> Upon his graduation from SW-TSU, he went to Bandera where he served in the range management field for seven months before being transferred to Rocksprings, where he has lived since.

He and his wife, Brenda, plan to move here at the end of the current school year. Mrs. Merz is attending Uvalde Junior College. Their parents are Mr. and Mrs. J. Francis Merz of Albert and Mr. and Mrs. Sidney Barham of Rocksprings. The elder Merz is elementary school principal at Albert and is a rancher, while Barham is an electroncis technician with the Federal Aviation Agency at Rocksprings.

Merz will maintain an office in the First National Bank Building in the office formerly occupied by Dr. Tom White. He and his wife are members of the Baptist Church.

Merz said he will be working closely with the Texas A&M Agricultural Experiment Station and the County Agricultural Agent, as well as the local ASCS office. Sonoran's Father **Dies February 17**


