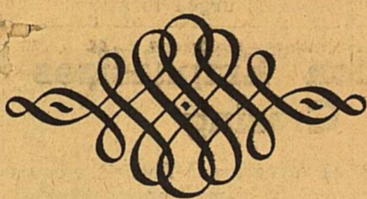

**THIS TASTES GOOD IN TEXAS**

Escalloped Cabbage  
 1 head cabbage — 2 to 2½ pounds  
 2 cups thin white sauce  
 ½ green pepper chopped  
 1 cup grated sharp cheese  
 ½ cup buttered bread crumbs  
 3 slices half-cooked bacon

Cut trimmed cabbage into eighths; remove core, and cook, uncovered, five to eight minutes in boiling salted water. (1 teaspoon salt to 1 quart of water). Drain. Place a layer of cabbage in a buttered baking dish or casserole, then a layer of white sauce, half the green pepper, and half the cheese. Repeat. Sprinkle the

top with buttered crumbs and chopped bacon and place in a moderate oven (375 degrees F.) until toasted, about 15 minutes. Serve immediately. 5 generous servings.

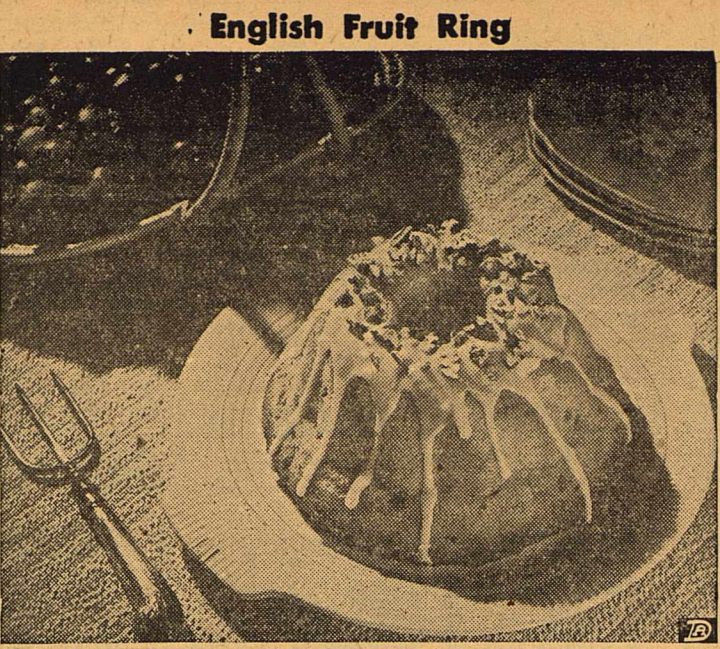

**Bake a feathery yeast batter, studded with fruits and nuts, in a fluted ring mold and you'll have special-occasion coffee cake.**

Most grocers have candied citron, candied orange peel, candied cherries, and currants on hand for baking holiday fruit cakes. These special fruits can also be used to give yeast coffee cakes a holiday charm, and delectable holiday flavor, too.

Because of the thrifty enriched flour base, coffee cakes are an average budget sweet, yet guests consider them really special. The English fruit ring in the picture was baked in a fluted mold for its party dress. This fragrant bread may be baked with equal success in a loaf pan, 4½ by 3½ inches.

English fruit ring belongs to the group of yeast coffee cakes which requires no kneading. Thorough beating of the yeast batter results in its lightness and even texture. After baking, highlight with confectioners' sugar icing and garnish with chopped nuts.

**ENGLISH FRUIT RING**

1 package yeast, compressed or dry	2 tablespoons chopped citron
¼ cup lukewarm water	2 tablespoons chopped orange peel
½ cup milk	¼ cup candied cherries
¼ cup shortening	¼ cup raisins
¼ cup sugar	¼ cup currants
¼ teaspoon salt	¼ cup chopped nuts
1 egg, beaten	Confectioners' Sugar Icing
1½ cups sifted enriched flour	Chopped nuts

Soften yeast in lukewarm water. Scald milk. Add shortening, sugar, and salt. Let cool to lukewarm. Add softened yeast and egg. Mix well. Add flour to make a rather stiff batter. Beat until smooth. Let rise until doubled (about 1½ hours). Stir down, and add citron, orange peel, cherries, raisins, currants, and chopped nuts. Fill into greased fluted ring pan. Let rise until doubled and puffy (about 1½ hours). Bake in moderate oven (375° F.) about 35 minutes. If desired, ice with confectioners' sugar icing and sprinkle with chopped nuts. Makes 1 fruit ring.

