Eastland City Meet Correction & Clarification...

Wording of an Eastland City Commission meeting report that appeared on the front page of the previous edition left incorrect impressions for which we apologize.

The following is a more accurate report of the meeting:

During a three and a half-hour meeting Monday night, commissioners discussed problems that have surfaced with the collection system. David Wilson was the successful bidder on laying sewer pipe to the location of a new wastewater treatment plant that is almost operational.

Wilson, project engineer Billy Jacobs and Eastland National Bank representatives attended the executive session.

From the official minutes:

Commissioner Stephen Barry made a motion to instruct the interim City Attorney Tommy Warford to investigate any lawful claims which may have been filed

with the bonding company and to determine the status of such claims, and for Billy Jacob as the project engineer to examine the work to be completed on the punch list and to ascertain the estimated cost of such work and for said City Engineer to meet with the contractor and effected property owners to attempt to satisfy work requirements of the contract. Commissioner Stephen Barry also moved that upon execution of a properly drawn "affidavit of bills paid" by the contractor, and upon approval of the interim City Attorney Tommy Warford, and Project

Engineer Billy Jacob. After approval City Manager Paul Catoe is hereby authorized to make joint payment to the contractor, David Wilson and the Eastland National Bank in the amount of \$46,678.68. The motion was seconded by Commissioner James Fullen. The motion was voted on and the motion carried."

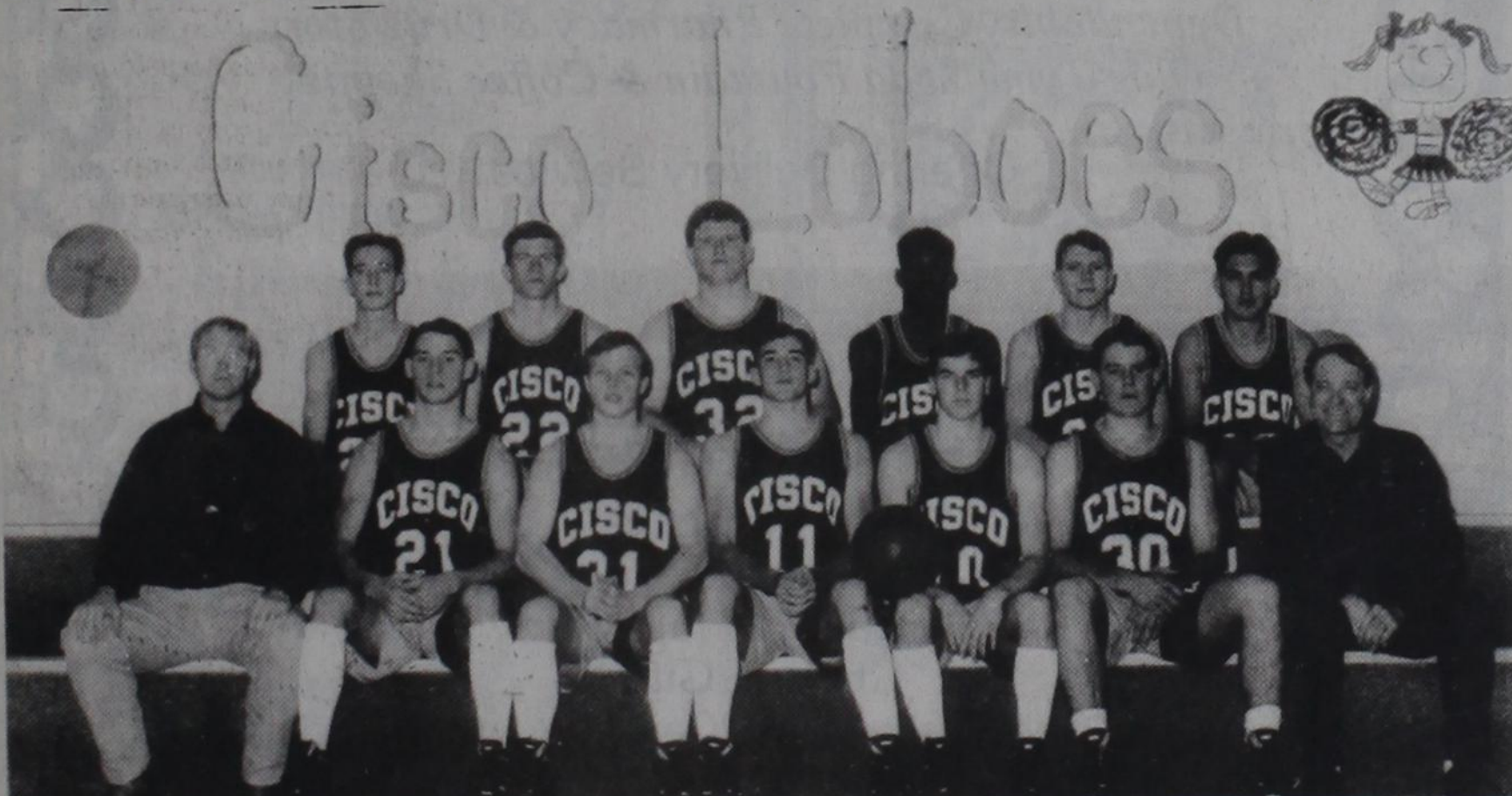
These registration packets must be completed and returned in the pre-addressed envelope and must be received in Iowa City, Iowa, no later than 5:00 p.m., February 14, 1995.

