HUMOR? IT comes in all varieties It varies. What may seem humorous to one, falls flat to another. Consider: you are in a packed Wally-World Discount Center, and suddenly you hear over the public address system: "I NEED A PRICE CHECK ON THE PEPTO DIARRHEA REMEDY ... FAST!" Would you giggle to yourself? Consider the poor customer standing at at the check-out counter; bet his head is bowed and he is wishing that he were somewhere else. Or:

Think about the wigged forefathers laboring over the first rough drafts: "Us folks of the United States," "We the Really Ticked-Off People, " "Yo, tax this, " "We Be Independent, " and "Declaration of Independence, We, the Un-British, " etc., etc. Or:

A typical board meeting, with a dagger lying on the table in front of each director, and the President says: legal department recommends a change in traditional board meeting procedure. From now on, you have to stab yourself in the back."

Do you find these funny? If not, then the new cartoon book entitled The Non Sequitur, Survival Guide For The Nineties" is probably not your cup of tea. If so, then the book is lift for a gloomy day.

Since it debuted in 1992, Non Sequitur has become one of the fastest rising comic strips in the United States. In fact, after only 11 months of syndication, national Cartoonists Society dubbed it the Best Newspaper Comic Strip of the Year -- the first strip in the 48-year history of the award to win in its first year of syndication. Now Non Sequitur fans can curl up with "The Non Sequitur Survival Guide by Wiley (Andrews and McMeel, \$9.95) for humor that is witty, urbane and truly off the wall.

Consider Non Sequitur's comment on those irritating voice systems: "You have reached the fire department voice mail. For an emergency, press 1, For a really important emergency, press 2. For a really, really important..."

Or the strip that interprets corporate downsizing by gathering a bunch of suited men at one end of a long hall while a guy flings a bowling ball in their direction. "How to tell when your employer has become accustomed to layoffs."

Non Sequitur cartoonist Wiley has created a comic that jabs at the feats and foibles of modern daily life. Named Non Sequitur because one strip has nothing to do with another, the cartoon features no central character or theme, no setting or time frame, just a "Twilight Zone" of cartoon moments. It's simply the creator's jocular view of everyday situations exaggerated to the funny bone. The cartoon appears in more than 200 newspapers. Webster defines the term: an irrelevant conclusion, lack of relevance, and it does not follow.

HUMOR FROM what seems like another planet is in one of our personal keepsake books, put out by Ramdom House in 1971, entitled A Century of College Humor, "a collection of cartoons, stories, poems, jokes and assorted foolishness from over 95 campus magazines." Wow! From the 1800s through the '60s, cream of made students laugh then and now.

What made 'em laugh then? Man leaves his umbrella with this note attached: "This belongs to a man who strikes a 200 lb. blow. Will return in five minutes." He returns to find this note where his umbrella had been: "Taken by man who walks eight miles an hour. Will not return."

Among such classics as the inevitable "editing of the Gettysburg Address," there are examples of the bad, good and the corn, but all for fun. A comment to the Lone Ranger: "If ye ain't an outlaw, how come ye wear that mask?" A photo of the Pope with uplifted arms and this caption: "Give me a G"...This behind-the-curtain cue to an on-stage Hamlet "Psst!...or not to be!"...A Texas Cowboy at a confessional: "I forgot the Alamo!" Cartoon toga-ed ancients, with this caption: "Governor, disa my boy Mario. He lika work for da State next summer. O.K.?"

Commission Standardizes Bass Limits, Adopts Other Regs

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission adopted a plan today to standardize almost all largemouth bass bag limits as well as other inland and coastal fisheries regulations for 1995-96.

A proposal also was approved, in response to the public's request, to create an exempt red drum tag for a nominal fee, enabling exempt fishermen (those under 17 years old or 65 and older) a chance to take a trophy red drum. The fee will be set at a later date. Currently, the red drum tag which allows retention of one red drum longer than 28 inches per license year - is part of the resident fishing, combination, resident special and nonresident fishing licenses.

The exempt tag will have the same benefits and restrictions as the current red drum tag. Once the exempt tag is used, the angler can return it to the department and receive a bonus tag as with the regular license.

In inland waters, the commission standardized the largemouth bass daily bag limit at five for all length limit exceptions (except catch and release lakes and Toledo Bend). The lakes with catch and release only for bass include Lost Maples State Natural Area, Nelson Park in Abilene, Buck Lake in South Llano River State Park, Purtis Creek State Park and Gibbons Creek. Toledo Bend Reservoir has an eight fish daily bag limit.

