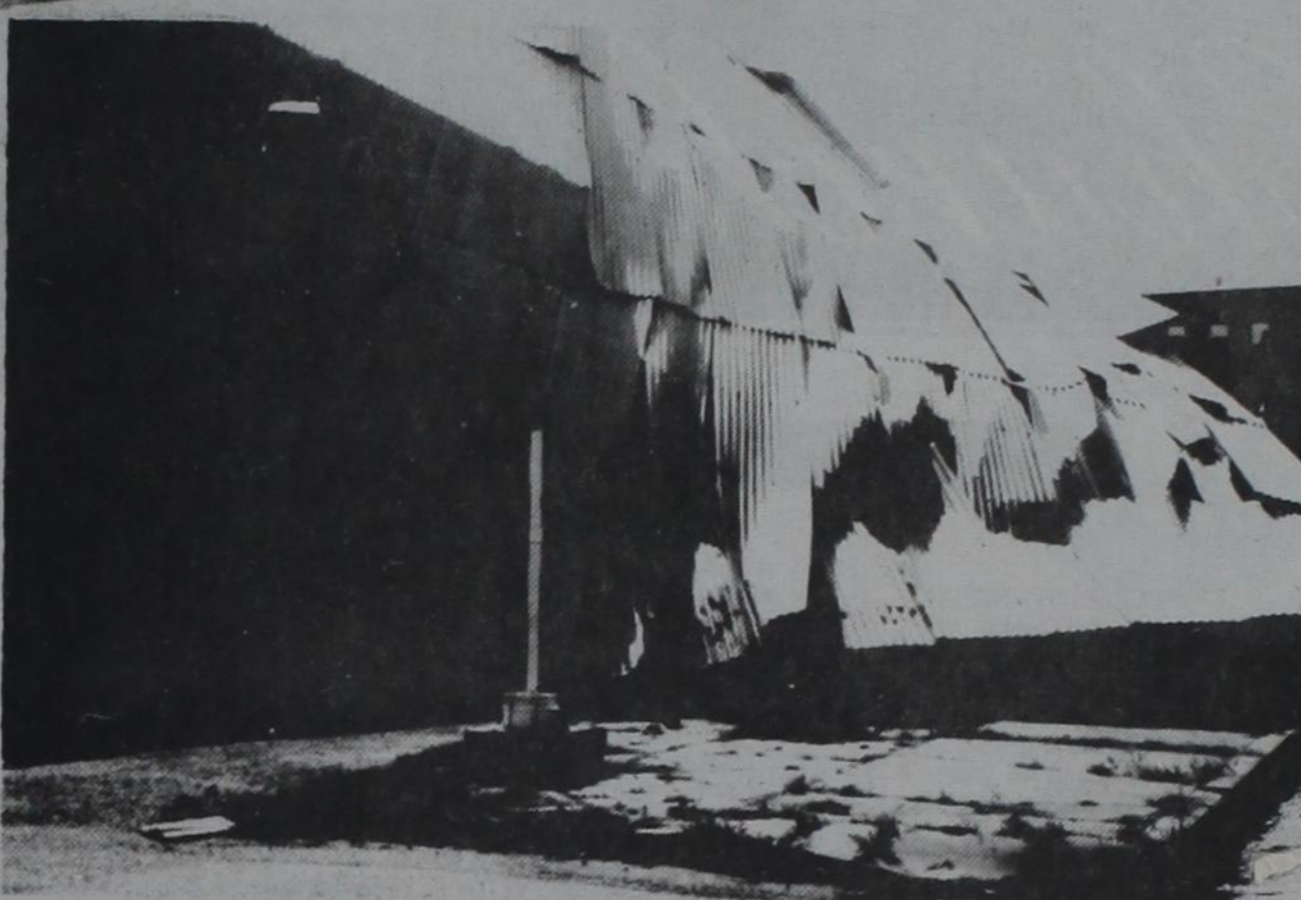
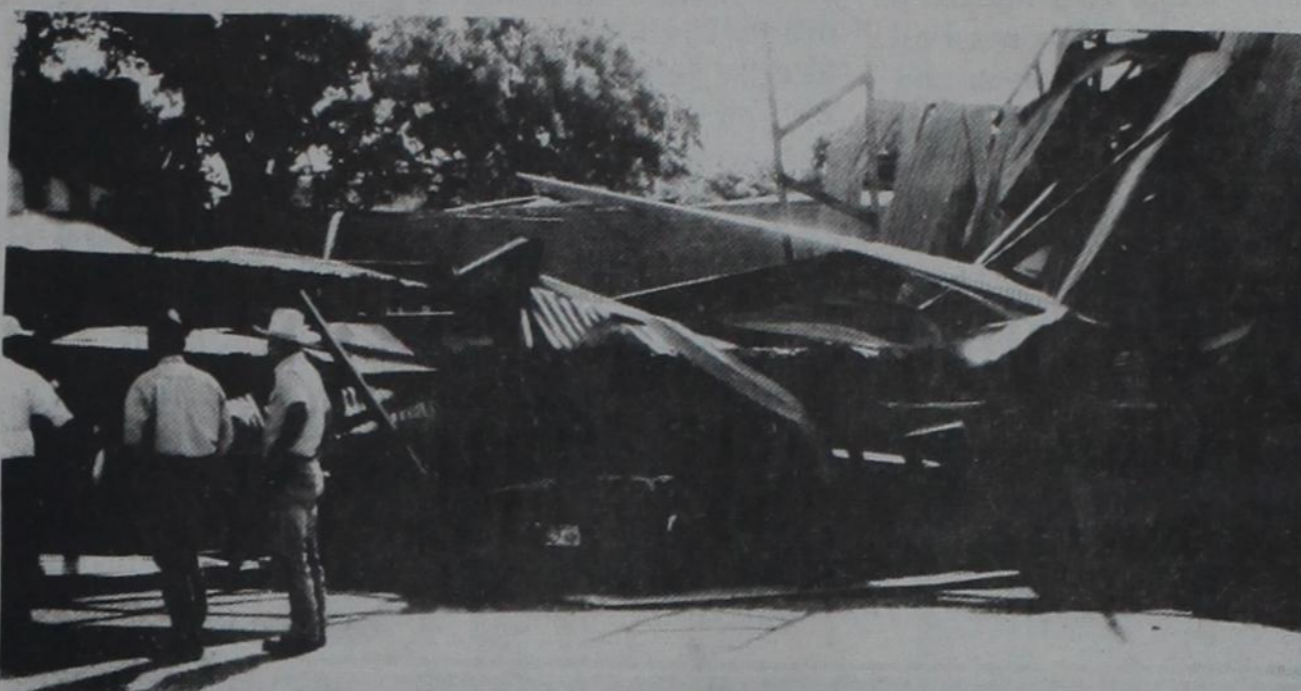

