FISHING OUTDOORS

The crappie fishing at Leon can only be judged as fair this year. Unless you're Roy Haley of Olden. This week around 12:30 at night Mr. Haley caught a near record largemouth bass at Lake Leon. An eleven pound giant was a mere 69 hundredths behind the current lake record caught by Allen Thomas of Leon 11-12-91, 11.69 pounds.

Composing the two fish shows us the weight a bass can put on for spawning. Allen's fish was caught in

the fall and was 26.00 inches long, weighing 11.69. Roy's fish was 24,000 inches and weighed 11 pounds. A full 2 inches shorter yet within ounces of the record.

Congratulations to Mr. Haley for an excellent catch using light crappie tackle and a minnow.

Leon still does not have official registered lake records for any other species of fish except largemouth bass. The Leon River does have a 55.00 pound blue catfish record by John Evridge caught 5-2-92. I do have the proper forms for filing these entries. The most important factor is to have the fish weighed on current state certified scales. If I can help anyone get this done on any species at Leon please feel free to give me a call, Terry Wilson.

Mineral Wells - Breeding chronology research conducted by Texas Parks and Wildlife Department biologists has shown the average date of conception by doe deer in the Cross Timbers region of

Texas to be mid-November.

The research, conducted from 1992-94, was designed to determine exactly when whitetail does are bred during the fall breeding season. It was part of a comprehensive statewide effort to answer questions related to the timing of breeding activity.

The Cross Timbers region, which encompasses about 11 percent of the state's land area, is located roughly between Gainesville, Wichita Falls, Brownwood and Waco in North and Central Texas.

The average date of conception by does in the northern portion of the Cross Timbers (between I-20 and the Red River) is Nov. 15. The southern portion of the region (the northern Hill Country) has an average conception date of Nov. 17, said Jim Dillard, TPWD biologist in Mineral Wells. Breeding dates ranged from as early as Oct. 13 to as late as Dec. 17.

"This range of dates generally will encompass

Souvenirs Of Love

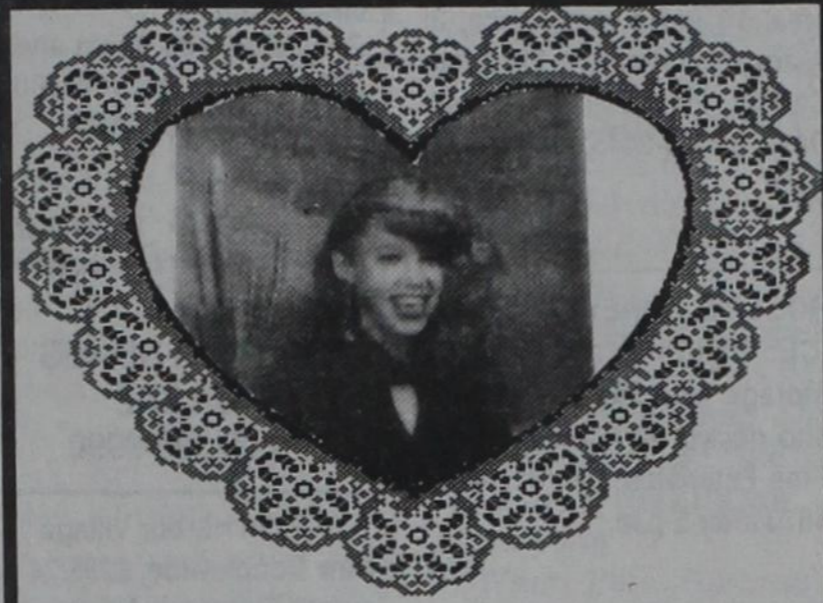

The invention of a camera introduced the best souvenir - a snapshot of the person one loves.