The regulation also changes the largemouth bass bag limit on reservoirs with 18-inch minimum length limits and slot length limits (14 to 18, 14 to 21 and 14 to 24) from three fish per day to five. The bag restriction of only one bass 21 or 24 inches or longer on the 14- to 21-inch and 14- to 24-inch slot lakes will remain in effect.

Another change from the original proposal includes an exemption for persons shrimping under a commercial bait shrimp license from the provision requiring the nongame finfish portion of the trawl catch not to exceed 50 percent by weight of the total trawl catch, except for those species regulated by bag and size limits.

After public comments and a staff recommendation, commissioners changed the original proposed dates of the exemption to be from June 15 -Aug. 14 rather than the proposed dates of July 1-Aug. 31. The rule allows up to 1,200 live nongame finfish not regulated by bag size limits to be retained.

Other regulations approved by the commission are:

Coastal Fisheries

· Changed the daily bag on snook from three to one, possession limit from six to two and minimum size from 20 inches to 24 inches.

Inland Fisheries

· Changed the largemouth bass minimum léngth limit on Braunig Reservoir from 21 inches to 18 inches. Daily bag increases from two to five.

· .Changed the large-

mouth bass minimum on Champion Creek Reservior from 14 inches to 16 inches. Daily bag remains

· Changed largemouth bass regulations on 90acre Lake in Choke Canyon State Park-Calliham Unit from catch and release to 14 inches and five fish daily bag.

· Changed striper limit on the Red River from Denison Dam to, and including, Shawnee Creek from 18 inches to no minimum length to conform to Oklahoma regulations. Daily bag remains at five.

· Changed white bass minimum on the Colorado River and its major tributaries from Lake Travis upstream to the U.S. Highway 190 bridge (includes lakes Travis, Marble, Falls, LBJ, Inks and Buchanan) and Georgetown and Canyon reserviors from 10 inches to 12 inches. Daily bag remains at 25.

· Changed the boundary for the 12-inch limit on white bass at Lake Limestone and the Navasota River from downstream of Lake Mexia to downstream of the Fort Parker State Park lake

· Changed statewide minimum on channel and blue catfish from 9 inches to 12 inches. Daily bag remains at 25, except in designated urban lakes and reservoirs wholly within state parks, which have a daily bag limit of

· Deleted exceptions to statewide channel and blue catfish regulations including those reservoirs with a 14-inch minimum and 15 daily bag, a 14inch minimum and five fish bag and a 12-inch minimum and three fish bag.

Changed statewide minimum length on flathead catfish from 24 inches to 18 inches. Daily bag remains at five. The one exception is Lake Texoma and the Red River from the Denison Dam to. and including, Shawnee Creek where the minimum limit is 20 inches to conform to Oklahoma regulations.

· Changed the crappie bag limit on Choke Canyon Reservior from 15 to the statewide bag of 25. Minimum length remains at 10 inches.

· Restricted angling on designated urban lakes to pole and line only.

· Added 4 lakes to the list of designated urban

 Changed the name from designated urban lakes to community fishing lakes to more closely

reflect the intent of the program.

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission moved the opening of the archery season up by one day and adopted several other changes in the 1995-96 hunting regulations during a public meeting today here.

The archery season for deer and turkeys, which normally opens Oct. 1, will open Sept. 30. Commissioners approved a change in the opening date after requests by bowhunters to open the season on Saturday instead of Sunday and department personnel approved the measure.

Other regulations approved by the commission, most of which are designed to provide additional hunting opportunity, are:

On March 1, 1995, a key rate inspection of Ranger was conducted the Commission on Fire Protection. Unit 221, the 1975 Fire Appliance of Texas, 500 gallon pumper failed to pass the required performance test. Necessary

repairs must be made on the pumper and it must pass the performance test before this pumper can be recognized. The test can be conducted by another accepted fire department and shall be by draft.

It is very important to the City of Ranger that the city have at least one required recognized pumper in order to remain in the "protected" status. This office must receive the passing test results within 90 days of receipt of this notice. Failure to comply, and we will have to recommend to the Texas Department Insurance that the city be placed in an "Unprotected" status.

Unit 220, the 1970 Chevrolet booster truck is 25 years old and cannot be recognized as a

booster at this time due to age. In order to be recognized, the supplier must provide written confirmation on the availability of parts. The list must contain availability of parts of the particular engine. transmission, drive train, brake system, and electrical system. Also, include a statement of engine and chassis year, make, model, etc.

NOTE: This information must be provided annually in order for this booster truck to continue to be recognized. The pump does not have to be tested on the booster.

This booster when recognized can also be recognized as a required hose truck if 1000 feet of 2 1/2 inch hose is carried. Please state in a letter if you carry this amount of hose.

All the necessary forms for the requested information and test requirements were given to you at the time of the key rate inspec-
