Sterling Tracy won the State high school oratorial championship and, in the University of Wisconsin, he won the oratorial championship of the "Big Ten". Clifford Davis is about to begin his ability of these two and so tried to make up for this deficiency by studying, extra hard, on the subject. In the rebuttal, where the speaking has to be extemporaneous, I used to attain a speed of 200 words a minute. The other boys were generous and elected me captain of the team.