**Hunting Accidents Needless Waste**

This is the time of the year when hunting accidents take their heaviest toll of lives. Most accidents could be prevented if the simple rules of safety with firearms are observed. "Trigger happy" hunters, says R. E. Callender, extension specialist in wildlife conservation of Texas A&M College, endanger the lives of every other hunter in the woods and also cause much damage to wildlife. Their wild shooting leaves many birds and animals crippled and these are lost because they are not usually found until they are dead.

Practicing safety with guns in the fields or woods then, says Callender, is just a good conservation practice and it applies to both humans and wildlife. He reports that almost two-thirds of all hunting accidents result from three causes: humans in line of fire, mistaking humans for game and hunting with the safety catch off on the rifle.

He points out that good sportsmanship is just good manners. It includes using the right gun for the right game, hunting only in season and not taking more game than can be used even though the bag limit may permit the hunter to take more. Bird hunters, he says, should use a trained dog to retrieve crippled birds. The careful and wise hunter puts out cigarettes and campfires, breaks matches before dropping them and leaves the area where he has hunted in good condition.

Here is Callender's code of safety for the hunter. Treat every gun as if it were loaded; it is usually the empty gun, they thought it was empty, that takes the most lives. Loaded guns should never be carried in an automobile. The gun barrel and action should always be checked to make sure there are no obstructions in either. The gun should be carried so that the hunter always has control of the direction of the muzzle, even if he should stumble. The good hunter never pulls a trigger until

he is sure of his target and never points a gun at anything he does not intend to shoot.

He says loaded guns should never be left unattended and that the hunter should unload his gun before climbing a tree or over a fence. Bullets fired at flat, hard surfaces, or at objects on the surface of water may ricochet and hit objects not thought to be in the line of fire. Last but very important, he says gunpowder and alcohol should never be mixed for the results can be disastrous.

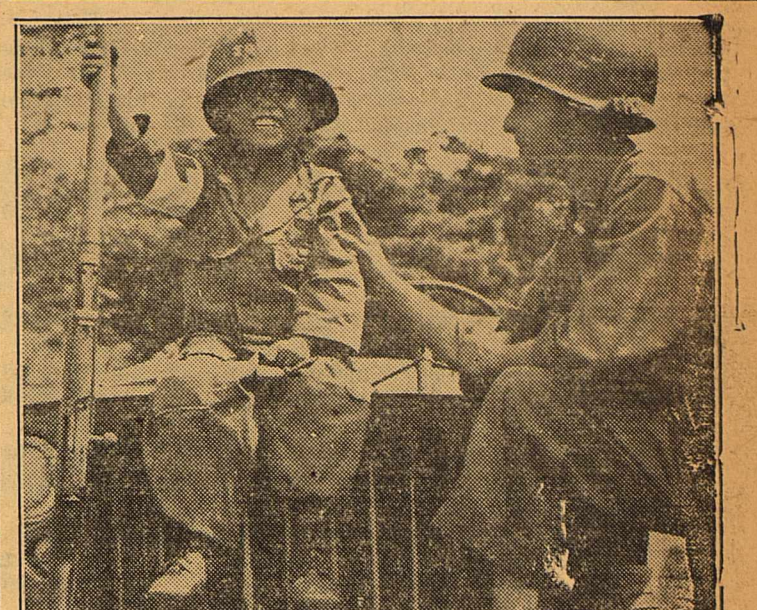
The intelligent hunter will be thinking about how he can aid in conserving wildlife of the land so that he and other hunters will have areas where they can continue to enjoy one of America's greatest sports in the years ahead. Wasteful and careless hunting habits on the other hand, says Callender, can destroy the protection, vegetation and even the wildlife itself. It's up to every hunter, he concludes, to see that this situation does not exist in the areas where he hunts.