4 Abilenians Face Cisco Charges After Fracas

Annette Rashad and Jimmy B. Edmond, each about 30; 17-year old Clarence D. Hunter and a male juvenile, all from Abilene, now face charges in Cisco. Rashad, a former Cisco resident, was visiting in the housing area on the east side of Cisco, when Lynette Brown approached Rashad and asked her to return some items which belonged to a mutual friend. An argument followed, investigating officers report. Rashad allegedly went to the car she was riding in and got a gun. She then allegedly shot at Brown's

feet and left in the car. After driving around, Rashad returned and allegedly shot at Brown again, just missing her head, and then she sped away. But at the corner of East 9th St. and Humble, she rolled the car. Officer Larry Weikel approached the car in response to a call and the occupants got out. Occupants from the car allegedly attempted to flee west on 8th St. on foot, but were detained by officers Robert Rains and Don Wiley. Lt. Kenneth Preston directed the investigation, and Rashad was arrested

for aggravated assault with a deadly weapon. The juvenile was taken to the Abilene Juvenile Detention Center, and the two men were arrested for public intoxication. Brown was not injured.

Memorial Day: Time Out For Heroes

 Memorial Day is a time to honor our fallen heroes, especially those who have died in wars. But the 10th Anniversary of the May 24 train crossing disaster in Eastland has reminded me of another thing - that it is good to remember our living heroes also.

May 24, 1985 was a most unlikely day for a disaster - clear and bright, renewed by spring. As I drove into Eastland the main thought I had was a 10 a.m. appointment at the Eastland Telegram, 215 S. Seaman, with Joe Gray. Mr. Gray was to give some history on the Eastland Schools - material we wanted for the upcoming EHS Reunion. On time, I walked through the front door of the Telegram and spoke to Mr. Gray. But when we started toward my office there was a dull rumble toward the north of the building, and he said: "Sounds like there's been an accident or something." I shook my head: "Oh, they're probably just moving something around in the pressroom. There are all kinds of sounds around here on press day. I don't worry about them."

