The spirit of America is relief and health-oriented soreflected in its people, and as early as the 1800's, the U.S. tradition of voluntarism drew favorable comment from abroad. Frenchman Alexis de Tocqueville, for one, was amazed at the way Americans of all ages join together to form thousands of groups to solve the problems and needs of their country. In the years since, cooperative ventures have grown to such dimensions that it is predicted the 1970's will be known as the Age of Voluntarism.

Although statistics vary, it can be estimated that there are presently somewhere between 50 and 70 million individual volunteers and at least 7 million voluntary organizations such as United Good neighbors, youth groups, disaster

News Letter

By O. C. Fisher Much concern is being registered concerning reforms that are being achieved, related to future processing of legislation in the House of Representatives.

This past week a caucus of Democrats and a caucus of Republicans in the House took place. Only members and members-elect who will be in the next -- 94th -- Congress participated.

They proceeded to elect an ultra-liberal Chairman of the Democratic Caucus (composed of Democratic members) for the next Congress. With the help of the new liberal input, he defeated a moderate. The liberal combine then proceeded to remove from the Ways and Means Committee the power to appoint members to the various committees -- a method that has been in use for more than half a century, and has functioned well. The Democratic liberals, now in control, have now transferred this responsibility to the Democrats Steering and Policy Committee. Drawing upon the numerical strength of new liberal members (there are 75 new Democrats -- mostly liberals, accordng to the press), Caucus leaders increased the number on the all-important Ways and Means Committee, from the present 25 to 37, in order to pack it with more liberals.

A score of other "reforms" were railroaded through the caucus, all of which can be expected to adversely affect the quality of future legislation

This revolutionary action was considered a major triumph for the ultra-liberal Common Cause, a super lobbying outfit, which seems to regard conservatism as a product of a past age.

The Republicans didn't do much better. By a vote of 85 to 52. that party reelected a liberal as Chairman of its Conference--or Caucus. The press reported this move "reflected the wipeout of conservatives in the November election." and coincided with a resolution by Republican Governors last week calling for more liberal policies in order to better compete with Democrats.

A national consumer center maintained by two organizations of retired persons reports that mail order offers are a major source of complaints from older persons, although mail order purchases can be a great convenience for them. Persons who may be housebound because of health problems or lack of transportation often find it easier to shop by mail for their own needs and for gifts. But it is true that

millions of dollars are lost each year in fraudulent mail order offers.

Federal officials say that some mail order swindles are especially aimed at senior citizens. Unscrupulous merchants may try to sell them health cures; investment deals in land, stock, or franchises; retirement home, extra income plans; or other things by mail.

Our Consumer Protection attorneys advise persons who want to purchase through the mails to deal with a reputable, established mail order house that provides written guarantees on items. Check any claims for health cures or medical devices with a doctor before purchase. Check any investment offer first through a banker, attorney, broker, or other knowledgeable person. Always go to see any land or retirement home before purchasing, and have an attorney handle the details of the sales 11



A better alternative might be to investigate local chapters of senior citizen groups to see if the same standard of living part time employment bureaus are maintained for senior citizens who want to supplement their income. Typical positions are for family aides, seamstresses, home repairmen or carpenters, typists, bookkeepers, gardeners, and land-


> scaping experts. Home improvement is another area in which older citizens are often gypped. We have found that many consumer complaints about home improvements or repairs result from not getting in writing a description of the work to be performed.

Our attorneys urge senior citizens not to pay money in advance for such work. Most reputable individuals or firms , require payment only after the

citizens alleging that some dance studios engage in various deceptive or misleading sales practices. Recently, we got a court injunction against dance studios which practiced "relay salesmanship," in which a team of salesmen pressured persons to buy dance lessons. The studios also engaged in several other deceptive practices.

In the Attorney General's "Practical Primer for the Texas Consumer'', we urge that persons be careful about high fees for dance clubs, and suggest talking it over with a friend or relative before signing a contract.

Older persons with these or other consumer problems should contact the Attorney General's Consumer Protection Division or their district or county attorney to report complaints.



Quick Popcorn Balls


3 quarts freshly popped corn 1/2 teaspoon salt 1 cup Karo light corn syrup 1 teaspoon vanilla 1 cup sugar

Accent on Health

"I've never felt better in my life.

That's the feeling of Mary Sorenson, an alert, efficient administrative secretary at the University of Texas Development Office in Austin--and the victim of end stage kidney disease.

Her sense of well-being comes as quite a surprise to those meeting Mrs. Sorenson for the first time. You'd expect a little bit different outlook for a person with kidney failure...a person who must undergo dialysis three times a week to stay alive.

But it is this dialysis, undertaken with the aid of the State Health Department's Kidney Health Care Division, which has brought about a change in her health. The role of the program, instituted by the State Legislature, is to provide persons like Mrs. Sorenson with financial assistance during the time from first dialysis until federal Medicare coverage begins. Without the assistance the patient could be at least \$5,000 in debt before Medicare begins. her arm from her leg.