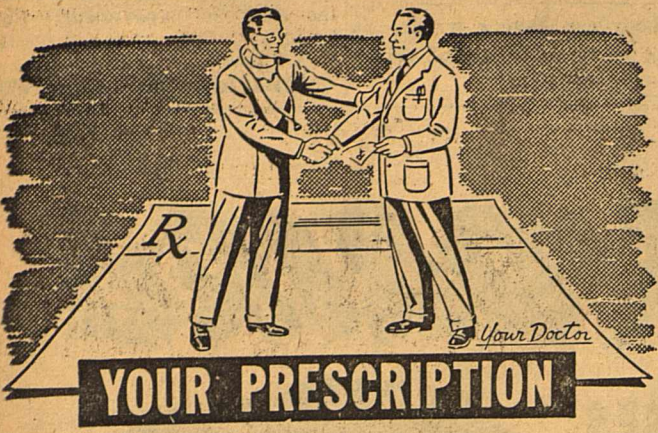

Robert Halbert's range has shown marked improvement the past year through the increase of the better grasses. By maintaining reasonable stocking rates, rotating the grazing and deferring pastures, Halbert has achieved this general improvement. Some pastures show as much as 25 percent sidecoats grama at present.

In carrying out his conservation plan with the District, Halbert has treated his cropland as well as rangeland.

Terrace systems have been completed on his Allen and Carson Fields, and he plans to build terraces and diversions on his Lake Field this winter.

By utilizing the Irrigated Field for winter grazing, Halbert is able to return a great deal of old crop litter and residue to the soil in his dryland fields.

Clover crops and crop residue go a long way towards maintaining and building up soil fertility, and Halbert is applying both practices to very good advantage.

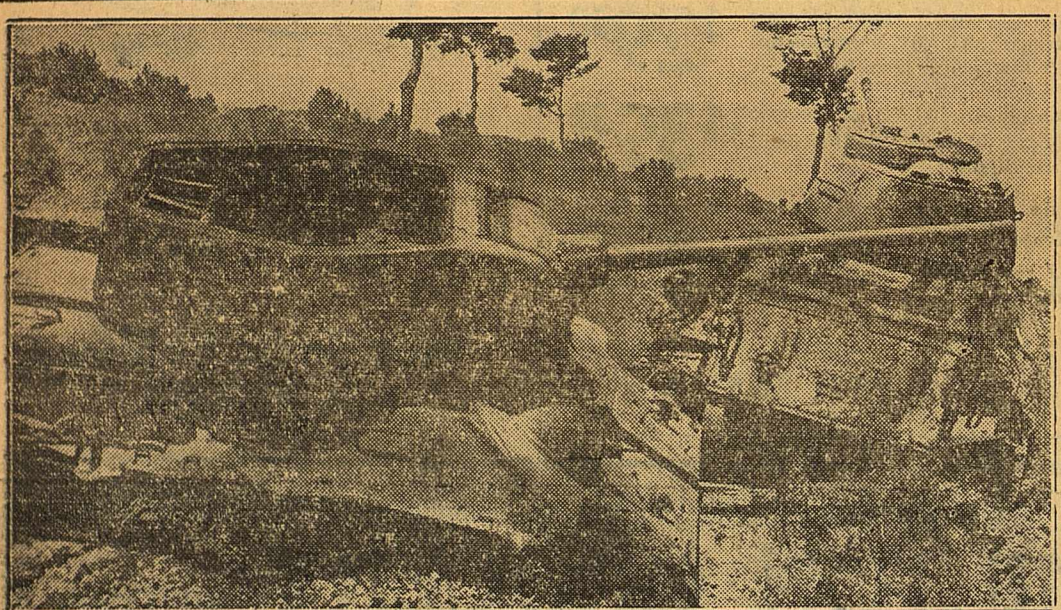
