Texas Veterinary Medical Association Sponsors Animal Health Conference

Livestockmen from Texas and the Southwest are invited to an Animal Health Conference in San Antonio, Texas on February 23 and March 1 sponsored by the Texas Veterinary Medical Association and the College of Veterinary Medicine at Texas A&M University. The San Antonio Convention Center is headquarters for the meeting. The conference, which features 50 speakers from 7 states is an effort by the sponsors to bring livestockmen the very latest information on animal health and will feature general topics as well as topics on beef cattle, and feedlot cattle, dairy, swine, sheep, and goats, and horses.

According to the conference chairman, Dr. B. R. Trimmer of San Antonio, a practitioner of veterinary medicine, and Dr. L. C. Grumbles of College Station, professor of veterinary medicine at Texas A&M, the conference is the first of its kind in the southwest to be offered at a single meeting. Veterinarians will share their experience with livestockmen by emphasizing nutrition, management and the study of disease problems. Time will be provided for discussion and informal questions and answers, they said.

The beef cattle and feedlot section will feature authoritative speakers on preconditioning, environment as it affects performance, viral and bacterial diseases, as well as other topics.

The dairy section will stress calf management, disease in the dairy herd, management, breeding and herd records. The horse (equine) section will deal with wound treatment, feeding and care, parasite control, vaccinations, breeding and care of the foal, among other topics.

Sheep and goat raisers will get the latest information on diseases, nitrate problems, feedlot care and management and late research data on sheep and goats.

Swine producers will have experts to discuss with them the latest on vaccinations and disease prevention, parasites, reproduction and other topics. 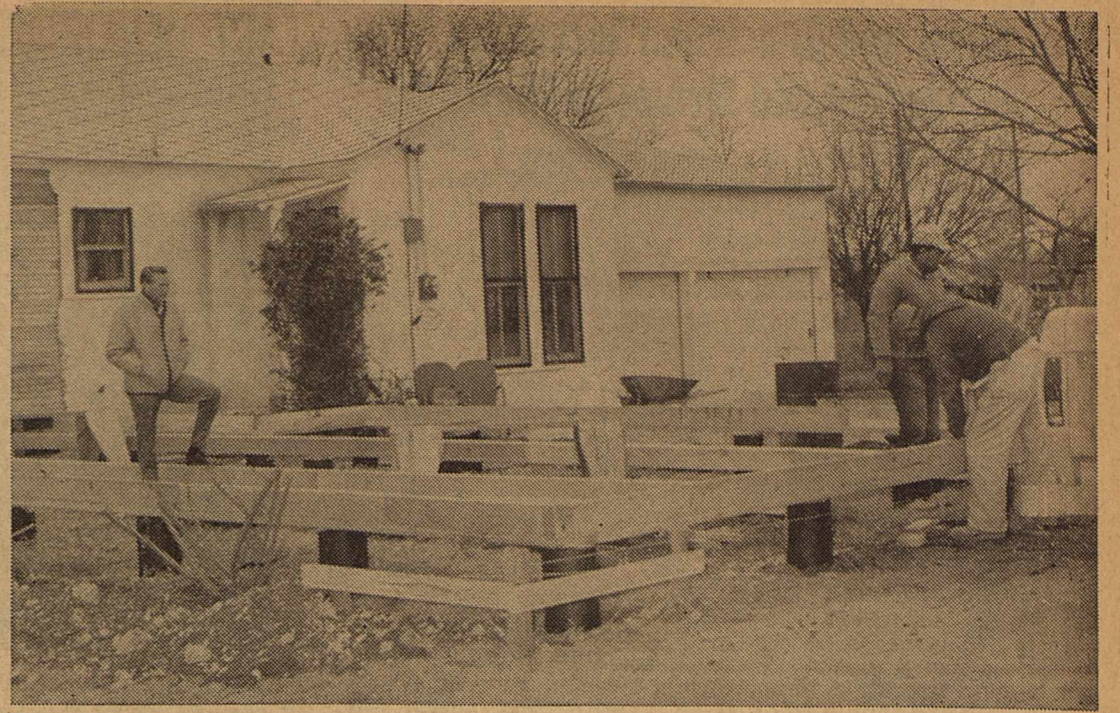

Cherries For February

Ever since George Washington wielded a hatchet on his father's cherry tree, cherries have been a tradition in February. Different kinds of cherries are available in frozen and canned state.

