### Kay Archer Forms Final Link In Chain Of Family Grads

When Kay Frances Archer, 18-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Francis Archer, walks across the stage to receive her diploma from Sonora High School Friday night, she may well be the last link in the chain of a long line of Archers who have preceded her as students in Sonora schools.

Kay's grandparents, the late Mr. and Mrs. G. W. Archer, moved to Sonora in 1912. They were married October 18, 1899 at Ingram where they made their home until 1906. Before moving to Sutton County, they lived for a time at San Saba, Menard, and Rocksprings. Mr. Archer was engaged in rock and concrete construction work most of his life, and many of his seven sons followed in his footsteps.

The Archers were parents of twelve children, and a son, Emmitt, was the first to attend Sonora schools in 1915. When the Archers youngest daughter, Ina (the late Mrs. Travis Glasscock) finished school, their

oldest daughter's (Audrey, the late Mrs. Cliff Johnson) child, Jean Cliff, started in the first grade. Since that time most of the Archers twenty grandchildren have tramped the corridors of school here. Many of them excelled academically as well as athletically.

Mr. Archer died in 1958 and Mrs. Archer died in 1967. Pioneers of this community, they were both admired and respected. When Mrs. Archer died, Joe Logan reminisced, "I remember when Mrs. Archer was baptized in a tank between here and Fort McKavett," and then summed it all in these words, "she was a good woman."

Thus, with Kay's graduation, 55 consecutive years of attendance in Sonora schools by descendants of those early-day settlers, will draw to a close. Kay, who plans to attend Southwest Texas State College at San Marcos, has probably helped to set a record that may long remain unbroken — that is, for these schools, at least.