But about that time Duke Dixon and Terry Simmons - both employees of the newspa-

per - ran from the pressroom out the back door. "There's some sort of explosion in town!" They called. I hurried to the front door, where several of the newspaper people had gathered. Then I saw it - a monstrous thing that appeared to be a miniature atomic explosion. At the bottom was black smoke lit with red and orange fire.

The top was a spreading mushroom of black and gray. "The Exxon Storage tanks!" I cried. "This is a big one. Someone is bound to be hurt!" Then a siren howled, and a small fire truck raced from South Seaman north, like David going after Goliath. "They can't possibly do anything about a fire that large," I gasped. "They'll just get killed!"

A distant commotion seemed to envelope the area toward North Seaman Street. Soon it became obvious that the interview with Joe Gray would have to wait.

A call to the newspaper informed the Editor and Publisher, H. V. O'Brien, that a collision between a truck

and a Missouri Pacific train at the RR crossing on North Seaman had caused a number of tank cars to derail. So it wasn't an Exxon after all. There was a possibility of even more disastrous explosions, we understood, a portion of Eastland was being evacuated, including

Memorial Day They Close The Banks On Lee Fields' Birthday

"The longer I serve Him, the sweeter He grows..." - Gaither. His present congregation of one - himself - could be the toughest ministry of his long life. But it isn't.

It's true that Veteran Preacher Lee Fields often loses patience with himself for not being able to do the things he's always done for the Lord and others. It bothers him that he has to use three pieces of magnifying glass to be able to read his beloved Bible. It bothers him that he has to rely on two walking sticks to help support the worn-out legs that won't let him do all the things he used to do. He accepts all that. He only regrets the he didn't do more and can't do more for others today. And he's still got his remarkable sense of humor. He'll celebrate his 89th on May 30th, Memorial Day. "The banks always close for my birthday," he chuckles. There is no counting the number of lives that Lee Fields has affected posi-

tively, and he is remembered affectionately by the many he witnesses to, baptized, married, buried and comforted at times of loss. Sally and Jim Fields came from Tennessee to Carbon in 1905. Lee was born the next year. Later the young farm boy at age 15, alone with his dog in a pasture, surrendered himself to the Lord and felt almost immediately that more was expected of him. But he fought it. Times were hard. His father was not well. Work came first. Education, second. At 34 he was ordained a deacon on Sept. 29, 1940, at the First Baptist Church in Carbon. Lee first believed that took care of his commitment to the Lord. It didn't. He still wrestled with himself, knowing deep down that he was expected to preach. But how could a farmer/carpenter with limited education serve the Lord? He was shown and on Sept. 6, 1942, he was

the area where the newspaper was located.

So I crawled into my jeep pickup, feeling sort of guilty. I was supposed to be writing stories, yet I was leaving the action - while somewhere Duke Dixon and Terry Simmons were out risking their hides!

I decided to see if I could sneak around town and get back into the area around North Seaman. But I soon found I couldn't even get close.

People were pouring from the downtown area and Courthouse Square, some on foot, some trying to use vehicles. All roads were apparently blocked into the North Seaman Street vicinity, with only emergency personnel and vehicles moving through.

I caught glimpses of law officers headed into the thick of things, firemen, personnel coming in from Eastland, Cisco, Ranger and other places. Suddenly I realized how much all these people meant to the community.

It was that pallor of gray-black smoke above the scene that convinced me I didn't want to stay around long. It reminded me

too much of a Bible-story picture of the destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah!

Worse than that, it had an acrid smell - a hint of fumigation.

You need clean air to live, I decided. So I made my way out to the country, and the air never smelled sweeter. But I knew that while I relaxed at home in safety there were workers in Eastland risking everything to contain that fire, direct traffic, and care for the injured. I realized they were all very special people.

As the day wore on I learned, by telephone and radio, the extent of the disaster.

The tanker of propylene gas that exploded had blown up into the air. If it had blown sideways it would have probably set off a number of other derailed tank cars, including a hydrofluoric tank car beside it. As it was, the tanker that exploded did not burn itself out until about 3:15 p.m. Monday.

The hydrofluoric tank car was leaking, and that continued to pose a threat. A patch was finally welded onto it about 7 p.m. Saturday night, and

ordained to preach, and his long country ministry began in earnest.

