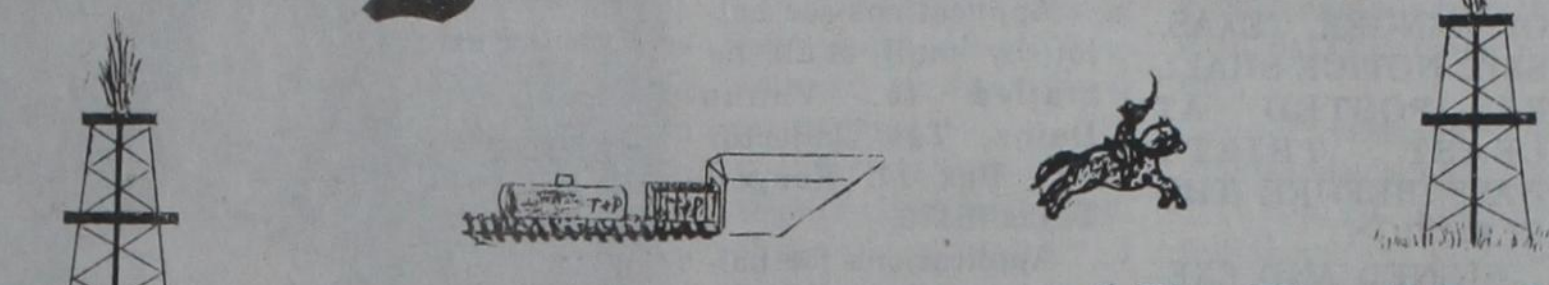

I urge every registered voter to get out and vote for the candidate of your choice on May 6, 1995.

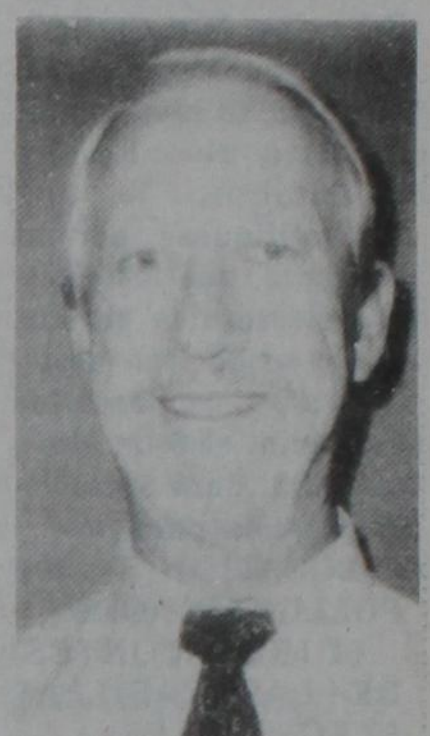

## M.D. Anderson Faculty And Staff Visit Eastland County For Polo On The Prairie

A number of noted physicians, scientists and staff members from The University of Texas M.D. Anderson Cancer Center in Houston are staying in Eastland this weekend en route to the 9th Annual Polo on the Prairie.

This year's polo matches, the proceeds of which benefit M.D. Anderson, are set for Saturday, April 22, at the Musselman Brothers Lazy 3 Ranch just 12 miles east of Albany. The M.D. Anderson group will be arriving in Eastland late Friday afternoon.

"Polo on the Prairie is not only an important fund-raiser for cancer research, education and community outreach programs, but it also gives these dedicated cancer physicians and scientists a break from big city living," said Mary Anne McCloud, Eastland's co-chair of Polo on the Prairie. "These dedicated people from M.D. Anderson really look forward to coming out to West Texas — some of these doctors having been attending our polo festivities for years."

Dr. Charles A. LeMaistre, president of M.D. Anderson, is one such polo enthusiast. He has been coming to Polo on the Prairie since it began in 1987.

