Dieticians arranging meals for the 7,500 veteran-patients in the 11 Veterans Administration hospitals of Texas, Louisiana and Mississippi can sympathize with housewives about rising food prices.

It now costs VA 14.9 per cent more to buy food for a patient than it did in April of this year, a survey by the VA dietetic division shows.

Nine of the hospitals reported increases in per-patient food costs since April. One hospital reported its food costs up 50 per cent.

Two of the larger hospitals showed reductions in food costs, but the decreases were slight.

By September 30th a total of 4,549,654 of the nation's World War II veterans had asked for school, college or job training benefits.

This is an increase of more than 133,000 over the August 31 figures.

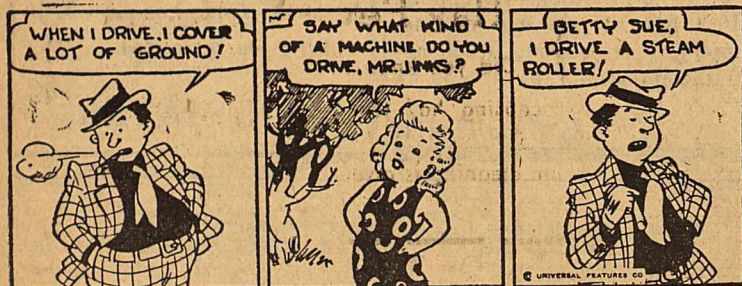

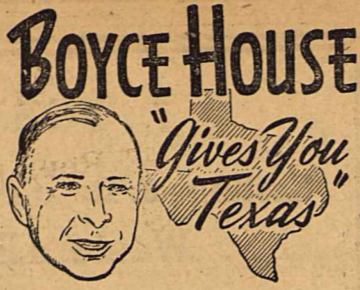

I hereby give notice to any and all trespassers, especially deer and turkey hunters, and trappers that my pastures are all in the game preserve and that there is no open season.

I warn you not to come into any of my pastures with the intention of hunting deer or turkeys or with the intention of trapping.

If I hear of anyone hunting, trapping or trespassing, I will notify the game warden who is on duty.

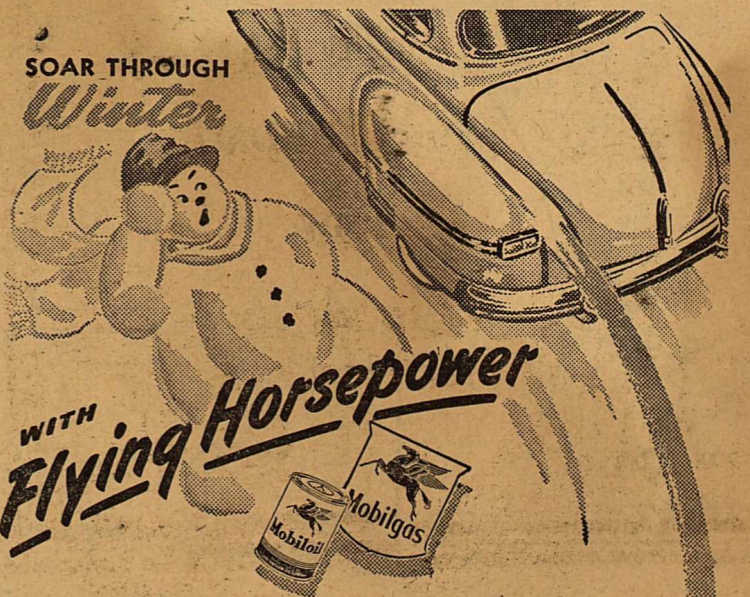

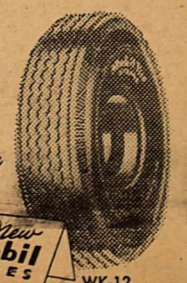

Next year's outlook for Texas goat raisers is promising, with a rise in the demand for mohair due to occur.

This favorable report on mohair comes from a group of Texas A. & M. College Extension Service specialists who attended the Annual Agricultural Outlook Conference in Washington, D. C. to see what the agricultural picture for 1947 is expected to be.

The expected higher demand for mohair is based mainly on the fact that two thirds of all mohair used in this country before the war went into the manufacture of automobile upholstery - and automobiles are due to roll off assembly lines again in massive numbers next year. The 1947 production of automobiles will probably be half again as large as the 1935-39 average, which means that plenty of mohair will be needed for upholstery fabrics.

High prices being paid for mohair are expected to continue, the specialists report. The fall clip brought 58-61 cents per pound for adult grades and 78-80 cents for kid grades.

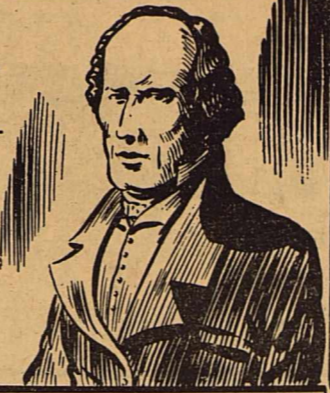

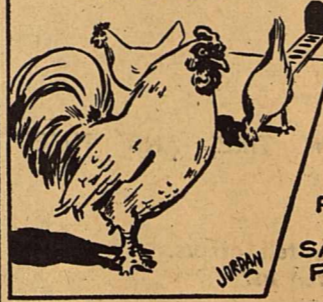

Veterans who hold National Service Life Insurance are urged to designate beneficiaries for their insurance if they have not done so.


Marvin A. Harlan, VA Regional Manager, stated today.





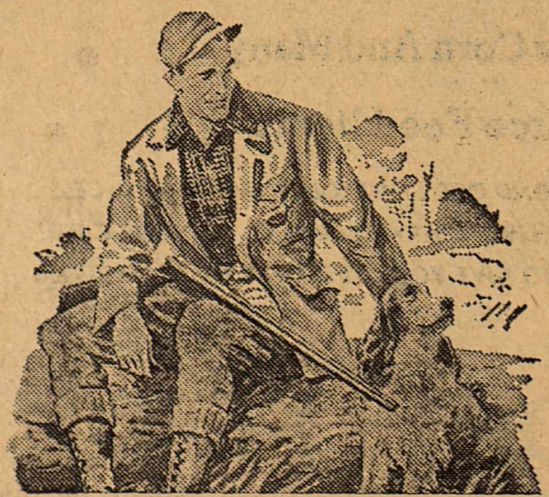