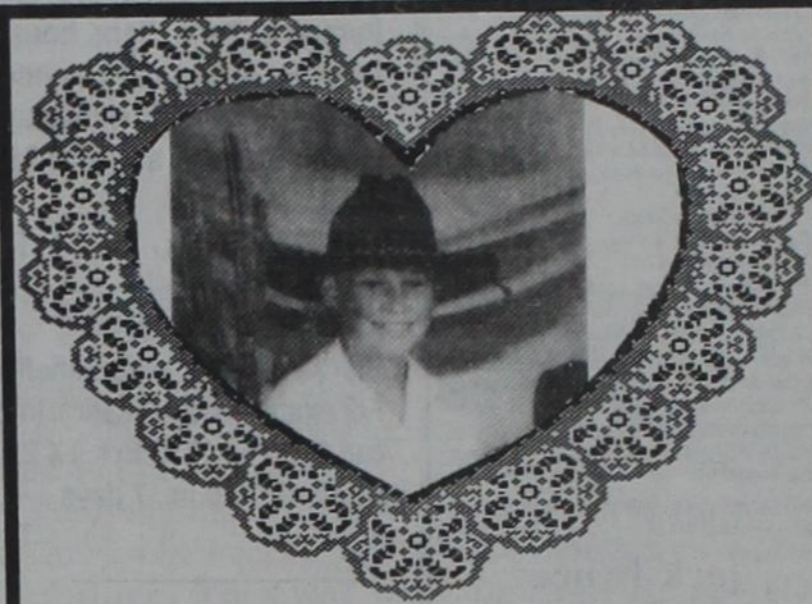

Texas Peanut Farmers Host Forum

Texas peanut farmers are encouraged to attend one of five regional meetings across the state to discuss the Texas peanut industry and the future of the federal peanut program.

Sponsored by the Texas Peanut Producers Board and the Texas Peanut Growers Association, the meetings start at 10 a.m. with discussions on the peanut program and changes recommended by peanut growers around the country. The afternoon forum will give Texas growers the opportunity to discuss and recommend changes to improve the peanut segment of the 1995 Farm Bill.

Clifton Stacy, chairman of the TPPB, said, "We need grassroots involvement of our Texas growers. Our Washington lawmakers want to hear the voice of the farmer." Stacy says Texas is the nation's number two peanut producing state and growers must work in unity to preserve the peanut program.

The Texas Peanut Growers Association will summarize the recommendations of the growers at each meeting and submit this information to key grower leaders and Washington lawmakers.



NATIONAL ARCHIVES SOUTHWEST REGION, located at 501 W. Felix in Fort Worth has microfilm publications available for genealogical and historical research. Hours for the National Archives - Southwest Region are: Monday - Friday, 8 am - 4 pm.

Many microfilm publications may be purchased. Microfilm beginning with an "M" or "T" can only be purchased from the: National Archives, Publication Sales Branch, Washington, DC 20408 (1-800-234-8861) for \$23 per roll. Microfilm beginning with "7RA" may be purchased for \$10 per roll by writing to: Director, National Archives - Southwest Region, P.O. Box 6216, Fort Worth, TX 76115. The telephone number is (817-334-5525).

Description pamphlets are available from the

main National Archives (Washington) for most microfilm publications beginning with an "M". When you know the publication number, i.e. under the heading of PASSENGER LISTS, INDEXES, and Related Records, the publication: M-334 - Supplemental Index to Passenger Lists of Vessels Arriving at Atlantic and Gulf Coast Ports (Excluding New

York), 1820-74. Description pamphlets can be very helpful in determining the roll/rolls most needed for your research and may be ordered from the National Archives (in Washington) by calling 1-800-234-8861 and giving the "M" publication number. Also when you call, you should ask what other publications they have for the researcher. Some are free and others are available for a small cost.

Other headings for microfilm publications (some include "M" numbers) are: RECORDS RELATING TO MILITARY SERVICE. These include General Records, Revolutionary War, War of 1812; INDEXES AND COMPILED SERVICE RECORDS OF VOLUN-

TEERS. This group includes Compiled Service Records of Volunteer Soldiers Who Served from 1784 to 1811, War of 1812, Indian Wars and Disturbances, 1815-58, Creek War, 1836-37, Florida War, 1835-42, Cherokee Removal, 1836-39, Patriot War, 1838-39, Mexican War, War With Spain, Civil War, Union, Civil War, Confederate; MISCELLANEOUS MILITARY RECORDS; RECORDS RELATING TO LAND; INTERNAL REVENUE ASSESSMENT LISTS; RECORDS OF APPLICATION AND RECOMMENDATION DURING THE ADMINISTRATION OF - These letters for appointment to federal office, 1797-1869,

are arranged by presidential administration and thereunder alphabetically by surname of the applicant or person recommended. The applications are mainly for Department of State positions or foreign service. Many of the letters are from or about persons prominent in the affairs of the country. (rolls listed take in the presidential terms John Adams, 1797-1801 through Lincoln and Johnson, 1861-69); OTHER STATE DEPARTMENT RECORDS; FEDERAL POPULATION CENSUSES; MORTALITY SCHEDULES; and OTHER CENSUSES.

Remember these are subject headings. Some have many publications, others only a few, but also each publication has individual rolls of microfilm, and again some have many rolls, some may only have one roll. All the preceding are available at the Southwest Region for research by viewing. A continuation of available records will be published in the next column.

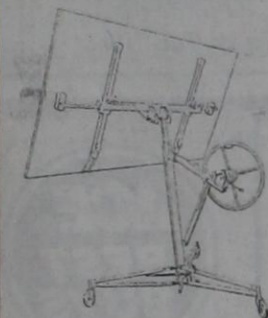
