Broncos Capture State Class A Football Crown The Broncos first score came



#### No Christmas!

"Hear ye, hear ye! Christ-mas will not be celebrated. All who observe that abom-inable day will be severely punished!"

An unlikely message for a town crier? Not in the time of Oliver Cromwell!

Cromwell and his Puritan Party did indeed consider Christmas an "abominable day," and on December 24, 1653, they succeeded in get-ting the English Parliament to pass a law making Christmas celebrations of any kind illegal.

Imprisonment or exile was the penalty for disobedience.

A few days before Christmas, town criers went through the streets warning against holiday celebrations.

In England, the ban lasted eight years — and even longer in the United States. The belief that Christmas merry-making was sinful came to the New World with the Pilgrims.

New England states outlawed Christmas observ-ances until the middle of the nineteenth century. In Boston, for instance, Christmas was illegal until 1856!

#### **Eddy Smith To U.I.L. Band Meet**

Eddy Smith, a three-year J. I. L. honor bassoonist, attended the University Interscholastic League Region VII all-district band contest held in Lampasas December 12. Students from thirty central and West Texas cities registered for the contest. Individual try-outs were held Saturday morning, rehearsal in the evening and an hour concert Saturday night.

Eddy will attend all-region anuary 8 and 9 in Brownwood. He is a Sonora High School senior and a member of the Bronco marching band under the direction of John Butterfield. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. George E. Smith.

#### **Experiment** Station **Used As Test Site**

Two research projects utilizing remote sensing techniques have begun at Texas A&M University. One study is in pond ecology and the other is an analysis of Texas rangelands. Test sites include the Experiment Station, the Texas Experimental Ranch at Throckmorton and range area at College Station. Projects are assisted by the Remote Sensing Center. Dr. W.J. Clark of the Biology Department is measuring pond ecology parameters. He will monitor the physical, chemical and biological char-

acteristics of a series of ponds using aerial photography and a combination of film and filters.

The associate professor hopes to correlate the results by visual and statistical techniques. and use infrared radiometers to follow temperature variations. Dr. Robert H. Haas, assistant professor of range science, directs the rangeland study.

It is a primary study to determine the feasibility of making woody plant population inventories on shrub infested rangelands. He also will determine if it is possible to make canopy area measurements by species. Infrared aerial photographs have already been made of two sites. Dr. Haas reports preliminary analysis of the data is




