.

Mrs. Bible was 93 years old and had lived nearly 70 years in Cisco. She was born in Sipe Springs, Comanche County, on September 2, 1897. After completion of schooling in Sipe Springs, she at-Brantleytended Draughn Business College in Fort Worth and then became a secretary for the Sun Oil Company in Cisco. It was there that she met Homer A. Bible, a recently discharged veteran of World War I. They were married in her mother's home in Sipe Springs on June 28, 1920 and started married life in Cisco. There first home was in the 200 block of West Seventh Street. She was greatly devoted to her family and friends and was most interested in genealogy. Although she had lived in a nursing home in Fort Worth for the last three and one half years, she always considered Cisco her home.

HYPERACTIVITY MYTH

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Several experts agree that recent research seems to discount the popular myth that childhood hyperactivity is linked to consumption of sugar or sugar-sweetened foods.

The importance of proper research design, particularly the use of a placebo, was emphasized by Dr. Esther Wender, chief of behavioral pediatrics at Long Island Jewish Medical Center. Wender said there is a strong belief in the relationship between the food weingested and whatever we experience in the immediate aftermath. Since this belief is so powerful, a placebo is needed to help detect the real underlying reaction.

One controlled study conducted in 1984 targeted children whose parents reported that children had adverse reactions to sugar. This was a good method because the subjects who are most likely to show any type of reaction were selected.

Twenty-one children were given sucrose, glucose or a saccharin placebo, activity levels and performance were then measured.

Results indicated that motor activity decreased with sugar, both glucose and sucrose. It did not increase as predicted; it decreased, according to Wender.

After reviewing several other sugar/behavior studies, Dr. Wender and concluded that though parents and other caregivers report that children's behavior deteriorate soon after ingestion of sugar foods, under laboratory conditions such acute response is not

generally seen. Another Forum speaker who agreed with this assessment was Dr. Henry Anderson, who examined the issue of high intensity sweeteners and behavior. He said that sweetness is not in excess in our diet. It's not a bad thing. Educators have to put into perspective where the nutritive and non-nutritive sweeteners fit, and there's a place for both without confusing the public, according to Anderson.

The issue of high intensity sweeteners and behavior is essentially a nonissue as is sugar and hyperactivity issue, Anderson concluded. Other published research confirms the views of Wen-

der and Anderson.

Dr. Lee Rosen, Colorado State University, examined the effects of sugar on behavior of 45 preschool and elementary school children. The children consumed a breakfast that included a drink containing either sucrose or a placebo (aspartame). When activity levels and cognitive performance were measured and recorded, no association between sugar consumption and major changes in the children's behavior was found.

With a growing number of studies showing similar results, why do many parents and teachers seem to cling to the notion that sweetened foods adversely affect behavior? Rosen believes that parents might attribute their kids' activeness to sugar on holidays like Hallow-

een and Christmas. When in fact, children are more likely excited about the holiday. It also is important to properly define the problem, Rosen said. "Hyperactivity is such a catch-all category for kids' behavior. It's hard to specify who is hyperactive and what may cause it."
