#### LIST OF RANGE PRACTICES APPROVED FOR PROGRAM

The results of the county election for committeemen to administer range programs during the coming year have been announced by Edwin Sawyer, chairman of the county Agricultural Conservation Committee.

Those elected were B. M. Halbert, chairman; Lea Allison, vicechairman; Howard Espy, regular member; Louis H. Friess, first alternate member; Ben F. Mittle, second alternate member.

The following list of practices have been approved for Sutton County for 1947 which the newly elected officers will administer: 1. Construction of terraces for

which proper outlets are provided. 2. Construction of diversion terraces.

3. Leveling for irrigation, land for which water is available. 4. Reorganization of a perma-

nent farm irrigation system.

5. Construction of earthen dams or reservoirs for livestock water or erosion control.

6. Drilling or digging of wells for livestock water.

7. Installing pipe lines for live stock water.

8. Contour furrowing non-crop pasture and range land. 9. Contour farming inter-tilled

crops 10. Contour farming drilled

crops.

Elimination of destructive 11. plants on non-crop pastures and range land.

12. Re-seeding range and pasture lands by deferred grazing. 13: Establishing or improving

adapted pasture grasses. 14. Growing a green-manure or Elizabeth Kenny Infantile Paralycover crop of summer legumes.

15. Application of potash and phosphate other than raw rock phosphate.



The driver of the truck admitted to those arriving at the scene that he had gone to sleep while driving.

Next year's outlook for Texas goat raisers is promising, with a rise in the demand for mohair due to occur.

This favorable report on mohair comes from a group of Texas A. & M. College Extension Service specialists who attended the Annual Agricultural Outlook Conference in Washington, D. C. to see what the agricultural picture for 1947 is expected to be.

The expected higher demand for mohair is based mainly on the fact that two thirds of all mohair used in this country before the war went into the manufacture of automobile upholstery - and automobiles are due to roll off assembly lines again in massive numbers next year. The 1947 prduction of automobiles will probably be half again as large as the 1935-39 average, which means that plenty of mohair will be needed for upholstery fabrics.

High prices being paid for mohair are expected to continue, the specialists report. The fall clip brought 58-61 cents per pound for adult grades and 78-80 cents for kid grades.