Grab your hat, Lobo fans, and get ready to go. The Looboes are headed for the 1995 State Basketball Play-offs for the second consecutive year.

The win over the Baird Bears, 65-49, secured the Looboes one of the two top spots in District 8-2A which means their season definitely will not end next Friday with the last scheduled game against Dublin. Should the Looboes

March 8 Deadline For Disaster Applications

On May 29, 1994 there were agricultural damages across a wide area of North Central Texas - due to a tornado, hail and rain.

In addition to Callahan County, seven other counties are named as contiguous counties, where eligible family farmers may qualify for FmHA EM physical loss loan assistance, pursuant to the provisions of the Emergency Agricultural Credit Act of 1984.

The contiguous counties include Eastland, also Brown, Coleman, Jones,

Shackelford, Stephens and Taylor.

EM loan applications will be received through March 8, 1995 for physical losses: and applications pending on that date may be processed and completed.

The loans may be made to any applicant with a qualifying physical loss in the counties named. This approval is limited to applicants who suffered severe physical losses only, in accordance with the provisions of FmHA Instruction.

In Eastland County the FmHA representative will be at an office in the Agricultural Service Center, Pogue Park, East Highway 80, Eastland each Wednesday from 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. An application may be made at that time.

Or, persons wishing to discuss the disaster loans or set up an appointment may call the FHA office in Comanche at (915) 356-5225.

Cynthia Kruger is in charge of the office at Comanche.

State And White House To Hold Conferences On Aging

The year 1995 will probably be known for its various conferences on aging. There will be many discussions and probably some decisions from these meetings, which will involve thousands of people.

This first week in February there are conferences around the state. Then March 27-28 there will be a Regional Conference at the Dallas Parkway Hilton.

The delegates will be narrowed down to a group from each state, and early in May they will attend a White House Conference on Aging.

The White House Conferences, which bring together thousands of delegates from around the nation, have traditionally served to help the Nation focus anew on the special needs and contributions of the aging population.

The first White House Conference on Aging was in 1950, after President Harry Truman directed the Federal Security Agency to hold a national conference on the elderly. The 816 citizens who were delegates took no action as a body, but

developed recommendations that became the first guidelines for national action.

This conference was followed in 1952 by the Conference of State Councils and Federal Agencies, and another such Conference in 1956. Then President Dwight D. Eisenhower called a White House Conference on Aging. It was held on Jan. 9-12, 1961 with 2,800 delegates in attendance.

Many of the proposed recommendations were implemented during the early or middle years of the 1960's. Among them were Medicare and Medicaid; increased Social Security benefits, and the Older Americans Act.

In 1971 there was another White House Conference on Aging. The Conference produced a total of 710 proposed recommendations for policy initiatives and changes. The most recent White House Conference on Aging was held in 1981. During the two-year process leading to the National Conference, more than 9,500 community forums were reported, with a total number of participants exceeding 390,000.

The 1981 conference became something of a political background, but did help to fend off cuts in Social Security. Every conference in

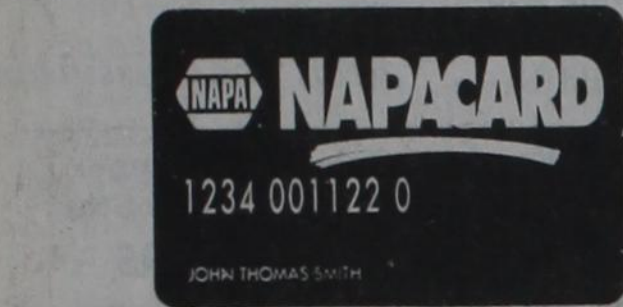

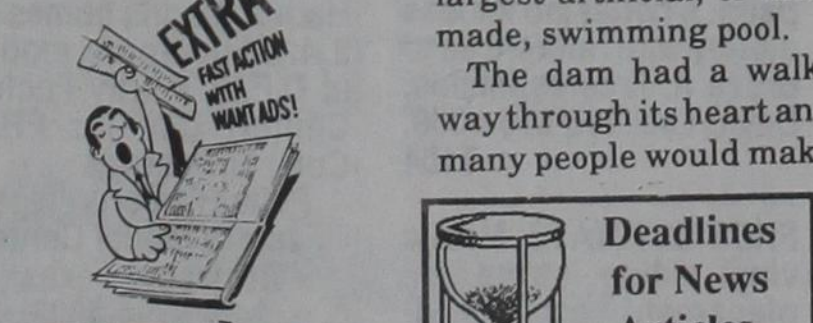

There was no sound system to carry the speaker's voice to the people, but some of these politicians then had voices like a bull frog after a good rain and they did not really need it. I remember one time years ago when James E. Ferguson, who liked to be called Farmer Jim, came to town on a train, rode a hay-loaded wagon to the courthouse square and spoke to a large crowd on the south side of the courthouse square. His voice carried so well that he could easily be heard a block away. He was speaking in the interest of his wife's, Mrs. (M.A.) Ferguson, candidacy for governor.

