So far as is known, Ray L. Hart is the only member of Bovina United Methodist Church, to enter full time Christian ministry. In a letter received in April, 1977, Dr. Hart writes:

"I consider the Bovina Methodist Church to have had a decisive bearing on the direction my life has taken. My father was on the Board of Stewards and I was president of the MYF while I was in High School. I remember heading the youth committee on the planning of the new church building.

"The ministers of that period had a strong influence on my decision to enter the ministry. It was the then District Superintendent, Earl G. Hamlet, who first explicitly encouraged me to think of the ministry (he was subsequently my minister when I attended McMurry College). But the ground work had been laid by the caring ministries of J.N. Hester, Russell Pike and Roscoe Trostle. I count as equally influential the loving friendship of laypersons in the church, notably Mrs. W.E. Williams, Mrs. E.T. Caldwell, the Wilbur Charleses, the Quickels, and C.R. Elliott. Mr. O.W. Cherry deeply encouraged me in educational aspirations. He was the Superintendent of the Bovina Schools.

doctorate from Yale, I was professor of theology at Drew University Theological School (a Methodist theological school) from 1956-1963. From 1963 to 1969 I was professor of theology at Vanderbilt University Divinity School in Nashville, Tennessee, an interdenominational divinity school. Since 1969, I have been professor and chairman in the Department of Religious Studies at the University of Montana. Most of my career has therefore been in the educational rather than the preaching ministry, although for thirteen years I was involved in educating ministers for the church.

"I cannot begin to express the deep affection I have for what I shall always consider to be my home church, the Methodist Church in Bovina. Only my parents counted more decisively than the many church friends in those formative years of my life."

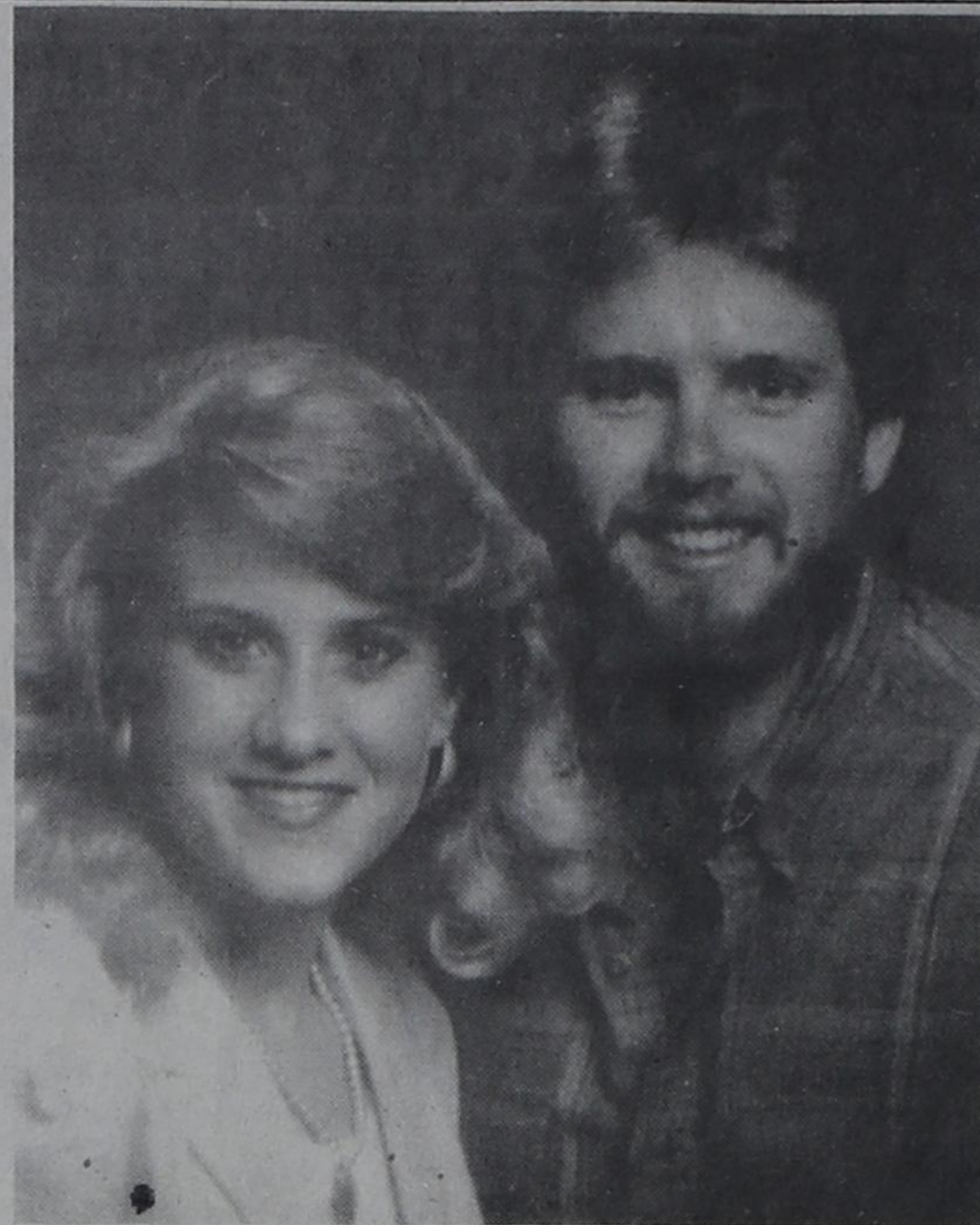

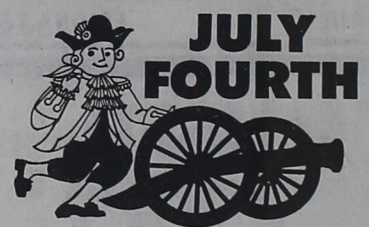

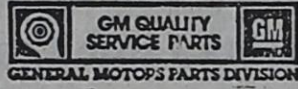