"When I let go and let God take charge of my life, He did wonderful things," Lee says. "He didn't put eloquent words in my mouth, but He put the words that the folks I knew, needed to hear and

as long as I felt Him lead, He kept me from making a fool of myself."

Far from the marbled edifices and stained-glass temples, he served, always in the heart of where people were hurting for the word and pleading for ministering. Lee was there. At the bedside. At the graveside. At the sad times, the good times.

Typical of so many small church preachers, he was (and still is) the People Preacher. The man of kind words, encouragement, concern and Christian admonition.

The roll-call of his ministries is almanac-long and because memories are frail, hopelessly incomplete:

Pleasant Hill, Mitchell, Staff, Long Branch, Cook, Mangum, Olden, Downing, Odessa, Midway, Beatty, Calvary (Cisco), Ranger, Carbon, Gorman, Kansas City, Arizona, Tennessee.

In the Sesquicentennial year of 1986, Mangum Baptist Church presented him its coveted Love and Appreciation Award. He treasures the plaque today.

Somewhat like Paul the tent-maker, Lee was a skilled builder and is known for the quality and craftsmanship of the homes he's built, the cabinets he's installed and the other construction projects he's done. One man for whom he built a home, says of him, "You can tell him what you want, trust your billfold to him and you won't be disappointed."

Because he knew how small congregations struggle with finances, he pretty much paid his own way because he could and wanted to do this part in contributing. He was and is a giver, not a taker.

He's preached hundreds of revivals and many of these were back during the "protracted two-week" varieties which are virtually unknown today.

Lee suffered a sad, sad birthday in 1982 when Gene, his beloved wife of many years, died following a lengthy illness just hours before the May 30th date.

Limited physically, Lee today is still a fountain of positive witness. He wishes he could have done more. It hurts when he's asked to assist today and can't, but time has taken its toll.

He gloriously accepts one day at a time, and when he talks about the future, it's still his same important witness.

He will tell you that he is excited about what God has to offer, and he sure doesn't want any of his family and friends to be sad.

After his long and full life, Lee now looks forward to God's beautiful gift to him.

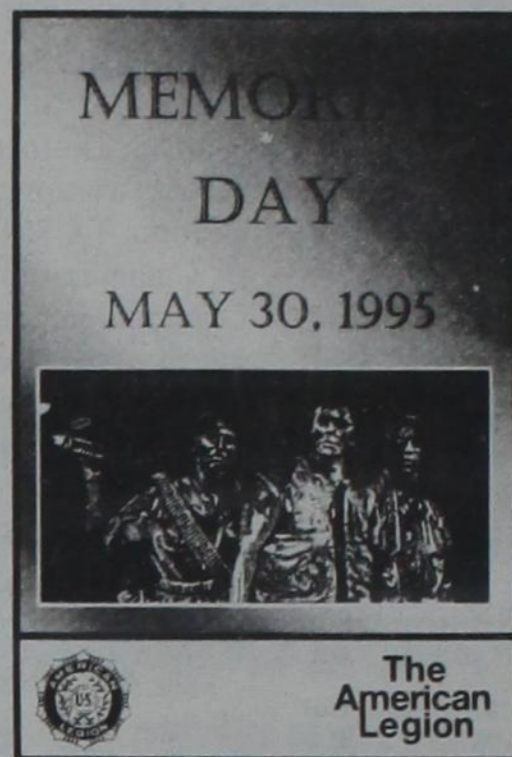

Breckenridge Air Show To Be Held May 27-28

A number of current U. S. military aircraft and the world's smallest jet will be part of the 18th Annual Breckenridge Air Show planned Saturday and Sunday, May 27-28, at Stephens County Airport, which is located two miles south of Breckenridge just east of Hwy 183.

A flying demonstration will be given this year by four F-16 Fighting Falcons. The Air Force's most successful multi-role jet the F-16 Fighting Falcon is often called the "Electric Jet" because of its computerized electronic flight controls. The Falcon is a little single-engine fighter-bomber with tremendous performance and eye-watering maneuverability. The high-performance Falcon is the U. S. Air Force's all-purpose bomber and low-level attack jet.

The Falcon is used for ground attack - day or night, aerial combat, and interception.