Another interesting thing about Lake Cisco swimming pool was the bathroom. It was a two story affair with large facilities on the ground floor. Upstairs was a huge skating rink or dance floor. It was used interchangeably over the years. At that time some of the leading dance bands of that area would play for the dancing crowd.

I don't think that Lawrence Welk ever played at Lake Cisco. However, he was stranded for several months during the depression at Abilene and I am almost certain that he had a son who was born while Welk was in Abilene. Cisco at that time had a local dance band that was just about as good as any of them. It was known as Ray Judia and his Orchestra. Ray was a local boy whose father had a movie house on the Main Street in Cisco. The building used to have an imprint in it still there.

Ray told me that his first training or taking an interest in music was from an old player piano that his father had in the theater. In the days before sound pictures the movie industry used to send out a roll of music that was to accompany the movie. Ray told me he learned his first piece by following the keys on this player piano until he had it memorized. The player piano was something in itself and as the roll of music was played, the keyboard activated with no one around it.

I understand that Mrs. LaRue Bousard in Eastland still owns one of these player pianos. In my discussion of the old tennis club that used to be out behind my home in Connellee Park. I mentioned that they had a player piano there. At one time making rolls of music for these pianos was a pretty big business. And one of the leaders in this business was a firm by the name of Wurlitzer. This company is still in business. I think at one time it must have made half of the jukeboxes in existence. Everywhere one went it seemed that the music was on a Wurlitzer.

The bathroom building at Lake Cisco was still standing until it burned several years ago, but long after the swimming hole was moved to town. The only fireplug to the building was in the side of the building and when they tried to get to it, it was too hot to handle. The building burned to the ground. The last time I remember talking with Ray Judia, I was then the district clerk of this county. He had been called in for juror service but was excused from duty at that time. I asked him in our conversation if he ever worked for Lawrence Welk when he was in this area. He said, "Joe turn that around. When he was in Abilene and I had good date that paid a pretty good fee for our services I sometimes hired him to play an accordion. The going fee then for a one night stand for a musician was \$5.00." Fortunately for all of us Mr. Welk went on to see better days.

Pharmacy Topics

Some healthy, nonsmoking women are now staying on birth control pills into menopause, getting an early start on hormone replacement therapy. It takes a blood test to discover when the patient is actually in menopause, say doctors at UCLA; hormone dose is cut then.

Combination therapy - AZT plus acyclovir - helps AIDS patients live longer than AZT alone, Johns Hopkins researchers found.

A mental stress test may be as telling as a treadmill test, say doctors at Duke University Medical Center. Both increase heart rate but mental stress also causes blood vessels in the heart to constrict.

Women who gain weight at about age 30 may be more at risk for breast cancer later, the American Society of Clinical Oncology heard. Every 10 pounds gained seemed to boost the risk by 23 percent.

A widely used heart drug - nifedipine, or Procardia - can delay or eliminate the need for surgery in some people with leaky heart valves, Italian doctors reported in *The New England Journal of Medicine*.

Labor-intensive products that are treasures of fine wood work, they are concrete proof that with imagination, skill and devotion, great things can be produced from humble materials.

These are made from the humblest, and often most-hated, of wood, the West Texas mesquite, which exists in bounty and is often considered the plague of landowners who work hard to control or eradicate it.

ent persona. Once shaped, they are repeatedly sanded, polished, then with the application of gun-stock oils and other preservatives, the once-detested chunk of wood becomes a handcarved mini-masterpiece.

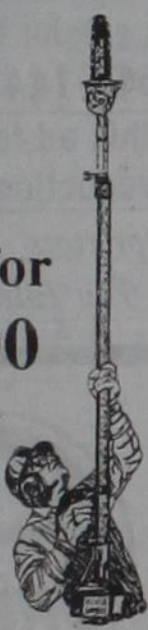

 To those 2 officers all I can say is that Buck still considers both of you as his friends and good officers. All he asked from either one of you was to keep the patrol car clean (it will probably be the only new car you'll have) and to keep the maintenance up on it. He knew that if ya'll went to a bigger Dept. later on in your career, a clean car would be expected, a filthy car would not be tolerated. He was just trying to prepare you for later on. I guess you thought he was picking on you. He just wanted you to appreciate what you had and to be proud of it.
 As for the Chief, we knew that the time was near for Buck to be re-
