I do agree that the desecration of American values cannot be solved by Congress or in the courts. Morality is the responsibility of every citizen. Unfortunately, there are an awfully lot of irresponsible and immoral folks roaming around in this free country. Fifty years ago in Colorado, there was an incident when a man was tarred and feathered for giving the Nazi salute to the U.S. flag.

Perhaps there is a simpler solution. If you should happen to exercise your "freedom of expression" on the Statue of Liberty, or the Washington Monument, or the Vietnam Memorial or even on a stalactite in Carlsbad Cavern, you would probably get carted off to the pokey and expected to pay a large fine or be incarcerated for a period of time. So why not designate the nation's flag as a national monument whenever or wherever it is displayed in public, whether it be hanging on a flag pole, or worn as a lapel pin on a person's clothing.

The Preservation of American Antiquities Act passed in 1906 under President Theodore Roosevelt gives the president authorization to set aside national monuments without the approval of Congress or the Supreme Court. Employees of the Department of Interior take care of national monuments. Any person in that capacity could see to the issuing of citations and fines against anyone found desecrating the nation's flag if it were a national monument. This would include all National Park Rangers, Land Resources Management, Water Resource workers, Historic Preservation Council, and all Fish and Wildlife

Game Wardens, among others. This is not any more far-fetched than declaring that the burning of the flag is "freedom of expression" as granted by the First Amendment to the Constitution. If you feel that the idea of making the flag into a national monument has some merit, then please write to President Bush, or clip out this







Fireworks Injuries Involve Children

fireworks-related eye injuries 1-800-221-3004. happened to children, warns the Texas Society to Prevent

Blindness. Fireworks injuries of all kinds soared 10 percent in 1988, up to a new total of 10,200. Eye injuries in particular tend to be severe. In one study, 40 percent of the reported cases caused permanent eye damage, visual disability or destruction of the eye.

Consumer Product Safety Commission statistics show that in 1988, 45.6 percent of fireworks eye injuries requiring hospital emergency room treatment struck children 5-14 years old. This is a sharp increase from the year before, when the same group accounted for 32.9 percent nationwide. Even very young children were injured. Last year 7.6 percent of fireworks-related eye injuries occurred to tots under the age of 5, up from 6.1 percent from 1987.

Most injuries result from mishandling fireworks. Accidents occur when they are held in the hand, when attempts are made to relight apparent duds or when bending directly over fireworks to ignite them.

While a number of states have banned the private use of fireworks, most still permit Class C devices to be used. This category includes pieces that contain no more than 50 mg of black powder. Bottle rockets, roman candles and sparklers are common examples. Together these have caused the overwhelming majority of serious injuries to the eyes.

The Texas Society to Prevent Blindness warns against the private use of fireworks. Unfortunately, the range of state laws and illicit market make fireworks readily available. If you are going to use fireworks, the following safety rules are recommended:

*Check local laws regarding use of fireworks. It may be illegal to use fireworks within the city limits,

or within the county you live. *Never allow children to use fireworks. Even sparklers are

dangerous. *Fireworks should only be used outdoors in a clear area away from homes, buildings and combustible materials.

*Be sure others are out of range before lighting fireworks. Many firework injuries occur to innocent bystanders.

*Never handle or attempt to relight a firework that does not go off. Keep water nearby for emergencies and for dousing malfunctioning fireworks. Drench thoroughly before discarding the dud firework.

*Never ignite fireworks in a container. Glass and metal containers can easily shatter.


We would like to thank Anna Mae Thomas for coming and playing the piano for us this week at meal time. We appreciate her devotion and love for the residents

Harrington Center Receives Grants