A Black Hawk Helicopter will be attending the show and a C-5 Hercules will make a fly-by during the show. Also scheduled to put in an appearance at the 1995 air show are: the

Bud Light Micro Jet, "the world's smallest jet," piloted by Bill Beardsley, of Pensacola, Florida; the P-38 "White Lightning," flown by Lefty Gardner; and, a B-17 Super Fortress which will be on static display and open for tours.

Breckenridge's own Howard Pardue will perform in his F-8-F Bearcat, as well as piloting a number of World War II (WWII)-vintage airplanes.

Special features of the air show include reenactments of famous World War II air battles.

The annual event, held each Memorial Day weekend, is sponsored by the Breckenridge Aviation Museum and the Breckenridge Chamber of Commerce. Although the actual air show will be held from 1 to 5 p.m., on Sunday, May 28, fly-ins and static displays of airplanes will be available for viewing by visitors and enthusiasts all day on Saturday, May 27, and during the morning hours on Sunday. Admission on either day will be \$6 for adults, with children under the age of five being admitted free of charge.

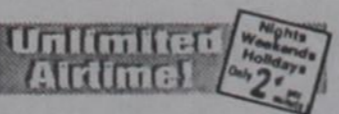

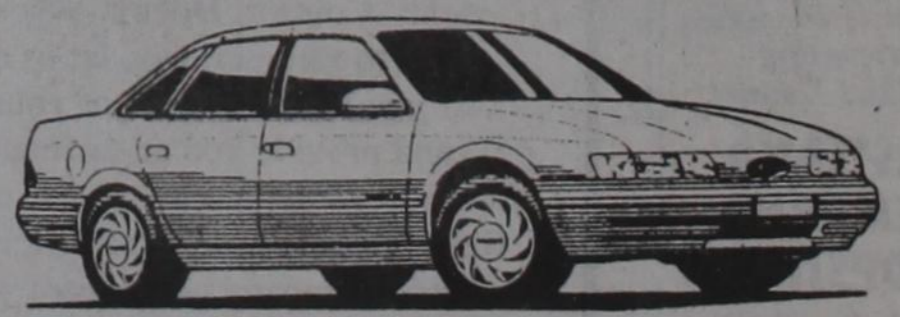

Agricultural Viewpoint

PECANS

Recent visits to pecan orchards indicate that the model designed to determine the first significant nut casebearer egg lay is right on target. As predicted, the lay occurred from May 22nd to 25th which in turn means that the hatch will occur from May 27th to June 1st. This is the optimum spray date for control of the nut casebearer.

For homeowners, you may use Malathion or a 50% Sevin liquid spray. Commercial

growers and homeowners may want to use B. T. products which are organic in nature. Commercial growers may also use Lorsban or other approved insecticides.

Inspection in orchards reveal a minimal nut set as compared to last year, so you may want to take steps to save what you have.

For details on control, contact the Extension Office at 629-1093.

COASTAL GRASS

Several growers have expressed con-

cerns about coastal grass that is beginning to head out. Certainly these concerns are warranted when we consider that grass protein begins to drop at this point. However, in the cases I have inspected in slight numbers when compared to the growth and upright shoots of the entire plant.

Before harvesting the grass, you must consider potential tonnage. Many of the acres in question were fertilized relatively late (in the past 2 weeks). Let's give the fertilizer time to catch up and benefit the grass and in turn harvest an amount (tonnage wise) that we can live with. If

we don't wait, then cost per bale of hay from the fertilizer standpoints will be astronomical.

All we really need is a good 2 inch rain and as this writing on Thursday, May 25th, we still have not received it. Hopefully, by the time you read this statement (2 inches of rain needed) it will be outdated.

Wait a minute - It's starting to RAIN out there!!!!