Dr. LeMaistre has guided the direction of M.D. Anderson Cancer Center as president since 1978. He is an internationally-known authority on issues related to smoking and the theoretical and practical bases for cancer prevention. During a remarkable 40-year career, Dr. LeMaistre has become recognized as a national leader through his major accomplishments in medicine, higher education and public policy. In June, the American Medical Association will present Dr. LeMaistre with its coveted Distinguished Service Award.

## Eastland Cleanup Efforts Continue

Eastland City Commissioners last Monday night discussed efforts to clean up the town. Reports indicated that most citizens were responding, but that stronger ordinances were needed for the few who did not cooperate.

There seemed to be a few trouble spots, such as junked cars and several burned-out buildings.

Mayor C.W. Hoffmann said that the Cleanup project is especially geared for the School Homecoming, but is also an on-going effort to make the town more attractive to visitors and prospective businesses.

Police Chief Cecil Fundburgh explained the process of sending notices to offenders until a fine is assessed. He said that in some cases the City is willing to help a property owner clear brush and mow weeds, but the city has to pay for dumping the debris.

Mayor Hoffmann and others said that apparently stronger city codes were needed to bring offenders into compliance.

During the meeting Commissioners also heard Jane Jenkins of Denton explain the Main Street program, in which the downtown area could be restored and revitalized. She said this program is now being used

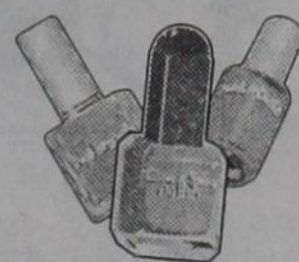

# FISHING OUTDOORS

O.H. Ivie has stayed in the news quite well the past two years and appears to be headed for true stardom. As most have heard by now the lake record was broken three times in one day.

The stocking of this jewel of West Texas began prior to the lakes completion. Farm ponds were stocked with Florida Bass in 1989. Beginning in 1990 after catching some water, an excellent program was initiated. In 1990, 495,845 bass, 1991, 1,921,226 bass, 1992, 50 adult bass, and Ivie also received stocking in 1993 and 1994 these numbers were not available.

Other species stocked by TP&WD officials included: Blue cats 386,891; Channel cats 390,436; Flathead cats 3,013; Smallmouth bass 120,802; White Crappie 306,299; Walleye 3,355,000 and Coppernose bluegill 332,548. These figures cover only up to 1992.

One of the premier guides at Lake O.H. Ivie is Ronnie Wipff of Champion Guide Service (915) 659-5481. Ronnie moved to San Angelo, TX in 1988 from Sonora, Texas. The ShareLunker program tied the all-time record for most lunkers in a season when Port Bolivar angler Bert Stinson loaned his 14.68-pound largemouth bass from Lake Fork to the program.

The fish ties the record of 30 entries in 1992.

Four lunkers from Lake Fork and two from Falcon Reservoir are the newest entries into the program, which accepts largemouth bass weighing more than 13 pounds. The program received 28 entries all of last year.

Lake Fork has produced 19 of the 30 fish entered into the program. Sam Rayburn and Falcon are next with three each, followed by Conroe, Gibbons Creek, Gladewater, Austin and a private lake near Goldthwaite with one each. In addition to Lake Fork, which always produces large bass, Falcon seems to be a hot lake this year. Falcon has contributed four lunkers to the program's history,

three this year.

\*Lake Fork - William Koch of Beaumont, 14.02 pounds, 27 inches long, 21-inch girth, caught 8:45 a.m., March 18 on a Suspending Rattlin' Rogue.

\*Falcon Reservoir - Bob Hunt of San Antonio, 13.67 pounds, 26 inches long, 20-inch girth, caught 6:30 p.m., March 18 on a black plastic lizard.

\*Lake Fork - Bert Stinson of Port Bolivar, 14.68 pounds, 25.75 inches long, 21-inch girth, caught 9:45 a.m., March 20 on a black/blue salt craw.

The ShareLunker program continues through April 30. Anglers lend their fish to the department for study and possible spawning. Entrants are given a fiberglass replica of their catch.

## CJC Board Of Regents
