Southwestern Bell Telephone Company was ordered Monday by District Judge Wilmer Hunt to cut back the rates the company put into effect November 10, 1953. The company was also ordered to begin refunding what will amount to about a million and a half dollars to customers who had paid the company's new rates.

Judge Hunt ordered the rates those which the company is now charging. Houston rates were not available at press time, but it is understood that a one-party business phone there costs \$17.

Judge Hunt also observed that he "didn't believe the court has authority to set rates- that is the prerogative of the City Council." He added that he has the right as a court of equity "to see that equity is done."