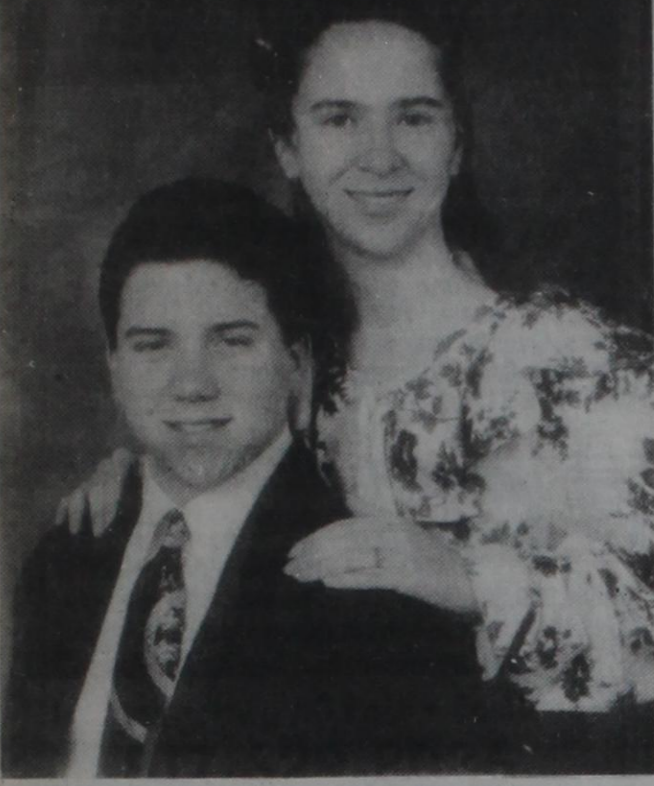

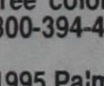

Unconvinced? Then I challenge those decisions on the basis of a single word. From, "the right of the people to own and bear arms shall not be abridged," I offer the word "OWN." Do National Guardsmen "own" their arms? Certainly not! Nor

can we find in the history of the World a government which felt the need to guarantee for itself "The right to own arms."

Clearly then, the Second Amendment was intended as a gun pointed at the heads of any with the intent to oppress. If that sounds like bloodshed then so be it for the revolution that brought about the USA was indeed bloody.

Cartoonists have fun as do some columnists with wise cracks about "Grown men playing soldier in the woods like little boys." But let us consider that most of those men in citizen militia were in service and smelling the smoke of real battle while those media

types were not. If as Jefferson said, "The tree of liberty must often be watered with blood," then are American today willing to risk their blood or do they sell out for "security."

The War Powers Act and Executive Orders are used in negation of the Constitution and should be done away with, if not by legislation then by the shedding of blood. In the words of Patrick Henry, "If this be treason then let them make the most of it!"

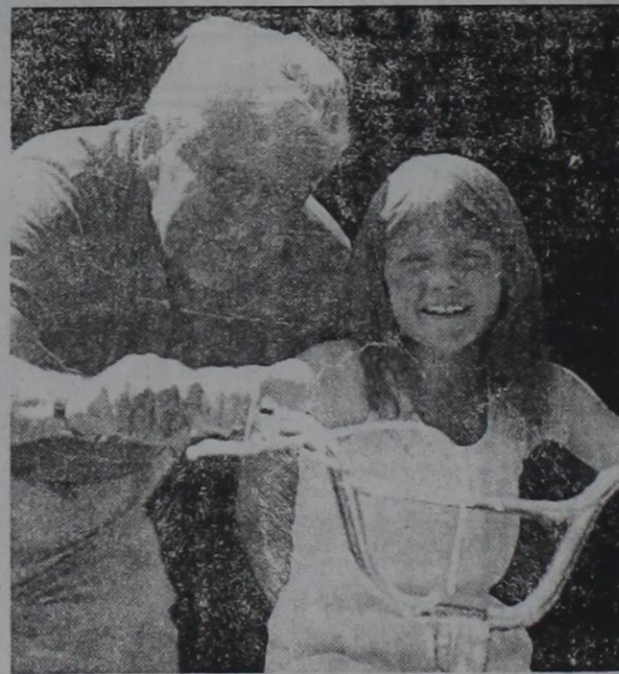

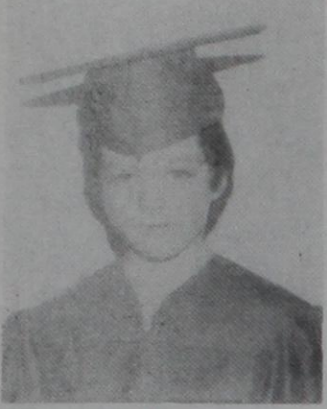

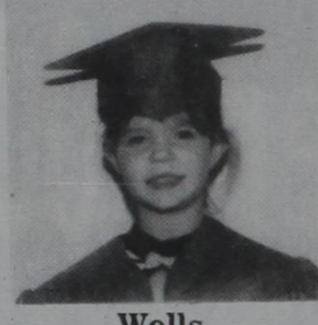