The 33-year-old secretary says she feels great with dialysis. She is one of more than 860 Texans now receiving financial help in meeting the staggering costs of dialysis. Persons with kidney failure can expect to spend up to \$20,000 a year to stay alive. Experience has shown that the cost of a kidney transplant, hospitalization and other services is more

than \$25,000. Kidney problems have caus-

ed great adjustments in her life, starting late in 1959 in Wisconsin, when she was in her late teens. "I began noticing swellings in my hands, legs and face and went to see

my family doctor. He took tests and told me my kidneys were diseased," she recalls.

From that moment she was on a salt-restricted diet and medication to keep her kidneys functioning. When she and her husband moved to Austin two years ago, she immediately looked up a doctor. "When he first saw me," Mrs. Sorenson remembers, "he seemed to think I was pretty healthy and not at end state." Tests,

however, showed only about a 10 percent kidney function. A year later, in May of 1974, she started on dialysis at the Renal Outpatient Center in Austin, run by Dr. Jack Moncrief. Dr. Moncrief first opened a renal clinic--with one machine--in 1969. Now the

Renal Outpatient Center---one of 40 such centers in Texas--has 16 machines and 30 patients who must come to the center for dialysis--normally four hours a day, three days a week. Dialysis machines may be purchased for use in the home for less than \$5,000. But

expendable supplies may cost as much as \$50 for each treatment.

Mrs. Sorenson's dialysis treatment has been effective from the start, although she says the insertion of the needle in her arm at each treatment is quite painful. In dialysis, a person's blood is routed outside the body through the dialysis machine--a filterationtype process which removes the impurities. Because the veins in her arm were so small, a vein was transplanted into

Mrs. Sorenson is sold on dialysis and the compassion of everyone involved in the renal center. "It's important for people to know how fantastic the people are at the clinic," she enthuses, naming Dr. Moncrief and Dr. Jonathon F. Decherd in particular.

"Everyone there gives me so much help--with insurance problems and dialysis," she said. "And my technician--Suzanne Burrell--is the kind of person who brightens things up for you. She's so kind, sympathetic and understand-

Now that dialysis is so successful, there's one other step ahead---transplant.

"I had a transplant scheduled during the summer with my sister. Her tissue was typed and she's a 'C' match. But Dr. Moncreif decided to check my brother, who is a 'b' match--which is so much better," she explained. He was tested at St. Lukes Hospital in Milwaukee. Date of the transplant surgery.

hasn't been set, but hopefully it will be this year. She says she'll continue on her strict diet and wait for the big day. How do her friends and associates treat her, knowing she has kidney failure? 'People I work with have been just great," she replied. "I've never had any problem with missing work with kidney disease. And, I've made arrangements to work six hours a day on Monday, Wednesday and Friday when I have dialysis. My boss and others have shown real concern. If I need anything, I feel that all I have to do is call."

It seems that the case of Mary Sorenson is heading toward a happy conclusion--a conclusion in which the State Health Department was happy to have a part. It's a story which could have had a much different ending just a few short years ago--before dialysis was put within reach of almost everyone by state and federal assistance.

Whether your Christmas tree goes up weeks in advance or stays up through the Twelve Days of Christmas, taking care of it properly is the key to enjoying it - you can keep it fresh, fragrant and tightly-needled throughout all the festivities.

Be sure to start with a fresh tree. When shopping around, run these two simple checks. First, bend the needles on the tree; if they are pliant, the tree is fresh. Then, gently tap the base of the tree against the ground. A fresh tree will hold its needles fast; avoid one with cascading needles!

Try to keep the tree outdoors after you bring it home until you're ready to set it up for decorating. Immediately saw off about one inch on the diagonal from the tree trunk. This eliminates clotted resins that form at the base of the tree which could block it from absorbing water.

Texas Meat Exports Drop 40 Percent

AUSTIN--Exports of Texas red meat dropped nearly 40 percent this year while production increased eight percent, another financial blow for an already ailing livestock industry.

According to Agriculture Commissioner John C. White, marketings of beef, pork, lamb and mutton reached 1,763 million pounds in September. Of this, 247.2 million pounds have been exported.

White said two large potential markets, Japan and the European Common Market, embargoed U.S. meat to protect domestic roduction. Canada trastically reduced U.S.

meat imports and for a period prohibited sales of U.S. beef.

The U.S. has retaliated by reducing meat imports. A greater decrease is expected as a result of this country's recent restriction on Canadian meats, retroactive to Aug. 12.

This year's national cattle slaughter is expected to exceed 36 million head, a seven percent increase over last year coming mainly from grass-fed beef. Fed cattle slaughter will be down seven percent.

Though beef supplies are expected to remain abundant through 1975, pork, lamb and broiler production will be down. Hog producers have reduced breeding stocks and plan fewer farrowings for next year. Sheep and lamb slaughter likely will decline as producers reduce their herds due to higher finish feeding costs.