Cherries are sweet or sour, light red, dark red or white. Read the label and choose the cherries for the dish you plan to prepare. Labels should tell if cherries are "red sour" or "red tart"; "red sweet" or "light sweet."

The label should tell if the cherries are pitted or have pits, and are packed in water, cherry juice, light or heavy syrup. Some canned or frozen cherries have spices and other flavorings added.

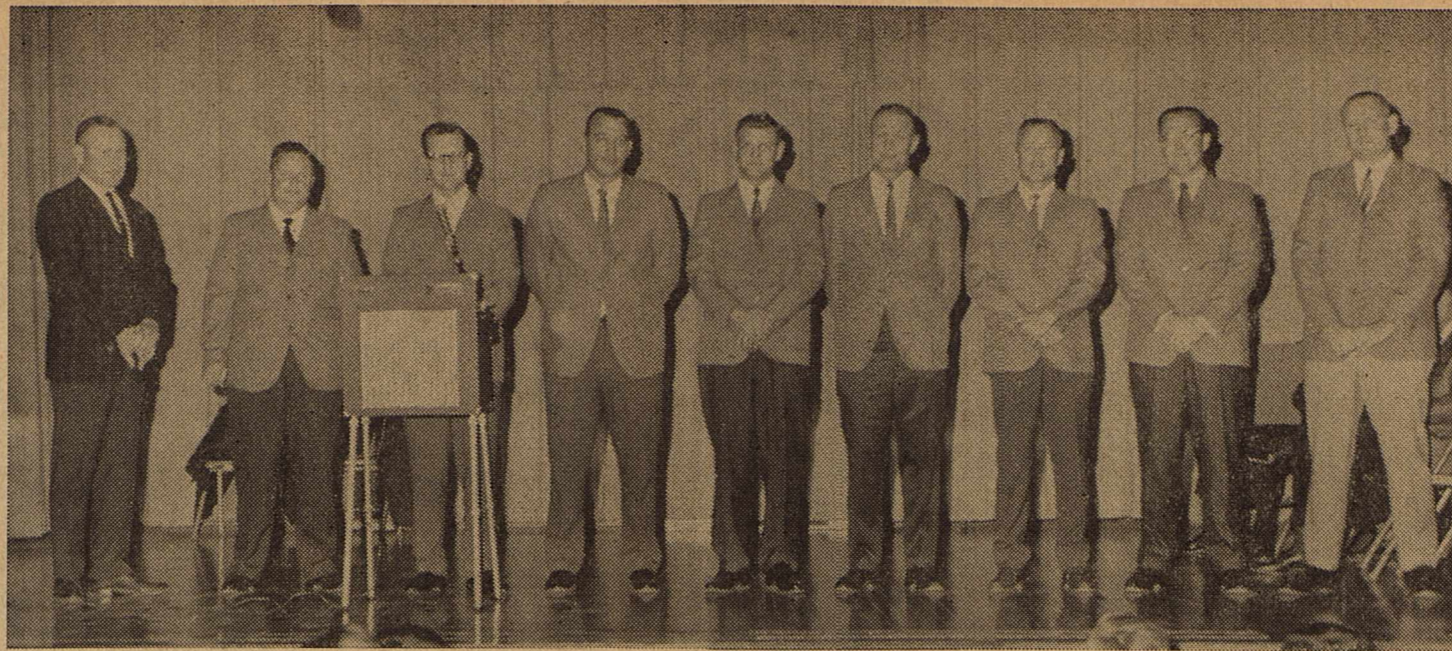
